## Highway Use Tax Forms Available From IRS Office

Abilene—The Internal Revenue Service has new and revised tax forms available for filing Highway Use Tax and floor stock returns for this fiscal year, according to A. E. Fogle, Jr., administrative officer of the Abilene Internal Revenue Service office.

Mr. Fogle pointed out that new tax forms 2291 for tire dealers and others to pay floor stock tax have been mailed to a large number of the dealers. Other tax forms are available from any Internal Revenue Service office.

This return, paying the tax on floor stock on hand on July 1, is due by October 15, 1961.

He also pointed out that revised Forms 2290 for truck owners to use in paying the increased Highway Use Tax imposed July 1 for trucks weighing more than 26,000 pounds have also been mailed to last year's taxpayers.

The new Forms 2290 are available at Internal Revenue Service offices and the Highway Use Tax return must be filed by August 31 but the tax can be paid in installments.

Any taxpayers who did not receive a revised Form 220; or who buys a truck after July 1 should obtain the form from Internal Revenue Service.

### Big Game Hunting Season Opens In State October 1st

AUSTIN — The big game hunting season will open in the trans-Pecos area of Texas, Oct. 1, with permits issued for the harvesting of approximately 2100 pronghorn antelope in that area, according to Howard Dodgen, executive secretary of the Game and Fish Commission.

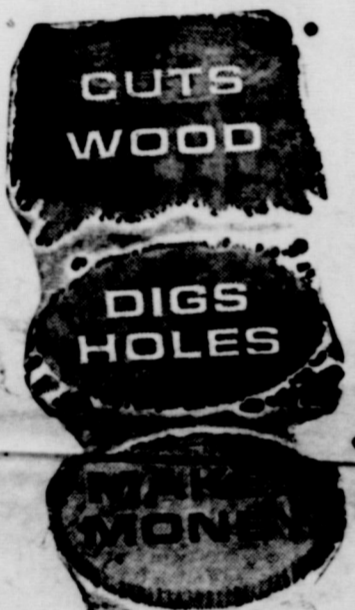
Summer rains have improved range conditions in the area and the antelope are reported to be in excellent condition.

Persons wishing to hunt the pronghorns may get lists of ranches where hunting is available by contacting the chambers of commerce in Marfa, Alpine, Sierra Blanca and Van Horn.

Permits are issued to landowners based on head counts by game department personnel. Landowners in turn charge hunters for permission to enter their places. The prices usually range from \$40 for a doe to \$60 for a buck.

Although most of the places are leased up early for the first two or three days, good hunting still can be had, depending upon weather, for the remainder of the season.

Hunters have been having better than 90 per cent success and the antelope are in excellent condition.

**New Law Allows Farmer Trailers License For \$5**

**AUSTIN**—The last regular session of the Texas Legislature amended the Texas Motor Vehicle Registration Law to allow farmers to license their farm trailers and farm semi-trailers for a five dollar fee providing the gross weight is not less than 4,000 or more than 10,000 pounds. From trailers weighing less than 4,000 pounds, gross weight, are still exempt from registration by statute. Those exceeding must register as a regular commercial trailer.

vised however that any vehicle bearing the five dollar plate must not: (1) exceed 30 MPH, (2) be operated for hire, (3) have steel or metal wheels in contact with the pavement and it must be equipped with an adequate hitch to remain secure to the towing vehicle and be operated and equipped in conformity with all other provisions of the law. Violation of any of the above elections of the law nullifies the five dollar registration fees and penalties as prescribed by law.

This does not change the existing law which requires that all trailers or semi-trailers having a registered or gross weight in excess of 3,000 pounds to be equipped with clearance lamps, side marker lamps, and reflectors as well as a tail light and stop light, if the stop light on the towing vehicle is obscured. Captain Bell further stated that all machinery type vehicles, other than machinery used solely for the purpose of drilling water wells and road construction machinery, must now be registered with regular license plates and title applied for.

Water well drilling units and road construction and maintenance equipment are required to have either the five dollar license plate or a regular registration plate, depending upon how the equipment is used.
