The pecan organization and the Ranger Chamber of Commerce are jointly sponsoring the annual affair, which will be held in the Joseph building on main street according to R. V. Galloway, manager of the Chamber.

30 Million Take Part In Hunting, Fishing Sports

COLLEGE STATION, — There must be something to these outdoor sports of hunting and fishing, says Ed Cooper, extension wildlife specialist. According to a survey conducted recently by the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, he says some 30 million people in the United States hunt and fish, and that fishermen outnumber the hunters by about 2 to 1.

About \$4 billion are poured into the American economy each year by these outdoorsmen, says Cooper. This money is spent mainly for equipment, transportation, food and lodging, lease fees and licenses. American fishermen spent about \$3 billion in 1960, while hunters spent \$1 billion. Combined, they traveled 13.2 billion automobile miles.

The number of women hunters increased from 418,000 in 1955 to 860,000 in 1960, Cooper continues.

Considering these impressive increases in the amount of time, money and effort spent on hunting and fishing, Americans should look to the future and give serious thought to the conservation of our wildlife and fisheries resources.

If future generations are to enjoy these great outdoor sports, everything possible must be done to conserve fish and game. This can be done through respect for hunting and fishing regulations, management of wildlife on farms and ranches and general support of conservation activities everywhere, points out Cooper.

It would be sad indeed if our grandchildren were denied the pleasure of talking about the big ones that got away, concludes the specialist.

A quart of pecans constitute an entry and they may be either of the papershell variety or native seedlings. There is no charge for entering the show, anyone from Eastland or adjoining counties is eligible to show, according to Sims. Ribbons will be awarded the winners. No cash prizes are to be paid. Top three places of each variety will be sent to Texas A & M College to be entered in the State Pecan Show. These will not be returned. Others will be returned to the owners after the show, it was explained.

Judges of the show will be from the horticultural department of A & M College, headed by B. G. Hancock, horticultural specialists of the Agricultural Extension Service, who has helped to judge all of the previous shows of the country.

The pecan bake show will be under the direction of the County Home Demonstration Council, Mrs. C. M. McCain, Eastland, chairman.

The 1947 Club at Ranger will have charge of the pecan queen contest. Mrs. J. P. Morris is president of the club. The crowning of the queen will be held on the night of Thursday, Dec. 7 in the High School auditorium.

A new feature of this year's show is decorative centerpiece using pecans and other autumn flora. Cash prizes will be paid to the winners of first, second and third places in this event, according to Sims.

The National Pecan Shellers and Processors Association of Chicago, will award a trophy to the owner of the winning grand champion papershell variety as well as the grand champion of the native seedling variety.

Eastland School Integration Is Approved 4-to-1 In Election

The Eastland Independent School District voted by a 4-to-1 margin in favor of public school integration in an election Tuesday. A total of 410 votes were cast — 344 for integration and 66 against.

The school district faces loss of state accreditation unless it improved its Negro school, and had received repeated warnings during the last two years from the accreditation division of the Texas Education Agency that the Douglas School for Negroes failed to meet state standards.

School Board Chairman M. H. Perry said by means of integration, the board hopes conditions can be improved and the threat of accreditation loss eliminated. He said the schools probably will not integrate until the fall of 1962.

The Cisco Independent School Board discussed the integration question at a meeting of the board Tuesday night. Supt. T. M. Roach reported that Cisco will have to provide in some way for the 15 Negro students from Cisco that have been attending high school in Eastland. Eastland has already notified the local school board that they will not accept them as transfer students after this year.

The school board has taken under consideration an integration election in Cisco, Mr. Roach said. This will be discussed further at the next board meeting on Dec. 12, he added.

Mr. Roach stated that if Cisco does not integrate, a new school

building will have to be built and equipped. At least six teachers will have to be employed at a cost of \$20,000 to be paid out of local taxes which would mean a sharp increase in local taxes.

In other business, the board voted to discontinue baseball as a school sport. An audit report by Carroll B. Ray and Kenneth Cooper was heard and approved.

Quotes From Washington

WASHINGTON, D. C. — A prominent retired general who is now an official of one of the largest corporations of the nation was recently asked why the public seldom learned of the mistakes made by executives of private concerns. His reply was, "That is easy to answer. It is because the many mistakes made constantly in big business are never really known. Some of them are not even known to the directors of the corporation."
"Government operates in a goldfish bowl and this is as it

should be. Private industry is somewhat in isolation from public view."

The European common market, composed of six nations in Central Western Europe, is drawing on the experience of American business. They are setting up a goal of internal free trade and free movement of workers in a trade area comprising 170 million people. The anticipated entry of Great Britain and several other countries will expand the Western European Market to nearly 300 million people. This number is larger than the United States

and larger than Russia and its European satellites combined. The Common Market presents a challenge to America to try to keep Common Market external tariffs as low as possible so as not to discriminate against United States exports of both manufactured and agricultural products.

PAPER MONEY of the United States is comparatively of germs. The currency carries 129 microbes. That of Formosa 230; and Argentina 175. According to the microbe counters, American bills carry only 73.

Bill Johnson, Bobcat Nemesis, Adds 42nd Quarry To His Kill This Year

Two bobcats which Bill Johnson killed last week on the Cecil Shults farm north of town brought to a total of 42 the number of such marauders which he has destroyed this year.

Mr. Johnson, who operates the Johnson Humble Service Station on East Highway 36 as a business, pursues as his hobby the destruction of these snarling pests which cause farmers and stockmen such a great amount of loss in small livestock and poultry.

One of the cats which he killed on the Shults farm weighed in excess of 25 pounds. But, big as it was, it did not approach the size of one which he destroyed on the Bill Tyler farm in the Orka community some months ago. That animal, the largest of his bag, weighed 40 pounds and more.

Such a creature can do a lot of execution in terms of goats, sheep, poultry and other small livestock and poultry, and it would be a fearsome antagonist for a human being at close quarters. Mr. Johnson uses both rifle and trap in his war against the pests and needless to say he is having a lot of success in ridding the country of these beasts. But there is a lot of them in the area. Civilization which, advancing, reduced the wild animal population in some instances almost to the vanishing point, seems, now that it is well established, to be offering protection. The number of bobcats, foxes, coons and weasels appears to be increasing to line with the human birth rate.

One of the oddest instances of a bobcat kill was related by Mrs. Canova Weaver who brought her bag to town to prove it several weeks ago.
