## Ladd Winn Earns Gold Medal In 'World Tumbling Meet'

Ashlee, Ladd and Shyloh Winn have placed the name of Plains, Texas in the world limelight with their competition in the World Acrogymnastic Championships in Paris, France.
The young Winns have just recently returned from Paris where they represented the United States in the 1986 competition. Ladd won the Gold Medal in tumbling and the Silver Medal in trampoline.
Meeting 54 other USA athletes in New York Oct. 18, the Plains youngsters flew to Paris and then rode buses to the city of Moulin where the competition was held.

Ashlee placed fifth in tumbling and Shyloh was seventh in tumbl ing.
Representing 14 countries, there were 681 competitors. The U.S. Team captured the Tumbling Team Trophy

Survivors include his wife; two daughters, Beverly McMann of Seminole and Sharon Gillis of Azle;

The achievement climaxed an effort that began when Ashlee was two years old. Still very young, the road ahead could lead to even higher success for the young Winns.

Their coach, very proud, states they are children who work hard and give their all. "They love it or they wouldn't be where they are," she says. "Most important, behind them is a mother who gives them 110 percent, and a daddy who waits patiently, but grins as big as anyone when he hears his son has won."

## Yoakum County Voters Okay Hospital Bond Issue

Residents of Plains and Yoakum County trekked to the polls Tuesday and went along with the State as they cast ballots in the General Election.
On the homefront, voters okayed a bond proposal for Yoakum County Hospital, approving the measure 1189 to 893.

Candidates for county offices were unopposed on the ballot although a write-in campaign made a race of the County Commissioner's post in Precinct 4. Incumbent Johnnie L. Fitzgerald weathered the race to claim a 424 win over Larry Murphree who received 137 write-in votes.

## Cowboys In Play-Offs

The Plains Cowboys clinched a post-season spot in the Class A playoffs by defeating the Sundown Roughnecks last Friday night 26-14. Shane McMinn who was projected as a possible All-State at the beginning of the season by the Top-OTexas magazine staff has become the main force behind the Cowboy attack. The 160 pound junior threw for 201 yards, completing 12 of 19 passes, two TDs and no interceptions. McMinn was ranked third in Area I passing with an average of 76 yards per game going into the contest.

The Cowboys took their first possession of the game 76 yards for a score that was highlighted by a 10 yard touchdown strike from McMinn to wide-out Joe Rivera. Bryan Baldwin added the PAT
With just :21 seconds left to play in the first half, McMinn aired one out for Bryan Baldwin who went in from 77 yards out. Baldwin added the PAT again.
The Cowboys got another score in
the third stanza from fullback Billy Spears who went in from one yard out capping off a six play, 31 yard drive. The point after failed.

Spears would add another one yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter to give the Cowboys a $26-0$ lead before giving up 14 points to the Roughnecks.

The Cowboys defense has also come alive in district action. Led by Seniors Bryan Baldwin and Martin Barrientes, the Cowboys have not allowed any district team to gain more than 200 yards in total offense. The output by the defense is a credit to assistant Coach Brett Parr who has done a magnificent job in gearing up the defense.
Head Coach Larry McMinn will have his hands full this Friday night when his Cowboys will play host to the other undefeated team in the district, the Wilson Mustangs. The two teams will collide at Cowboy Stadium for the District Championship. A win for the Cowboys means an easier schedule in the playoffs.
