Peanut Support Level For 1962 Is Announced

On January 8, Secretary of Agriculture Orville L. Freeman announced the minimum national average support price for 1962 crop peanuts at \$221 per ton. This is the same as the 1961 support price. The announced support price reflects a 5 percent of the Jan 1952 peanut parity price of \$260 per ton.

The above information was telephoned to the office of Southwestern Peanut Growers' Association from the Department of Agriculture in Washington on Tuesday, January 9. Association officials worked diligently in 1961 for the \$29 per ton increase in support levels. They had again this year repeatedly expressed the hope that it would not be necessary to decrease price support levels due growers on 1962 crop peanuts. The announcement by the Secretary that the 1962 support level would not be lowered is therefore heralded by Association officials and is expected to result in extreme satisfaction when received by growers over the Southwest area. Through continuation of the relatively high support level on peanuts, major producing counties in the Southwest will be aided tremendously in maintaining a desirable level of economy.

The support price of \$221 per ton as announced is the minimum average price at which 1962 crop peanuts will be supported on a national basis. This figure could be adjusted upward in August depending upon the level of parity at that time, but in no event will the announced figure be lowered.

Vets Questions And Answers

Q — I am a veteran of World War II seeking further education. Can the VA be of assistance to me?

A — All educational rights for World War II veterans with non-service-connected disabilities have expired. If you have a service-connected disability, contact the nearest VA office.

Q — Can wives and children of veterans be treated in VA hospitals?

A — Not unless they are also veterans in their own right. However, VA hospitals may furnish emergency treatment to anyone to save a life, but payment must be made to cover the cost of the care.

Q — What happens when a veteran has neglected to name a beneficiary in his National Service Life Insurance policy?

A — If no beneficiary has been named or if the beneficiary named is not alive at the time the insured veteran dies, the proceeds are payable in one lump sum to the veteran's estate.

Q — I am receiving compensation for a service-connected disability rated at 40 percent. Does this allow extra compensation payments for children under 18?

A — No, only veterans with disabilities rated at 50 percent or higher are granted additional allowances for dependents.

Q — My father, no longer living, had a total of 30 days of military service, all during World War I, and he had no service-connected disability. My mother has no income of her own. Is she eligible for a pension from the VA?

A — No, thirty days of service is not long enough to meet the requirement for such a pension.

Fat Cats Fight Back

Little doubt remains that America's youths are becoming fat cats. That they are not as fit as they could be is borne out by these scientific studies of the last decade: Japanese children excelled Iowans in physical tests . . . British girls, 10 to 12 years old, beat American boys in leg-power tests for endurance . . . Italian and Austrian youths surpassed Americans in physical fitness. The clincher for these studies was America's disappointing performance in the Olympics.

Teen-age delegates at the recent National Youthpower Congress fought a fat-cat status. In asking for help to achieve fitness, they took note of a king-sized obstacle in many schools: Physical education facilities oriented to team needs. Those not on the team often are neglected.

To be a fit cat calls for a personal fitness program, experts say, not elaborate gym equipment. Daily exercise and physical activity make up one phase of the fight. Nutrition is another.

If nutrition is inadequate, the basis for performance is affected. A thiamine deficiency, short but severe, seriously disturbs coordination. Vitamin A deficiency handicaps anyone whose eyes have to adapt to darkness. A calorie deficiency drops endurance to low levels and loss of strength is dramatic. To build your nutrition, eat from a variety of foods each day. A teenager should include at least:

- 4 servings of enriched or whole grain bread or cereal
- 4 servings of fruit and vegetables
- 4 servings of milk or cheese
- 4 ounces of meat, fish, poultry, or dried peas or beans

Fat cats can become fit. Start with well-chosen food and exercise.

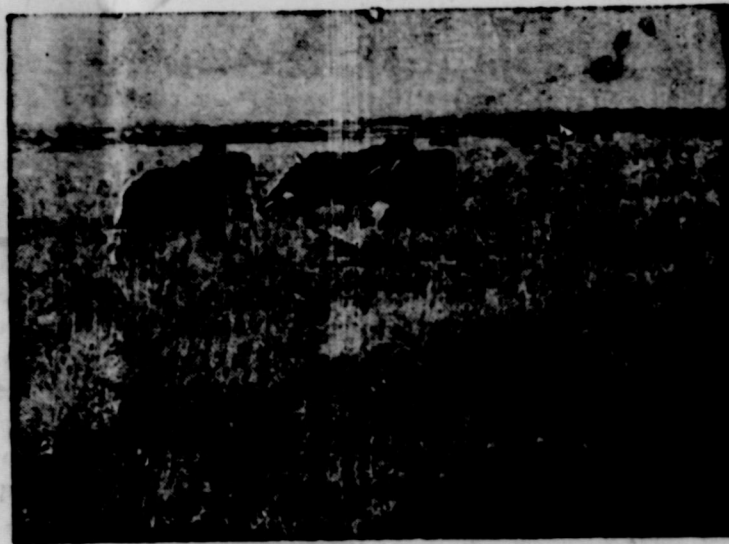

Almond Chicken With Rice

Chinese Chicken Almond With Rice, a delightful delicately flavored dish with chicken, celery topping, is sure to please your family. It makes an attractive "one main dish type meal" and is easily served to a crowd.

Fresh or canned mushrooms may be used for making Chinese Almond Chicken.

INGREDIENTS
1 cup uncooked rice
1 cup sliced mushrooms (canned or fresh)
1 cup almonds — blanched
2 tablespoons salad oil, to be used 1 tablespoon at a time
1 clove garlic, cut in half
1 teaspoon salt
1 cup cubed bamboo shoots (canned)
1 cup thinly sliced water chestnuts (canned)
1 cup thinly sliced celery
1 cup diced, cold chicken (fresh or canned)
1 1/2 tablespoons liquid (1 tablespoon each, from bamboo shoots and water chestnut cans)

INGREDIENTS FOR GRAVY
1 1/2 teaspoons cornstarch
1 1/2 teaspoons sugar
1 1/2 tablespoons water
4 teaspoons soy sauce

GARNISH
1/2 cup sliced green onion
PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE—To make 3 cups fluffy rice: Put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 3 cups of cold water and 1 1/2 teaspoons of salt in a two-

quart saucepan and cover with a tight-fitting lid. Bring to a vigorous boil. Then reduce the heat as low as possible and steam for 14 minutes or until all the water is absorbed, leaving the separate rice grains with their full nutritional value. This makes very firm rice grains. (If you prefer more tender rice grains, add 1/4 cup more water and increase the slow cooking time 4 or 5 minutes.) Remove the lid, permit the rice to steam dry to the desired consistency and the grains will be separate and fluffy. Never stir rice; lift gently with a fork.

METHOD: Brown almonds in 1 tablespoon oil. Set aside. With table fork, mash garlic into salt in skillet. (Be sure there is a tight-fitting cover, which can be used later.) Add 1 tablespoon oil, then add chicken. Brown lightly. Add 1 tablespoon oil and then bamboo shoots and mushrooms. Brown lightly. Add liquid, drained from canned bamboo shoots and water chestnuts. Cover tightly. Cook over low heat 5 minutes. Add water chestnuts, celery and 1/2 of the almonds. Just heat through. Celery and chestnuts should remain crisp. For gravy . . . shake up in small jar, cornstarch, salt, sugar, water and soy sauce. Stir into mixture. Cook until liquid thickens and is smooth. Sprinkle over dish, green onions and rest of almonds. Serve with hot fluffy cooked rice. This will serve 4.

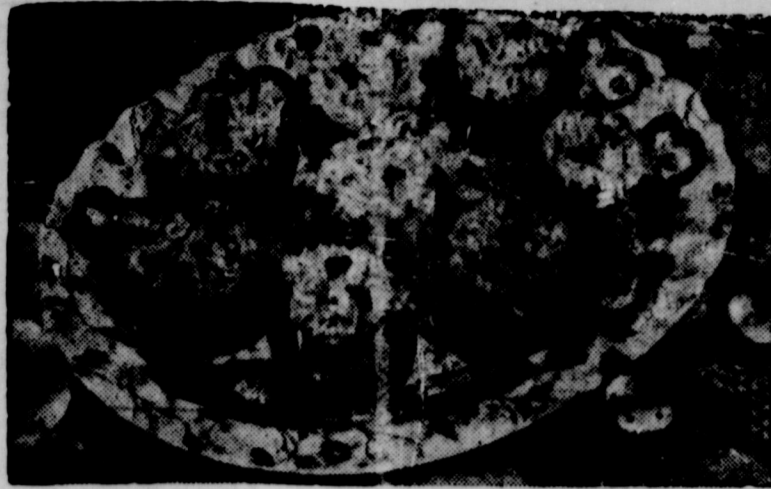

Curried Rice and Tuna Make a Tasty and Thrifty Filling for Luscious Tomatoes

Rice brings together the deep sea goodness of tuna fish and the Oriental excitement of curry in this versatile main dish. The curry powder contributes exotic flavor and intriguing color enhanced by the bits of green pepper and the brilliant red of the tomatoes.

Served piping hot from the oven or cold and refreshing on a bed of greens, this "something special" for the family is also something quick and easy for Mom to fix.

INGREDIENTS:
3 medium sized ripe tomatoes
4 tablespoons minced onion
2 tablespoons minced green pepper
4 tablespoons butter or margarine

1 7-ounce can tuna fish
2 cups cooked rice
1 teaspoon curry powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/4 cup water

PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE: To make 3 liberal cups of fluffy rice, put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt into a 2 quart saucepan and bring to a vigorous boil. Turn the heat as low as possible. Cover saucepan with a lid and leave over this

low heat for 14 minutes. Do not remove lid nor stir rice while it is cooking. Turn off the heat. Use exact measurements of uncooked rice and water. Time the cooking accurately.

For real convenience and economy of time and effort, keep un-used rice in the refrigerator in a covered container at all times. Use it for many quick, delicious and inexpensive soups, salads, casserole dishes, hot breads and desserts.

METHOD: Peel tomatoes easily by scalding, plunging into cold water and then peeling. Slice off stem end of tomatoes. Carefully scoop out pulp. Cook onion and green pepper in the butter or margarine until tender. Add the tuna fish, rice, curry powder salt, pepper and water. Mix thoroughly. Fill the tomatoes with the tuna and rice mixture and bake at 350° F. about 15 minutes or until the tomatoes are tender. Serve hot. Garnish with green pepper rings if desired.

For a cool and refreshing salad, chill the tomatoes after they are stuffed and serve on salad greens. This recipe makes 8 servings or 3 cups of the curried tuna and rice mixture.

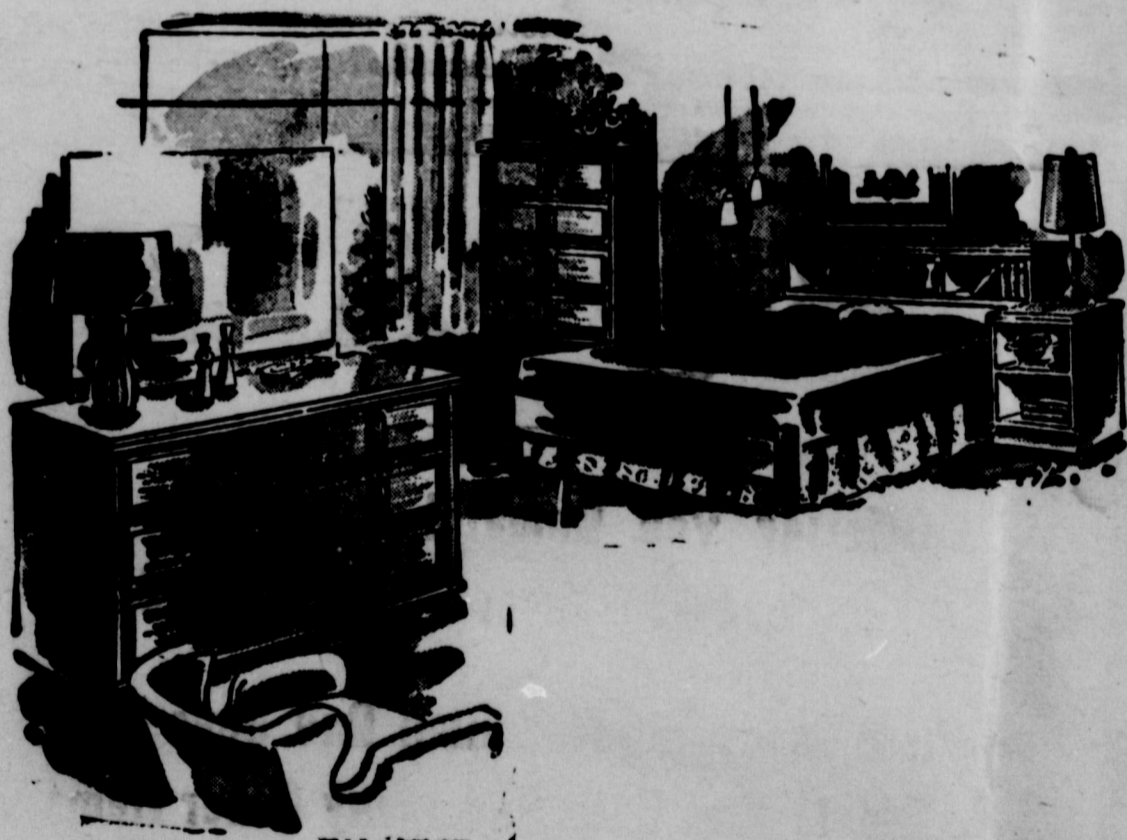

About Your Health

The fact that birds are a reservoir of some diseases transmissible to man has been known for a long time. However, the mounting store of knowledge concerning the arboviruses (literally bird-borne) is a comparatively new item of public health research.

Some of the more common diseases caused by these viruses occur in Texas. These are the St. Louis encephalitis (mistakenly called sleeping sickness and the Western and Eastern equine types.

The names signify where a particular virus was first identified. Puzzling transmission cycles are the hallmark of these viruses. Encephalitis is borne by birds. However, transmission of the virus from birds to horses or from birds to man is through mosquitoes. There apparently is no direct transmission from horse to man or from man to man.

The responsible culprit is a family of mosquitoes called Culicidae. These include the common household mosquito — Culex tarsalis — and a mosquito common to rural areas — Culex quinquefasciatus. There are others, but these two cause the most trouble in Texas.

Outbreaks of St. Louis encephalitis have occurred in the Lower Rio Grande Valley in recent years. This virus rarely, if ever, causes definite illness in equines.

In late summer and fall of 1961 several cases of encephalitis were confirmed by the State Health Department's Laboratory Section in Austin. Most of the cases were reported from counties of south and west Texas in the H-Plains area.

The control of Culicine mosquitoes is difficult because they breed in tremendous numbers in irrigated areas. A favorite breeding spot for these mosquitos is residual waters — in ditches following heavy rains or unabsorbed irrigation water.

Season peaks occur in the spring and fall because of heavy rains during those periods. Current research is directed toward manipulation of the playa lakes and seeking more data on the basic infection chains of birds and mammals by mosquitos.
