Statement Made By Judge Hart In County Race

John S. Hart, candidate for re-election as county judge of Eastland County, today issued a formal statement in connection with his candidacy, as follows:

"In making my announcement for re-election as your County Judge I wish to express my sincere thanks and heartfelt appreciation to you for your confidence and support in the past. My family and I shall always be grateful to you for the splendid vote you gave me in the last election. Since I became your county judge I have assisted and cooperated with your County Commissioners in handling and managing the affairs of your County Government to the very best of my ability. It has been a pleasure to work with these men.

"Your County Judge acts as Juvenile Judge, in handling the neglected and delinquent children of our county. The County Attorney and I have done the very best we know how to make useful citizens out of these youngsters who have been neglected and who have fallen in the pitfalls of life. In dealing with these children we usually call in business men, school teachers and ministers of the various churches to help to advise and counsel with us in making our decisions. A number of these boys have reached the age of 17 and have entered the Armed Forces and are making good citizens. Some have engaged in various vocations of life and a very few of them have been sent to the Boys Training School at Gatesville.

"We are very proud of the Commission on the part of the Commissioners' Court sponsors in the county. There are now approximately 800 boys and girls enrolled in the various 4-H Clubs over the county. The 4-H's stand for the development of the head, heart, hands and health. The parents of the club boys and girls, the local leaders, who give of their time, and the county extension agents are to be complimented and congratulated on their fine program of work. The problems arising relative to juvenile delinquency in the county are kept at a minimum because of 4-H Club and other youth activities.

"Your Commissioners' Court has never refused to help our aged people of our county or any family who was in dire need of help, medical help or hospital care since I became your County Judge.

"When I became your County Judge, the Commissioners' Court appointed a County Veterans officer for each American Legion Post in the county, to assist the Disabled War Veterans, their widows and

Seniors Enjoy Educational Trip

There are more things to be learned than those found in books, as the Carbon High School seniors can tell you after their trip last weekend. They left Carbon very early Friday morning, April 27, and they returned Sunday afternoon. They were accompanied on their trip by Mrs. Ed F. Willman, their sponsor, and Mr. Dale Key, who drove the bus.

Their first stop was the Texas State Capitol at Austin, where on a guided tour through the Capitol, they visited the House of Representatives and Senate Chamber, the Governor's reception room, the vault where Texas bonds are kept, and the library, as well as the beautiful grounds and state archives.

From Austin they journeyed to San Marcos, where they took a ride in a glass bottom boat and observed underwater life of both plant and fish. They also enjoyed an underwater theater production at the Aquarena at San Marcos.

Everything seemed to favor the Carbon group, for the weather was perfect and no trouble of any kind marred their trip, not even a flat on the school bus in which they traveled.

Lack Of Fishing Licenses Cited

AUSTIN — This is fishing season, and too many are going fishing without buying licenses, according to arrest reports of game wardens for the month of March.

There were 94 arrests for fishing without a license during the month. In all, game wardens arrested 257 persons, and the courts assessed fines and costs amounting to \$8,889 for the month.

Although the deer hunting season has been closed since December 31, 1961, a number of arrests were made for killing deer in closed season, killing does, and hunting at night. In fact, there were 36 arrests made in connection with night hunting.

The licenses were suspended on 18 violators, and some of them paid fines amounting to \$200.

A fishing license is required of all persons between 17 and 65 who fish outside their home county or who fish with rod and reel or other winding device any place in the state. The price is \$2.15 for either resident or non-resident.

Game Agency To Employ Wardens

AUSTIN — Applications for employment of a limited number of game wardens are now being accepted by the Game and Fish Commission, according to H. D. Dodgen, executive secretary. The Commission is interested in receiving these applications from young men between ages 21 and 40, who are high school graduates and have an interest in wild life conservation.

The need for the additional applications has been brought about through reorganization of the Game and Fish Commission, which has created additional opportunities for advancement of men who can meet the requirements.

Application forms are available at local Game and Fish Commission offices or from the Personnel Office in Austin. Completed applications must be received by the Personnel Office prior to May 15, 1962. Written and oral examinations will be conducted in selected areas throughout the state in June, to make final selections.

Applicants selected will be employed in September, 1962, and will attend the 16-week game warden training course at Texas A&M College, scheduled for February, 1963. The course of instruction includes all phases of conservation work.

dependents in securing Federal Aid. Last year these Veterans Officers secured \$570,429.00 for these disabled war veterans and their dependents of Eastland County.

"We have maintained sufficient money in our Road and Bridge funds to purchase Right-of-Way on all Farm-to-Market roads, and the County's part of Right-of-Ways on State Highways being built or improved in the county. Under our present plans, we will be able to keep an ample amount of money in the Road and Bridge funds to finance all Right-of-Way costs for several years in the future. 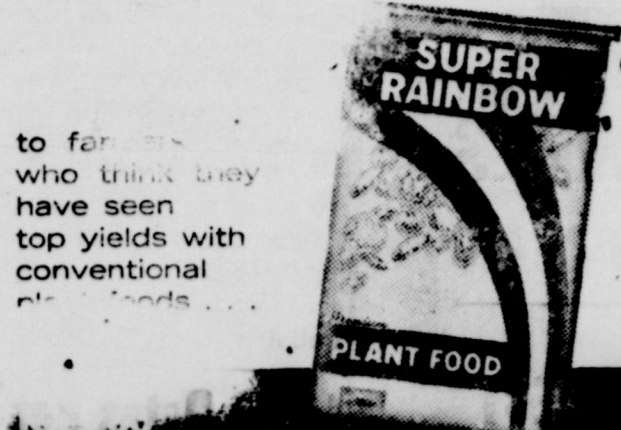
