The only poor elements in the overall scene is a very poor pecal crop and a variation in peanut yields do to borer dan a week weath an some other adverse cause.

Nevertheless, an average of about 40 bushels per acre overall is predicted in some quarters and there are parts of the area in which the yield is expected to exceed last year's record average of 49 bushels per acre.

He said that the yields so far noted ranged from 17 bushels per acre to well over 100 bushels, the latter principally

from irrigated fields. He said that the favorable weather during the growing and harvest season had boosted dry land yields to a bette figure, percentagewise, than yields from irrigated lands.

The harvest was estimated at about 80 per cent complete this week, and given fair weather for the next week trost of the crop would be in the dry by the end of the week.

Leon-Bosque Resources Plan Faces Congress

The project will be considered for aproval by sub-committees of the Senate and

"I am pleased to be of assistance and I will continue my efforts on behalf of this project." Burleson said.
The project is aimed at i-clentifying and develoging agriculture resources of the 5-county area which would contribute to the economic growth of the area, its sponsors

explained.
It would integrate agricultural factors into the overall program for industrial and economic development and aid chamber of commerce and other civic groups in their efforts to attract more industry and stablize the economic welfare of the region, they said.



AN ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE FIXING AND DETERMINING THE GENERAL SERVICE RATE TO BE CHARG-ED FOR SALES OF NATURAL GAS TO RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL CONSUMERS WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF CARBON, EASTLAND COUNTY TEXAS, AND PROVIDING FOR THE MANNER IN WHICH SUCH RATE MAY BE CHANGED, AD-JUSTED AND AMENDED AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CARBON, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Effective with the first gas bills rendered after the final aprpoval of this ordinance, the maximum general service rate for sales of natural gas rendered to residential and commercial consumers within the city limits of Carbon by Lone Star Gas Company, a Texas corporation, its successors and assigns, is hereby fixed and determined as follows:

First 2,000 cu. ft. or less \$1.344 per Mcf Gross; \$1.21 per Mcf Net. Next 10,000 cu. ft. @ \$1.911 per Mcf Gross; \$.91 per Mcf Net. Next 10,000 cu. ft. @ .900 per Mcf Gross; .81 per Mcf Net,

All Over 22,000 cu. ft. @ .789 per Mcf Gross; .71 per Mcf Net. MINIMUM BILL - \$2.688 Gross; \$2.42 Net per meter per

ADJUSTMENT The amount of each net monthly bill computed at the above stated rates shall be subject to the following adjustment: Plus an amount equivalent to the proportionate part of any new tax, or increased tax, or any other overnmental imposition, rental, care state, counvalorem taxes and taxes on not income) levied, assessed or im-posed subsequent to July 1, 1969, upon or allocable to the Company's distribution operations, by any new or amended law, ordinance or contract. Each gross

monthly bill shall be adjusted proportionately. Company, at its on, may tion of this adjustment; however, failure of Company to apply such adjustment shall not constitute a waiver of Company's right from time to time, or at any time, to make such adjustment, in whole or in part, in any subsequent current monthly bill that may be applicable to such bill.

Net sate shall apply to all bills paid within ten days from monthly billing date; gross rate shall be applicable thereafter.

The above rate is applicable to each residential and commercial consumer per month or for any part of a month for which gas it used at the same location.

In addition to the aforesaid rates, Company shall have the right to collect such reasonable charges as are necessary to conduct its business and to carry out its reasonable rules and regulations in effect.

SECTION 2. The rate set forth in Section I may be changed and amended by either the City or Company furnishing gas in the manner provided by law. Service hereunder is subject to the orders of regulatory bodies having jurisdiction, and to the Company's Rules and Regulations currently

on file in the Company's office. SECTION 3. The fact that there is an imperative public need for anordinance fixing and determining the rate for gas and gas service furnished to residential and commercial consumers creates an emergency, and the reading and passage of this ordinance at three separate meetings is hereby suspended and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after the date of its passage at a single meeting and the approval thereof by the May-
