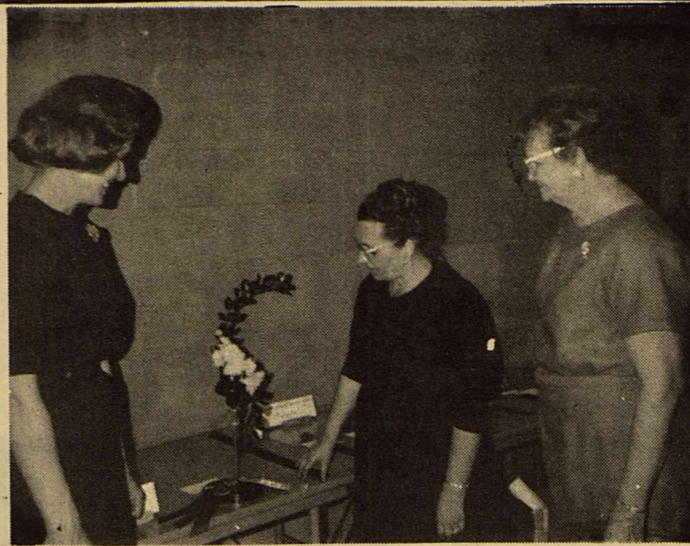

The total payments to be made to Yoakum Co. farmers for the 1965 crop year for complying with the feed grain, dom cotton, soil bank and ACP will be approximately \$1,149,249 this does not include commodity loans.

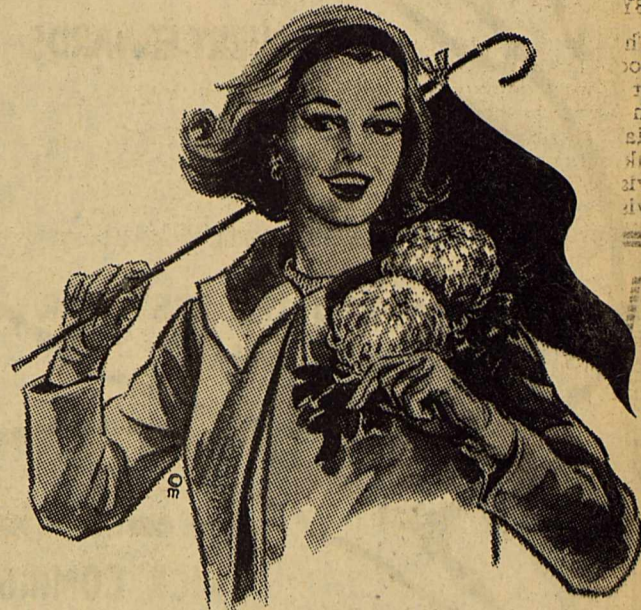

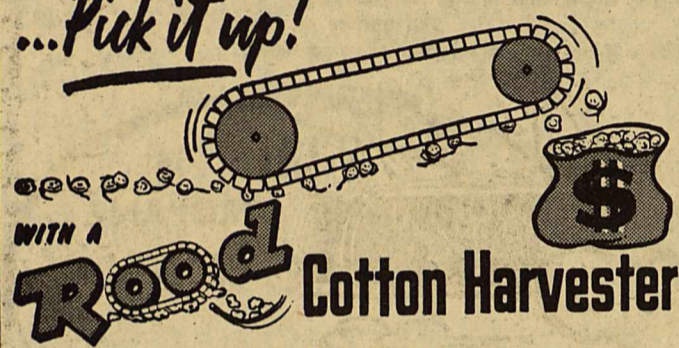

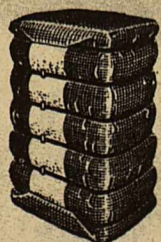
