Election Returns For County

The Democratic Primary June 2 will have one county runoff and two precinct runoffs.

Incumbent Roy Lane lacked 173 votes for a plurality over his opponents Ann Justice and B. M. Bennett. Final unofficial totals: Lane, 2,721; Justice 1,928; and Bennett 966. So Lane and Mrs. Justice will be going after Democratic votes on June 2.

County Judge John Hart was elected without a run-off. Final unofficial totals: Hart, 3,971; O. H. Dick, 1,856; and Ralph Lockwood, 465.

Scott Bailey carried Eastland county, but lost to Wayne Gibbons in the district for the 63rd Representative seat. Bailey got 3,482 in Eastland county and Gibbons 2,683. Final unofficial total for district: Gibbons 7,629; and Bailey, 6,235.

Sen. Tom Creighton swept Eastland county, as he did his district, against Wallace Shepard for the 22nd Senatorial District seat.

Another run-off race will be the Commissioners race of prec. 2 between Glenn Justice and Dick Foster. Final unofficial totals in that race: A. Bennett, 35; C. Underwood, 212; D. Foster, 326; G. Justice 299; and B. Foster, 278.

Stephenville To Dedicate Airport

Stephenville is "A-Ok," and all plans are "Go" for Sunday, May 13, as the Stephenville Municipal Airport will be dedicated as Henry Clark Field. Ceremony gets underway promptly at 1:30 p. m.

R. B. Allen, district airport manager for the Federal Aviation Agency, will deliver the main address.

Beechcrafts, pipers, cessnos, croupe planes will fill the air over Stephenville on this eventful day. W. H. Stem, Chairman of the Dedication Program, announced that helicopters, sky-divers, new aircraft displays, and a National Guard Mobil Display has been added to the program.

Nine H-23 D Army Helicopters from Camp Wolters in Mineral Wells will provide entertainment through flyovers, aerial maneuvers, no-engine landings, and a static display.

Three members of the sky-divers group will jump from 10,000 feet with a 45-second delay.

Vernon Bramblett of the Stephenville National Guard, announced that a Mobil Weapons and Equipment Display Bus would be in the program. The bus is equipped with the latest weapons and equipment used by the Army, and is being employed as a part of the National Guard Recruiting Program.

County HD Clubs Plan To Observe National Event

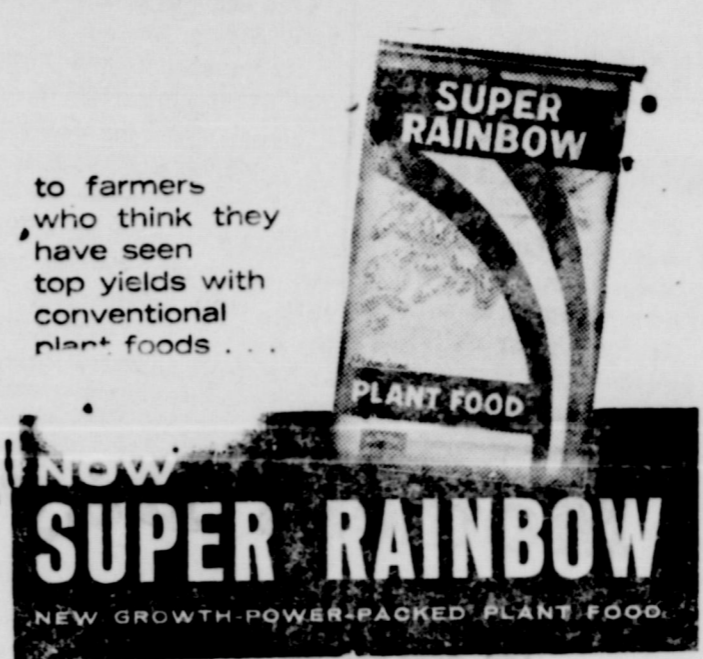
Q — Will the VA guaranty a business loan whereby a veteran may purchase a boat to use in business, either fishing or the transportation of sightseeing tourists?

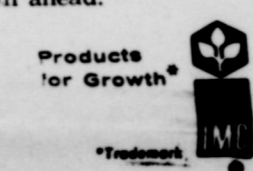
