J. E. SPENCER, WELL KNOWN CIVIC LEADER, DIES

J. E. Spencer, 84, long-time Cisco and Eastland County busi-ness and civic leader, died at

A former manager of the Cisco Chamber of Commerce, a former banker, business man, agriculture leader and a civic and church worker, Mr. Spencer was well known .throughout Central Texas. He was born Oct. 15, 1877, in Mississippi, and came to Texas with his family in 1898. The family settled at De Leon.

In 1900, Mr. Spencer entered the banking profession at • D Leon. A year later, he moved to Gorman to join others in organizing the first bank there Three years later, he we Carbon and organized that t first bank. He operated the Bank of Carbon for 17 years, moving to Cisco in 1920.

During the early 1920s, Mr. Spencer was also financially interested in banks at Rising Star and Cross Plains. He sold all of these interests when he moved to Cisco. Later, he was interested in oil edvelopment and in agricu, ire.

and took part in other civic affairs.


Mr. Spencer was married to the former Miss Alice Poe in 1913 at Carbon.

He was a prominent member of the First Baptist Church for many years and was a trustee at one time.

Surviving Mr. Spencer are his wife of the home; one daughter, Mrs. Billy C. Frost, Eastland; two sisters, Mrs. Lera Gregory and Miss Vera Spencer, both of Fort Worth; and two grandaughters, Julie and Carolyn Frost, Eastland.



Charles is a 'ife-iong resident! Gorman and was employed b Bigginootham Bros. lor a num. ber of years. He now operates pean t farm and pecan orchard Mr. Underwood will make his 'ormal statement at a later date

Mr. Spencer planted one of the first large furit orchards in this section of the state, starting with a 160-acre block that he used for peach trees at Long Branch. The orchard was later enlarged and was operated by Mr. Spencer successfully for many years until he sold it a few years ago to W. H. Smith of De Leon. He operated Spencer's Fruit Stand in Cisco each summer for many years.

In 1930, Mr. Spencer was elected manager of the Chamber of Commerce without applying for the post. He served for several years in that capacity. He spent some nine years as secretary of the Cisco Rotary Club, and was at one time a member of the board of trustees of the Cisco Public Schools. He headed Red Cross campaigns






