

Browsing With Bev

Home Demonstration Agent Mrs. W. J. Greer of Carbon gave me the recipe for "5-Cup Salad," back in the spring, and I've enjoyed the recipe so much that I thought I would pass it on to you.
"5 CUP SALAD"

Cup small marshmellows Cup pineapple chunks Cup cocoanut (shredded) Cup sour cream

Cup manderin oranges Mix all ingredients together. Chill overnight. Serve on lettuce leaf.

Sour cream does a lot for salads, whether it's blended into the dressing or made into the salad itself. Besides giving the salad its unique flavor, sour cream adds the nutrients found in milk, too.

Surprisingly, sour cream is just as delicious with fruits as with vegetables, so keep sour cream on hand to try in new and tempting ways. You may want to serve the

family cucumbers and cream, as a relish or salad with any summer meal. Your favorite head lettuce salad will be delicious with sour cream thousand island dressing, and it's so easy to make.

Here's how you make it: Combine 1 cup dairy sour cream with 3 tablespoons chili sauce, 2 tablespoons chopped green pepper, 2 tablespoons chopped pimiento, 2 table spoons chopped sweet pickle and a dash of salt. Mix well and chill thoroughly before serving over head lettuce.
