"They dedicated it to the de-mocratic ideals to be realized for a program of rural educa-tion, development of farmer owned cooperatives and aggressive legislative campaigns.'


There is now \$4,727.56 on deposit of monies held by 91st District Court in its trust fund and registery. This represents monsince Dec. 31, 1954.


The dictionary defines "escheat" as the return of property to the state when there are no legally qualified heirs. The district clerk's office is in the process of filing with the state, a yearly report on the accounts subject to escheat. There are a total of 58 such cases on their court's books, Roy Lane re-reports. The clerk's office is reporting the name of the owner, insured beneficiary or annutant or person entitled to property and identification number of re-

Last known address of owner. (Many are unknown); Date property became payable, demandable or returnable. (Earliest case is dated Nov. 3, 1925); Date of last transaction with owner (None are listed for most cases); and the amount of money in each case.

One case has seven cents in it and has been on record since Aug. 31, 1941. It is the result of a suit between Security State Bank and Trust Co. vs. unknown Another account has \$444.83 with about 80 names, most with unknown addresses, of defendants. The largest such account contains \$675.59.

Many of the cases accounts have about \$1 with unknown parties. It's a time-consuming task just reporting these items.



Stockmen and sportsmen of Texas and the Southwest have been requested by the South-west Anamal Health Research Foundation to "pull all stops" immediately in their drive to control and possibly eliminate the costly screworm.

Mobil Announces Plans To Drill In Nimrod Area Socony Mobil Oil Co., Inc.,

has announced plans to drill their No. 1 Schaefer Estate as a wildcat oil test eight miles southwest of Cisco, according to in-formation here today. Permit called for 3,000 for the Caddo lime test.

Location was given as 330 feet from the south and 990 feet from the west lines of the northeast quarter of Section 94, Block 3, H&TC Survey.

There is one Caddo producer and several capped gas wells in that general area.

Elsewhere in the area, Texstar Petroleum Co. set pipe Saturday night on their No. 1 Gordon Woods, offset to Mississippi lime discovery production seven miles northeast of Cisco. The hole was bottomed in the top of the Ellenberger at 4,036 feet. Drill stem tests indicated that an outstanding producer was in prospect.

Plans called for completion work to begin by Thursday morning. Low Drilling Company, a partner in the project, has the contract. Plans for further explorations there have not been learned here.

said he had been advised by the Foundation's Board of Trustees that the long-sought goal of a screwworm-free Southwest would be a possibility for 1962 if full advantage is taken of the hard freeze of two weeks ago which dealt the flesh-eating parasite a very crippling blow. Chairman Fry added that if the \$3 million voluntary contribution goal of the drive is reached within the next two or three weeks, they could expect estimated savings during the next two years of \$200 million from screwworm damage and treatment costs and a reduction of up to 50 percent in the cost of the eradication program. These savings alone, he said, make a stepped-up effort most worthwhile, but more important-wouldn't it be a wonderful feeling to know that with the return of warm weather we wouldn't be spending time and money fighting the age-old battle against our most costly stock and wildlife pest? We are so close now to success that any slow down could set us back indefinitely and lose for us the advantage gained from the hard freeze. Chairman Fry said the Foundation Trustees are moving for-

ward with their plans to get the male sterile fly release program underway within the next few days. They have also notified all county chairmen of a statewide kickoff meeting for February 14. The meeting will be held in Austin and representatives from every county will be urged to attend. Details will be announced later but it is hoped the fund drive will be over the top by the date of

the meeting. Reports from 120 counties show that more than half a million dollars is now on deposit at banks in these counties. Organizations are now functioning in 212 counties. Too much is at stake, Chairman Fry said, to slow down now and he urged a redoubling of efforts by all drive participants.
