Social Security Man Invites You To See Him If You Have Problems

There are a number of persons in Eastland County who have become a bit richer because they met me, a field representative of the Social Security Administration who visits Eastland County to assist persons with their social security problems.

I will be in the office of the Cisco Chamber of Commerce Wednesday, May 22 and June 5, 1963 at 10:00 a. m. A number of Eastland County residents usually are there to inquire about their social security status and discuss their retirement plans.

May I say there is a time when a person should make his first inquiry about social security retirement benefits — at age 62. Then again at age 65, or 72 even though still working, if no claim was filed

earlier.

At age 62 it is possible to get social security benefits, you will have a reduction in your check of at least 20 percent. So, if your monthly benefit for age 65 is \$100.00 you will get \$80.00 a month at age 62. If you start getting benefits at age 62, you will continue to get benefits at the reduced rate even after you reach 65. An adjustment is made at age 65 if you did not receive checks for each month after the effective date of your application for reduced benefits.

At age 65, you will be paid your full retirement benefit every month if you do not work for more than \$1200 a year. If you work and earn more than \$1200, you will lose only one dollar of your yearly benefits for every two dollars you earn between \$1200 and \$1700; and for earning over \$1700 you will lose one dollar in benefits for each dollar earned.

Age 72 is a big day for you if you are still working, because you can get all your social security checks no matter how much you make. There are still some people who do not know about this feature of the law.

One man, for instance, came to see me the other day after many delays to make inquiries. He was over 72 and working as a carpenter. Much to his surprise, he found he was eligible to receive benefits and work at the same time. He had not known there was no restriction after 72. He filed a claim, and he is now getting a monthly check which he is saving to use when he can no longer work.

TESE Rates To Be Reduced

The City Council of Carbon on June 3, 1963 approved a schedule of reduced residential and general service rates for customers of Texas Electric Service Company. The new rates were presented to the Council by Tom Hallmark, manager of the company.

Mr. Hallmark said that based on the year 1962, the proposed rates will result in an average reduction in residential electric service bills of 6.9 percent and an average reduction in commercial and industrial bills of 5.9 percent.

more than the overall average percent, while some will be reduced less than the overall average. Some bills will not be affected by the proposed rate changes. No electric service bills will be increased by the rates, according to Mr. Hallmark.

All residential bills for consumptions in excess of 70 kwh will be lower on the proposed residential rate than on the present residential rate. Residential bills for consumptions of 70 kwh or less will be unchanged by the proposed residential rate.

Mr. Hallmark said the company recently lowered its residential and general service rates in the Fort Worth area and is now in the process of lowering these rates in all other areas that it serves. The new rate schedules are to become effective July 3, 1963.

County Screwworm Case Is Reported; Fly-Drop Begun

A case of screwworms in a two-week old calf on the Davis Smith Ranch, four miles southwest of Gorman on the Eastland - Comanche County line, was positively identified by the Screwworm Eradication personnel on May 10, according to Oscar Schaefer-Rising Star, Chairman of the Health Commission, has advised the County Agent's office in Eastland that the cobalt treated adult sterile flies will be dropped twice a week for the next four weeks.

The flies, dropped by plane, will be in a two square mile radius centered around the Smith ranch.

Cattle and other livestock in the outbreak area will be inspected and sprayed by a crew from the Animal Health

Commission. A crew is expected to be stationed in the Gorman area for the next several weeks.

Schaefer urges all livestock owners in that area to make frequent inspection of their animals for any worm cases. Fresh wounds on any animal should be treated immediately. Should any further cases develop, he urges the owner to notify Smith at Gorman immediately.

Schaefer, after an inspection of the area, said that it is entirely possible for a adult screwworm flies to breed in the caves, deep wells or cisterns in that part of the county.

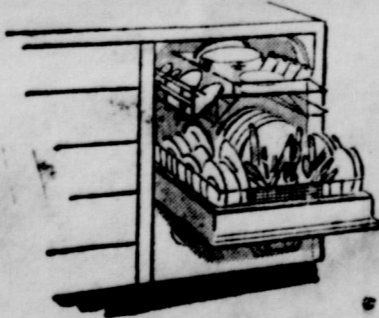
