Persons attending will not be obligated to join but for those interested, a special registration fee of \$12 has been set for that date only.





#### Older Americans Need More Zinc

Many older Americans are not getting enough zinc, according to Mary D. Williams, County Extension Agent, Home Economics. The recommended daily allowance (RDA) for zinc is 15 milligrams. Yet several surveys of elderly persons show they are getting an average of 7-13 milligrams.

One possible reason for this lower zinc level is that several medical conditions reduce zinc absorption or increase zinc loss. Certain drugs, diuretics and laxatives, as well as iron supplements also affect absorption of the mineral.

Older adults should be sure to eat zinc-rich meats, such as ground beef, chicken liver, oysters and fish. Legumes and grains are the best source of zinc in plant foods. Fruits and vegetables are poor sources of zinc, although they provide many other important vitamins and minerals.

Some elders buy zinc supplements because they are widely promoted and advertised as necessary for good health. But in some people, zinc supplements can produce sideeffects such as gastrointestinal ir-

If you take a zinc supplement, it should be at or near the RDA of 15 milligram. For long-term prevention of zinc deficiency, however, you will be better off improving your diet to include zinc-rich foods.



#### From The Superintendent's Desk

DEAN ANDREW



Since there has been much in the news lately concerning the legislature's search for funds to finance our state budget, I have been asked many questions about budget balanced schools. This week I would like to briefly answer some of those questions.

There are 1096 school districts in Texas and each district has an assessed value based on property and mineral wealth as assigned to the district by a state certified tax appraiser. There is a county appraisal office in each of the 254 counties in Texas and Johnnie Brown is the Chief Appraiser for Yoakum County Appraisal District. Mr. Brown will certify a tax value to the State Property Tax Board and to Plains I.S.D.

A school district that has a value of at least \$500,000.00 per A.D.A. (Average Daily Attendance) is considered to be budget balanced since \$500,000.00 is the state average assessed value per student. Plains I.S.D. had an assessed value of \$846,669,590.00 in 1986, or a wealth value of \$1,734,979.00 per A.D.A. You can easily see that we will be considered a budget balanced school district for a long time. It is the opinion of the mineral appraisers for our district that we will lose 30 percent of our mineral value, and minerals make up 95 percent of our assessed value.

What does it really mean to be a budget balanced school? A budget balanced school must abide by all state rules and regulations as do all schools in this State, however there are no funds available for the operation of budget balanced schools except those funds that are statutorily mandated by the legislature to all schools. Plains I.S.D.'s budget this year is \$3,603,147.00 and we received \$115,000.00 from the state. We are required to provide transportation services, teacher salaries based on a state schedule, career ladder funds, meet classroom size requirements, teacher pupil ratios and also provide special education, bi-lingual education, and vocational education programs according to state regulations and requirements. All of these programs are funded by the state for those school districts that are not budget balanced (foundation schools).

It is important to know that foundation schools that do receive state operational monies for the programs mentioned above are still having to raise taxes to pay for a large portion of the programs mandated by the state legislature.

Of the 1096 school districts in Texas, 81 are budget balanced districts with a total of 58,994 students. If the state were to take monies from the budget balanced schools and distribute it to all other schools, there would not be enough money to help any school. To share the monies of those districts that are presently budget balanced is no solution.

As you see this is a complex situation which needs extensive study and consideration. We trust that the members of our Senate and House of Representatives together with the people of our state can resolve the problem of state finances in a way that will benefit all students and hinder none. We will work to that end.

#### School Tax Office To Be Closed


Plains Independent School District Tax & Business Office will be closed Dec. 22 through Jan. 1, 1987, for the Christmas and New Year's holidays.


