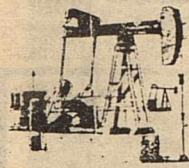

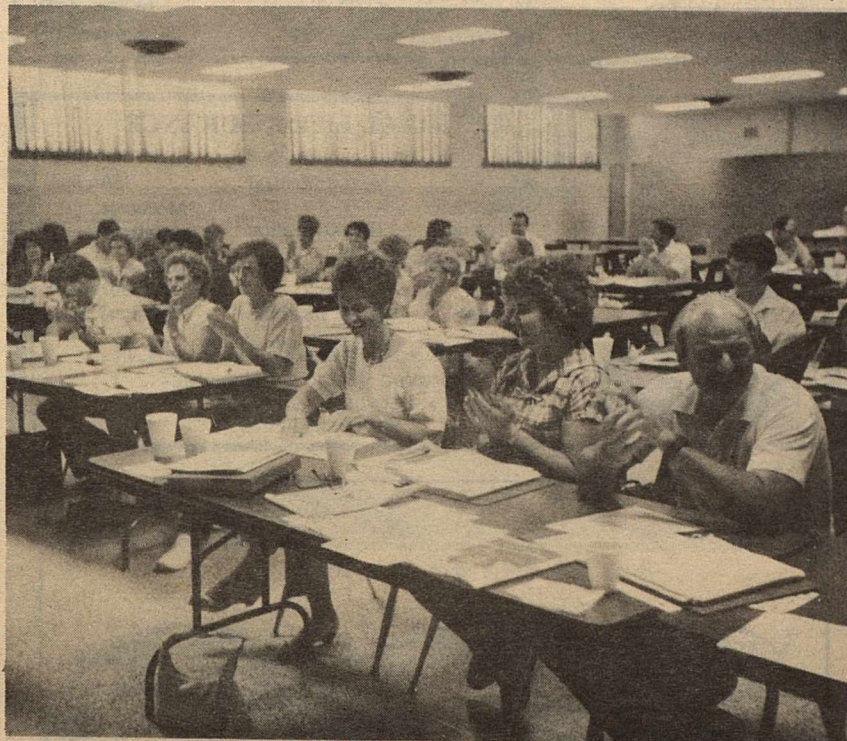

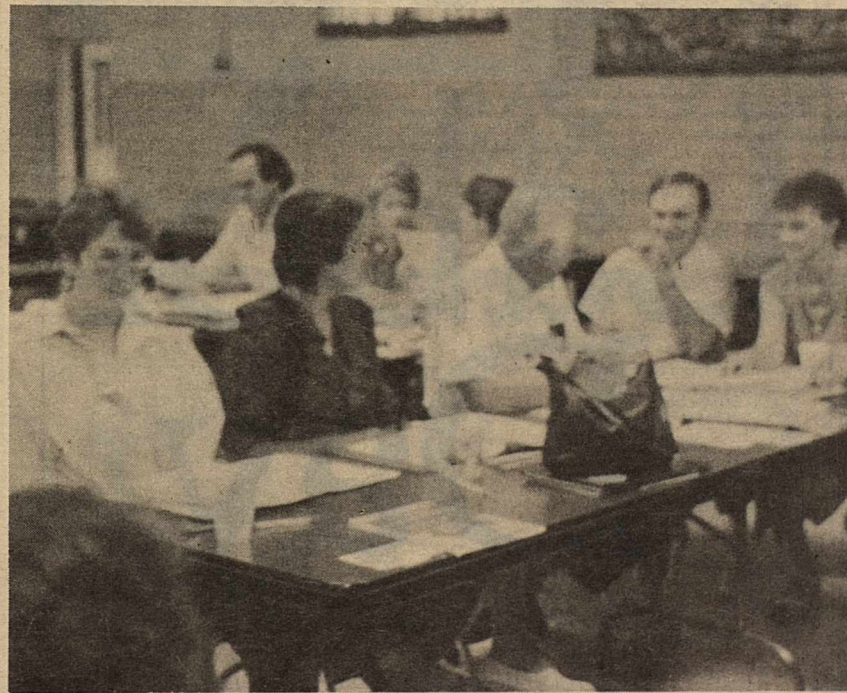

## Additional Charges Levied On Hauling & Loading Trash

Residents of Plains will be paying an additional charge for removal of trash too large or of prohibitive nature to be placed in Dumpsters. Fee for pick up and removal of a small load will be \$5. A large load, if additional manpower or extra city equipment is needed, will cost \$20.

The loading and dumping of the tremendous amount of limbs, appliances and other rubbish, has become a full time job for John Camp, who agreed to make the

hauls. Other city employees have been called from their jobs to help in this clean-up, which has made it necessary for an additional charge to be levied.

Persons wishing to have the city pick up extra trash, limbs or such may call the City Hall. Camp will make an estimate of charges before the trash is removed.

Persons hauling their own trash are charged \$2.50 for small loads and \$10 for a truck load.

Entries must be deposited before the 3 p.m. pick-up each Friday or postmarked by Friday, if mailed.

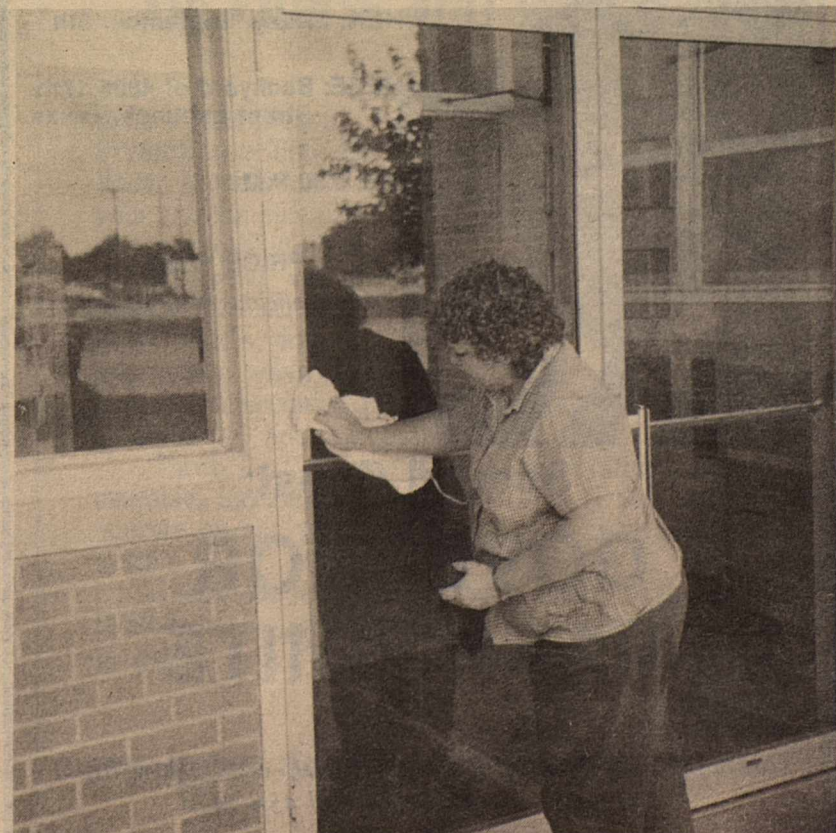
## 'Hometown Talent' To Play In Stanford Park Saturday

Plains Cowgirls, led by Ruth Diaz, sent Wellman's Wildcats home Tuesday evening with losses in a two game match. Scoring 13 points, Miss Diaz played a leading role in the 15-4 and 15-7 victories for the Cowgirls.

The Cowgirls will meet the Cats again Nov. 1 in Wellman. A victory for the Cowgirls that night would guarantee a district championship and advancement to bi-district competition.

Tuesday's win was a boost for the Cowgirls who were eliminated last weekend from the Monahans Invitational Tournament. The Cowgirls struggled through three games before dropping their first match to San Angelo Central 9-15, 15-12, 6-15. Cristi Stephens, senior, totaled 13 service points. Midland Lee won 15-4, 15-3 as the Cowgirls could not get anything going their way.

The Cowgirls lost a close match to Lubbock Monterey Aug. 21 on home court. Winning the first game 15-8, they found themselves down 10 points early in the second game. A rally brought the Cowgirls within one point of the Loboettes before they lost 12-15 in the second game. Monterey won the final game 15-9.

Karen Cobb, junior, led with 12 service points.

Plains JV volleyballers won their third match of the season by defeating Wellman 15-5, 15-7. Corie Spencer, freshman, led with 12 service points.

Finding plenty of action in the Monahans JV Tourney, the Cowgirls lost their first match to Alpine 8-15, 4-15. Veronica Gonzales, freshman, led all servers with six points.

It took lots of hustling Friday night for the JV girls to beat Midland High 8-15, 15-5, 15-12. Miss Spencer and Sally Burrus paced the Cowgirls with 11 and 9 points, respectively.

Returning to Monahans Saturday, the JVs eliminated Big Spring 15-5, 15-0 and advanced to the consolation game. Miss Spencer served 20 of the Cowgirls 30 points as the hometown team lost to Odessa Permian 7-15, 15-12, 12-15. Terrie Galvan led with 10 service points. Misses Spencer and Burrus added to the offensive effort with eight service points each.

In their first home contest, the JV was defeated by Monterey JV 15-6, 15-4.

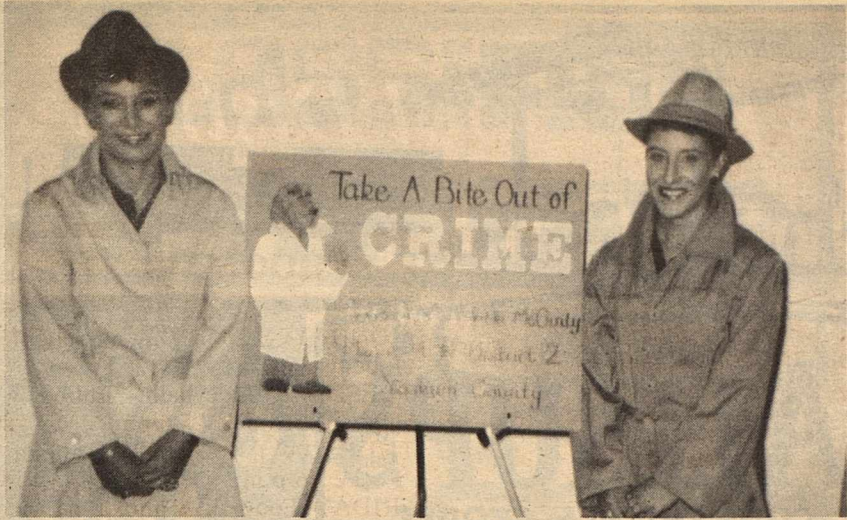

The little boy has two brothers and a sister.

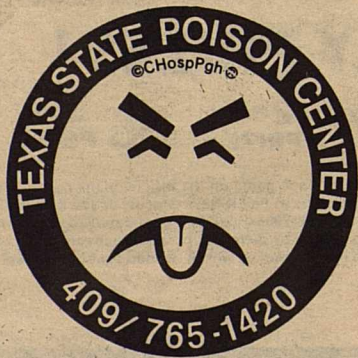

Commissioners' Court of Yoakum County met in special session Aug. 25 to make budget amendments and approve extra hire and miscellaneous bills.

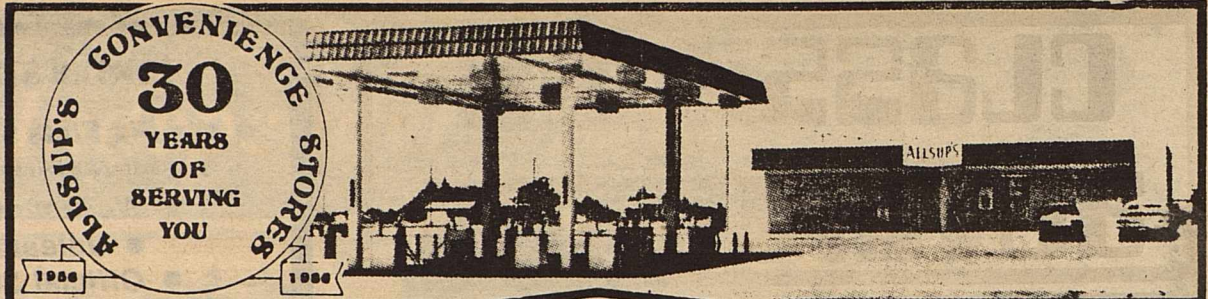
