County Federal Tax Bite Is Almost \$3.5 Million

Individual income tax pay-ments next month by residents of Eastland County will have to be meaty and numerous if Government forecasts are to work out right.

Indications are, from an ex-amination of local income figures, that the returns will be even larger than they were last April, when taxpayers in the county turned in approximately \$3,411,000 to cover their 1960 obligations.

The figures are based on the overall report of the Treasury Department covering the State of Texas, together with unofficial data on income groupings and average earning lo-

They show that personal tax returns from Eastland County amounted to 0.1 percent of the \$2,132,000,000 in such taxes collected throughout Texas as a whole. This includes the amounts deducted from wages, week by week, via withhold-

By Aprail 16, which is the deadline for payment of these taxes, the Government estimates that it will have received, nationally, a total of \$46.1 billion, or \$1.2 billion more than it collected last April.

County Livestock Show Due To Attract Large Number Entries

The 1962 Eastland County Live-stock Show on March 30-31 is expected to be the largest ever held, according to Roc Wilson, Gorman, president of the County Livestock Association, of the annual affair.

Ben McKinnis, Eastland, general superintendent, informed Wilson recently that 701 animals had been entered. The largest

Wilson recently that 701 animals had been entered. The largest division will be fat lambs, with 270 entered. McKinnis said that a total of 105 sheep will be entered in the breeding classes. Sixty goats, 140 fat pigs, as will as 53 sows and gilts will be exhibited. Twenty-seven dairy animals, 19 head of beef animals and 27 fat steers are also entered.

All animals must be entered and in their places by 11:00 a.m. on the opening day.

Breeding classes are open to both adults and FFA and 4-H Club members. The junior exhibitors must be enrolled in a public school to be eligible to show. Adults will compete for ribbons only. The FFA and 4-H Club Boys and Girls will compete for the \$2,000.00 in cash permiums to be awarded the winners.

Entried are limited to two animals per class in both breeding and fat divisions, except for FFA

Veterans Urged To Use Caution In GI Trading

their GI guaranteed homes to "proceed with caution" came today from Fdward P, Onstot, manager of the Veterans Administration Regional Office in

Dallas, Texas.
"An unfortunate number of veterans who did not heed pre-vious VA advice to relieve themselves of future liability in these deals are now faced with unexpected and substantial debts because later owners defaulted on the loans," Onstot said.

"Many veterans believe that deeding their GI house to some third party automatically relieves them of any further liability on their loan," Onstot added, "but this simply is not true. The note a veteran signs when he gets his GI loan is a contract in which he obligates himself to pay off the loan according to the terms of the note."

If the new owner or some subsequent owner fails to make payments on the outstanding loan and the lender has to foreclose, the veteran will be held liable to VA. along with any others who may have assumed the loan, for any loss VA sustains on the guaranty, Onstot

There are only two ways a veteran can be relieved of future liability for his GI loan in these sales and trades, Onstot emphasized. First, he can require the purchaser to pay cash i or finance a new loan which will

indebtedness. Under this type of transaction, the new owner can not be held responsible for any loss sustained by the lender or VA. If the mortgage is later foreclosed, the veteran will be held responsible for the loss, but not the person or company to whom he deeded the property.

In some parts of the country, a racket known as "equity milkhas been encouraged this kind of deed, Onstot said. Under this scheme, the operator pays the veteran a nominal sum for his equity and the deed to the GI house. He rents or manipulates the property to make a quick profit and the allows it to go in default. The Veteran is stuck with the loss.

"Other than full repayment of the GI loan," Onstot concluded, "the only guarantee against future liability for the veteran is for him to require the purchaser to personally assume the indebtedness and to secure from VA a release from liability."

VA can furnish a veteran advice and guidance how to best protect his interests if he calls on VA for help before he deeds his home to someone else, Onstot said, but if he waits until the new owner or subsequent transferee defaults on the loan, it's too late.

Big Grasshopper Bother Expected By State In 1962

COLLEGE STATION,—Texas is included in the area where grasshoppers may be bothersome in 1962, reports the U. S. Department of Agriculture. Federal state surveys conducted last fall disclosed grasshoppers on nearly 13.5 million acres of rangeland in 15 states.

Texas, California, Colorado, New Mexico and Washington were each found to have more than half a million grasshopperinfested acres.

Rangeland acreage infested with grasshoppers has more than tripled since 1960. An abnormally dry spring and a warm, dry fall in 1961, both favorable to insect survival, helped to increase the numbers, the USDA

reported.
Ranchers, farmers and governmental agencies will need to keep a sharp lookout in these infested areas, where outbreaks may occur and require control efforts, the USDA advises.

In communitywide programs on rangeland, the Agricultural Research Service finances up to one-third of the cost of grass-hopper control operations. Similar aid is available in countywide programs for controlling the pest on roadsides early in the season to prevent damaging outbreaks and migrations.

Surveys this spring, for newly hatched grasshoppers, will provide a more accurate extimate of expected populations. The surveys will also pinpoint areas where control operations will be necessary during the growing season to prevent severe losses of forage and other crops.





Vets Questions And Answers

Q - As a Spanish-American War veteran with 87 days of ac-tive duty I draw the service pension based on 70-days service. I think the new law adding travel time home to the service time will qualify me for the 90-day service pension. How do I apply for this?

A - The VA is now reviewing all cases where Spanish-American War veterans on the rolls for the 70-day service pension may now qualify for the 90-day pension. After a reasonable time, if you do not hear from the VA, write the Veterans Benefits Office, Munitions Building, Washington 25, D. C. Be sure to give your claim number. Your branch of the serfice will certify where you were separated and how much travel time it should have taken you to reach your home by the most
