30 Million Take Part In Hunting, **Fishing Sports**

COLLEGE STATION, -- There must something to these outdoor sports of hunting and fishing, says Ed Cooper, extension wildlife specialist. According to a survey conducted recently by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, he says some 30 million people in the United States hunt and fish, and that fishermen outnumber the hunters by about

About \$4 bullion are poured into the American economy each year by these outdoorsmen, says Cooper. This money is spent mainly for equipment, transportation, food and lodging, lease fees and licenses. American fishermen spent about \$3 billion in1960, while hunters spent \$1 billion. Combined, they traveled 13.2 billion automobile miles.

inues. Considering these impressive increases in the amount of time, money and effort spent on hunting and fishing, Americans should look to the future and give serious thought to the conservation of our wildlife and fisheries resources.

This can be done through respect for hunting and fishing regulations, management of wildlife on farms and ranches and gen-cral support of conservation activities everywhere, points out

Eastland School Integration Is Approved 4-to-1 In Election

The Eastland Independent School District voted by a 4-to-1 margin in favor of public school intergration in an election Tuesday. A total of 410 votes were cast - 344 for integration and 66 against.

The school district faces loss of state accreditation unless it improved its Negro school, and had received repeated warnings during the last two years from the accreditation division of the Texas Education Agency that the Desglas School for Negroes falled to meet state standards.

School Board Chairman M. H. perry said by means of inter-gration, the board hopes conditions can be improved and the threat of accreditation loss eliminated. He said the schools probably will not intergrate until the fall of 1962.

The Cisco Independent School Board discussed the integration question at a meeting of the board Tuesday night. Supt. T. M. Roach reported that Cisco will have to provide in some way for the 15 Negro students from Cisco that have been attending high school in Eastland. Eastland has already notified the local school board that they will not accept them as trans-

fer students after this year. The school board has taken under consideration an integration election in Cisco, Mr. Roach This will be discussed furthur at the next board meeting on Dec. 12, he added.

Mr. Roach stated that if Cisco does not integrate, a new school

building will have to be built and equipped. At least six teachers will have to be employed at a cost of \$20,000 to be paid out of local taxes which would mean a sharp increase in local taxes.

In other business, the board voted to discontinue baseball as a school sport. An audit report b yCarroll B. Ray and Kenneth Cooper was heard and approved.

The Carbon High School Basketball Tournament starts at the local gym at 2:30 p.m. December 7, and runs through ember 9.

The following teams will enter the tournament: Scranton, Put-nam, Moran, Olden, Rising Star, Gorman, Eastland, Ranger and Carbon, both boys and girls.

This is one of the best groups of teams to enter our tournament in several years and a good tournament is anticipated.

The High School boys and girls, both A and B team boys and A team girls will play Scranton in the local gym Tues-day night, Nov. 28, with the games starting at 6 p.m.

The grade school basketball teams, both boys and girls, play Olden here Monday night, Nov. 27. Game time is 7 p.m.

Quotes From Washington

WASHINGTON, D. C. — A prominent retired general who is now an official of one of the largest corporations of the nation was recently asked why the public seldom learned of the mistakes made by executives of private concerns. His reply was, "That is easy to answer. It is because the many mistakes made constantly in big business are never really known. Some of them are not even known to the directors of the corporation.

"Government operates in a goldfish bowl and this is as it

should be. Private industry is somewhat in isolation from public view."

The European common market, composed of six nations in Central Western Europe, is drawing on the experience of American business. They are setting up a goal of internal free trade and free movement of workers in a trade area comprising 170 million people. The anticipated entry of Great Britain and several other countries will expand the Western European Market to nearly 300 million people. This number is larger than the United States

and larger than Russia and its
European satellites combined.
The Common Market presents a
challenge to America to try to
keep Common Market external
tarriffs as low as possible so as
not to discriminate against United
States exports of both manufactured and agricultural products.

Bill Johnson, Bobcat Nemesis, Adds 42nd Quarry To His Kill This Year

Two bobcats which Bill Johnson killed last week on the Cecil Shults farm north of town brought to a total of 42 the er of such marauders which he has destroyed this

year.

Mr. Johnson, who operates
the Johnson Humble Service Station on East Highway 36 as a business, pursues as his hob-by the destruction of these snarling pests which cause farmers and stockmen such a great amount of loss in small livestock and poultry.

One of the cats which he killed on the Shults farm weighed in excess of 25 pounds. But, big as it was, it did not approach the size of one which he destroyed on the Bill Tyler farm in the Orka community some months ago. That animal, the largest of his bag, weighed 40 pounds and more.

Such a creature can do a lot of execution in terms of goats, sheep, poultry and other small livestock and poultry, and it would be fearsome antagonist for a human being at close quarters. Mr. Johnson uses both rifle and trap in his war against the pests and needless to say he is having a lot of success in ridding the country of these beasts. But there is a lot of them in the area.
