1031 Head Sold At Weekly Sale

At the regular Tuesday sale of the Eastland Auction Company, a total of 1031 cattle, 275 hogs and 151 sheep and goats were sold to buyers. Sellers at the sale were:

FORMER CARBON MAN DIES IN OIL ACCIDENT FRIDAY

Henry Hines received word of the death of his brother, J. D. Hines, 56, who was killed in an oil field accident about 11 p. m. Friday near Big Spring. Hines was struck by a falling piece of pipe and was killed almost instantly, it was reported.

Born June 20, 1906 in Carbon, he was a member of Carbon Baptist Church and Carbon Masonic Lodge. He was a veteran of World War II.

Funeral was held at 2 p. m. Sunday in River Funeral Home, Big Spring, with burial in Trinity Memorial Park. Rev. Carl Lee, pastor of First Baptist Church, officiated. Survivors besides the brother here are two other brothers, L. Z. of New Orleans, La., and M. M. of Big Spring; two sisters, Mrs. G. A. Plummer of Midland and Mrs. W. W. Speer of Port Neches.

Mr. Hines left for Big Spring immediately upon receiving the news. He returned home Saturday night and Mr. and Mrs. Riley Bailey of Holland spent Saturday night in the home and Mr. and Mrs. Hines and the Baileys returned to Big Spring Sunday to attend the funeral.

Friends from here attending the services included Marvin and Leona Hale and Earl Harris. Mrs. Truman Beck accompanied Mr. and Mrs. Rayneal Baze of Ranger.

DPS To Direct Defense And Disaster Office

Col. Homer Garrison Jr., director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, has announced the transfer of the Office of Defense and Disaster Relief from the Governor's office to the DPS.

Garrison, who has been designated by executive order as Coordinator of Defense and Disaster Relief, named George Busby, Chief of the DPS Inspection and Planning Division, to direct the activities of the new office.

C. O. Layne, DPS Inspector for Civil Defense, will act as Busby's deputy.

"The Department of Public Safety has taken over this function as agent for Governor John Connally and will conduct it consistent with the existing policies of this department," Garrison said.

"We will work with local and federal officials in a concerted effort to increase the effectiveness of the defense and disaster relief program.

Busby has served as Chief of the Inspection and Planning Division, one of the four major divisions of the department, since September, 1957. The division conducts studies and research into new programs in police science, develops test areas and promotes pilot studies of suggested programs, and makes field inspections.

A native of Karnes County, Busby entered the department as a Highway Patrolman in February, 1936 and was stationed at Dallas. He subsequently served at Sherman, San Antonio, Uvalde, and in 1941 was promoted to sergeant and was stationed in Austin. A year later he was promoted to captain and stationed at Dallas.

In 1951 when the Motor Vehicle Inspection law was enacted, Garrison created the Motor Vehicle Inspection Division and appointed Busby as its chief. He served in that capacity until his appointment as chief of Inspection and Planning in 1957.

Layne, who was born at Munday in Knox County, joined the Highway Patrol in April, 1938 and was stationed at Amarillo. He was transferred to Dalls in 1942 and in February, 1943, was promoted to sergeant and stationed at Pecos. He was transferred to El Paso in 1945, serving there until his promotion to captain in March, 1947.

As captain in the Highway Patrol, Layne served at Pecos and Beaumont, and was promoted to Inspector for Civil Defense in January, 1956. In this capacity he has served as liaison officer representing the DPS in matters of defense and disaster preparedness between the department and the Governor's office and has worked with city and county officials in the development of local defense programs. During periods of disaster, Layne has coordinated field information and department services.

Quarterly Bond Sales In County Total \$194,682

Savings Bond sales for the first three months of 1963 in Eastland County totaled \$194,682.

Of this amount \$67,835 were purchased in March according to a report released by Guy Parker, Chairman of the County Savings Bond Committee.

March sales bring the total to 41.4 per cent of the 1963 goal of \$470,000.

Sales in Texas for the first quarter amounted to \$15,387,951, which represents 26.7 per cent of the state goal of \$150,600,000.

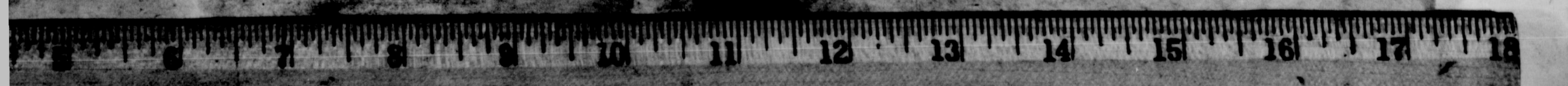

Social Security Payments Now \$217,450 For County

Monthly old-age, survivors, and disability insurance benefits in Eastland County now top \$217,450, R. R. Tuley, Jr., District Manager of social security in Abilene, said today on releasing his annual county benefit data report.

The new monthly figure represents an increase of 12 percent in beneficiaries and 12 percent in dollar amount over the corresponding period last year.

"This increase can be attributed to the recent changes in the law and to the growth of our aged population," Tuley said. "As most of it is spent for food, clothing, and shelter, there is no longer any doubt that social security benefits are helping to stabilize the income and spending power of many residents in Eastland County."

More people in Eastland

County, he said, could draw social security benefits if they knew more about the law, and for that reason they are urged to visit or call the local social security office whenever they have a question concerning their benefits or responsibilities.

As of January 1963, in the nation at large, more than 18 million beneficiaries were receiving payments at the rate of \$14.5 billion per month.

The following shows the number and amount of each type of monthly benefit paid in Eastland County, as of December 31, 1962.

Retired Worker, 3835, \$217,450; Wife or Husband, 821, \$27,228; Widow or Widower, 363, \$21,477; Mothers and Children 404, \$18,337; Disabled workers and dependents, 232, \$15,490.

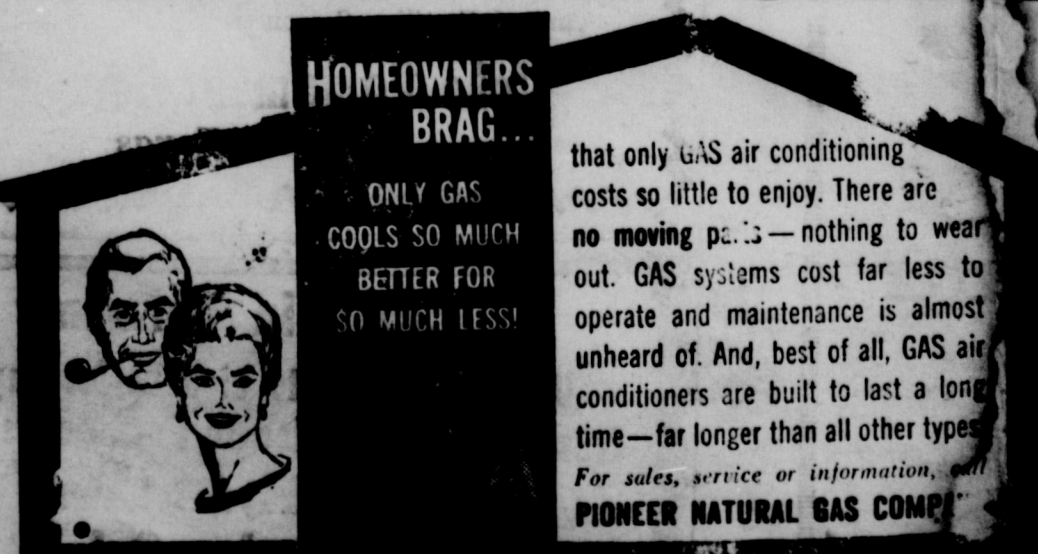

Browsing with Bev

Area rugs have become an important part of today's room decoration.

They vary in size from those that cover an area designated for a conversation group to the small scatter-type rugs.

Skiddy rugs on polished floors invite disaster. If you have any doubt about under-foot security of small rugs, don't take chances. Treat your rugs with one of the easy to use non-skid backings.

If you are buying new rugs, look for non-skid types. Or try some non-skid aids on the market.

While not endorsing any of the producers, here are some suggestions.

A non-skid, rubberized product, Sta-Put, is easy to use. Protect the floor when applying, and turn the rug upside down. Spray around the border two or three times in quick continuous motions. Then spray the inner area of the rug several times in zigzag fashion. After a thorough drying period, the rug can be washed but must be re-treated afterward.

A white powder, Rug-Hug, needs only to be sprinkled under a light film conforming to the size and shape of the rug. Powder keeps anchoring the rug until after it is washed out or vacuumed off. Then it must be replaced.

Although it must be painted on, Griptex Rug Guard lasts and lasts. Rugs can be washed and washed time after time without any effect on the anchoring adhesive. The back of the rug can be completely coated or a large "X" painted on the center with a wide border coating near the edges may be sufficient.

A sheet of light plastic foam cut to the size of the rug is another solution. It may be purchased in carpet stores or in variety stores.
