and upkeep.

The tax is collected to retire outstanding Road District Bonds that were assumed by the Board of County Bond Indebtedness several years ago.

Eastland County would have collected more if it had not had the outstanding bonds. A total of \$1,369.45 was applied to the county's indebtedness.

Drivers License Fees To Increase

Austin - The Texas Department of Public Safety reminded Texas drivers today an increase in license fees has been ordered by the Legislature effective September 1.

The Texas Operator's license on and after that date will be increased from \$2 to \$3 for a two-year period, the commercial driver's license will be increased from \$3 to \$4.50 for a three-year period, and the chauffeur's license will go up from \$4 to \$6 per year.

The fee for a duplicate of lost license will remain at 25 cents.
"We urge all drivers to be sure they send the right amount in with their renewal applications," said Col. Homer Garrison, Jr., DPS Director. "Those which are accompanied by the old fee after September 1 will have to be returned to the sender, causing unnecessary delay and in-

convenience." He said the \$3 two-year operator's license will still be lower than the fees in 12 other states and will be exactly the same as in five other states. He reported Texas now has 4,838,000 currently licensed drivers.

"Incidentally," said Garrison, "we would like to urge drivers to take care of their licenses, in spite of the fact that it only costs 25 cents for a replacement Last year we received 85,000 applications for duplicates of lost or mutilated licenses.'
