To Represent Carbon At Peanut Festival in Eastland

Miss Griffin will ride in a chariot of honor along with other princesses from the county, in the gigantic parade to be held at 2:30 p.m. She will also make an appearance at the Ranger College and Cisco College football game Saturday night.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Congressman Omar Burleson has announced that administrative approval has been given the North-east Tributaries of the Leon River Watershed Plan. This is a watershed protection, flood prevention project embracing 202,880 acres in Comanche, Erath and Eastland Counties, in the areas of Cow, Armstrong and Resley Creeks, tributaries to the Leon River.

In accordance with Public Law 566, the Secretary of Agriculture has submitted the Plan to the Agriculture Committee of the House of Representatives for final consideration and approval. In view of adjournment, it will be the first of the next Session before the Committee will be able to take it up.

The estimated total cost of the project is \$3,025,952. of this amount federal money in the sum of \$2,365,831.00 is provided, with the balance of \$660,121 to come from local and other funds.

Local sponsors of the project are the Upper Leon Soil Conservation District, Palo Pinto Soil Conservation District, Erath County Commissioners Court, and Comanche County Commissioners Court.

Eastland Petition Asks Vote On School Integration There

Petitions are being circulated in Eastland requesting an election be held on school integration, according to the Eastland Telegram.

One hundred and twenty nine signatures had been secured and 200 signatures were needed to call the election in the Eastland district, the Telegram said.

The election must be called within 60 days after the filing of the petitions if they are found to be in order, according to law.

If the election is called and carries in favor of abolition of the dual system in Eastland, it will likely result in the complete or partial closing of the Douglas School for Negroes. There are 54 Negro students in the 12 grades at Douglas school. Forty are from Eastland and 14 are from Cisco.

M. H. Perry, chairman of the Eastland school board, told the Telegram that he estimated that \$150,000 in improvements and the addition of at least three additional teachers to bring the school to the standards required by the state.

The Eastland school district is in the position of being on the state "warning" list and if improvements aren't made at Doug-

las school, the district is in danger of ineligibility for accreditation and ineligibility to receive any Foundation Program Funds after this school year, it was noted by the Telegram.

In the event Eastland voters approve the integration plan, the 4 Ciscoans will be returned here. It would be necessary for the Cisco district to provide educational facilities for them or to integrate the local schools, the Telegram indicated.
