Plans Being Made For County Peanut Tour On September 8th

Plans are being developed for the first annual Eastland County Peanut Tour scheduled for September 8, according to County Agricultural Agent J. M. Cooper who is planning the affair.

All demonstration farms to be visited during the all day affair will be in the Gorman area, he said. It will be to farms that have planted the new variety—Starr, named after W. B. Starr, veteran peanut grower of the Scranton Community in the western part of Eastland County.

Those participating will see the new peanuts growing by the side of other varieties including the Argentina, the Spantex, Dixie Spanish, Haskins No. 1, and the regular Spanish, Cooper said.

The Starr variety was developed

at the Stephenville Agricultural Experiment Station after twelve years of research by B. C. Langley, Stephenville. He has accepted an invitation to be on the tour.

The tour will start from the Brown Jug Cafe in Gorman at 9 o'clock on the above date. Farms to be visited include Albert Taylor, D. B. Warren, Royal Hampton, Odis Rodgers, Claud Fuller, J. L. Butler, Junior Jackson, Bill Andry, Mitchell Campbell, Glen Justice and Gailon Warren.

The group will eat lunch in Gorman.

The peanut farmers of Eastland County as well as the business and professional men of Gorman are invited to participate on the tour.

PLEASANT HILL FARMER HAS HIGH REGARD FOR COWPEAS

Ladonia Man Is Named Director Of FHA In Texas

Lester J. Cappelman of Ladonia, has been appointed state director for the Farmers Home Administration in Texas. His headquarters are in Dallas. He assumed his duties July 18.

Mr. Cappelman has returned to the position he held with the agency for approximately eight years prior to April in 1954. Since that time he has been managing his farm near Ladonia producing livestock, cotton, and alfalfa.

Born in Oklahoma in 1902 when it was known as Indian Territory, Mr. Cappelman attended public schools at Honey Grove, Texas, and the Texas A&M College where he majored in agronomy and animal husbandry.

From 1924 to 1934 he farmed in Fannin County.

From 1934 forward, including his eight years as Farmers Home Administration State Director, Mr. Cappelman worked in the field of supervised credit and related services for family-type farmers. He joined the Resettlement Administration at Amarillo after a year with the Federal Emergency Relief Administration at Sherman, Texas. From Amarillo, his work took him to Dallas in 1936 where he served first as loan officer in Resettlement Administration and later as Assistant Regional Director for that agency's successor, the Farm Security Administration.

In 1941 he transferred to Surplus Marketing Administration as Regional Director, then was in similar positions with Agricultural Marketing, Food Distribution, and War Food Administration, all at Dallas. He became

"These Alabama cowpeas are a real find and I believe that they have a definite place as a summer crop, both for soil building as well as hay", Park Plambeck, Sr., Pleasant Hill farmer, told County Agent J. M. Cooper recently. Cooper gave him and his sons a start of the variety of cowpeas last year.

The small patch is being grown near the house, by Victor Plambeck, 4-H club boy. He has another three acre field growing east of the house. The peas are a project of the club boy it was said.

Plambeck was given a gallon of the peas in 1960 and from these the Pleasant Hill Club boy harvested and saved about 50 pounds of the seed last year.

The County Agent has this variety of peas being grown on the H. R. Casey farm in the Mangum community several years ago and was impressed by their yield and drought resistant qualities. He obtained some of them and has been distributing them over the county to various farmers for trial purposes for the past three or four years.

Oscar Schaefer, Cook Community, is a firm believer in the variety and has grown them for the past three years.

Other farmers growing them this year include Jeff D. Graham another Pleasant Hill farmer, Frank Park, Carbon, and Earnest Warren, New Hope Community.

These are late cowpeas. They should be planted in June. They will begin to bloom in September and turn to peas in October young Plambeck said.

The county agent believes that cowpeas definitely have a place among the summer crops of the county. He agrees with the Plambecks that this variety is more drought resistant than any variety they have seen.

Victor and Park, Jr., have a sister, Carolyn, who has been active in 4-H Club work.

License Plates For Farm Trailer Placed On Sale

AUSTIN — New license plates for farm trailers not used for hire are now available, according to Bob A. Lilly, Texas Farm Bureau legislative director.

Lilly said the Department of Public Safety has advised him that the \$5.00 license tags are now in county tax collectors' offices across the state. Owners of farm trailers of between 4,000 and 10,000 pounds gross weight must have these tags displayed on their trailers in accordance with a new law passed during the regular session of the 57th Legislature. The law also provides a 30-m.p.h. speed limit, but exempts trailers up to 10,000 pounds gross from requirements.

The DPS indicated that it will give trailer owners a "reasonable" period of time to secure the tags before strict enforcement begins, Lilly said. The law became effective with the Governor's signing of House Bill 1082, the farm trailer bill, on May 29, but the new tags were not available until just recently.

Lilly said that the Texas Farm Bureau has been attempting to secure passage of a farm trailer law for several years. He explained that the \$5.00 license cost was a compromise to forestall a veto of the bill.

The TFB legislative director said that the new law was necessary to permit farmers to continue using their trailers to haul farm products. The DPS had warned that it was planning to begin strict enforcement of trailer licensing laws if a special farm trailer law were not enacted this year. Before the new law was passed, farmers were required by law to obtain commercial licenses for trailers over 4,000 pounds gross weight even though they normally use their trailers for only a few weeks each year.

Farmers who fail to obtain tags will be subject to a fine and also must immediately register their trailer as a commercial trailer and obtain a commercial license plate. A commercial license for a 10,000 pound trailer would cost \$35.00.

Roberts Well Has Oil Flow In Test

Another substantial oil producer was in prospect for the Nimrod area, 10 miles south of Cisco, Saturday after the W. W. Franklin et al No. 1 Annie Roberts began flowing at the rate of four barrels per hour in completion tests, according to reports here.

Bottomed at 2,904 feet, oil was flowing with no water from a 12-foot section of Caddo Lime — 2,892 — 2,904. The plug was drilled Friday and the well was still flowing Saturday morning.

The Roberts well is on a 160-acre lease that is part of a 900-acre block held by Mr. Franklin with G. A. Bloomquist and Bill Hoffmann, all well known oil operators in this section.

The well is one location southwest of the W. W. Franklin et al No. 1 Olga Taylor, which was drilled recently as a dry hole. This test was abandoned as dry at 2,948 feet. The location was 330 feet from the north and 900 feet from the west lines of the southwest quarter of Section 94, Block 3, H&TC Survey.

The Roberts well, located 2,310 feet from the south and 330 feet

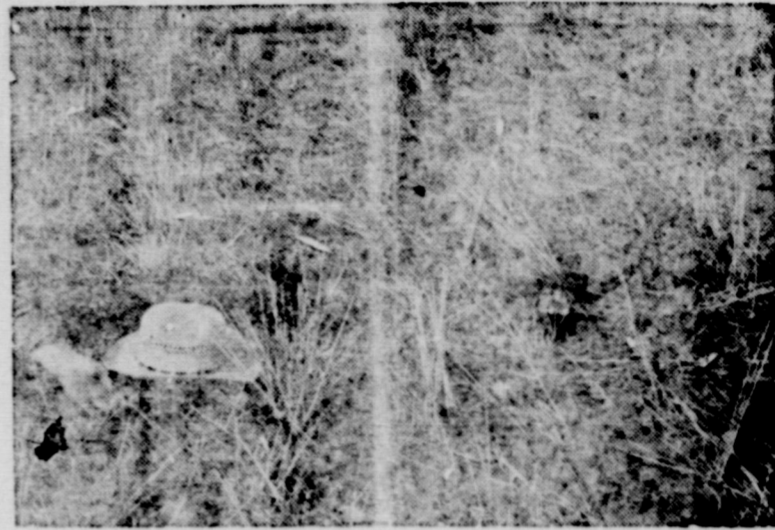

from the west lines of Section 79, Block 3, H&TC Survey, is 660 feet southwest of the Franklin discovery well in the Nimrod area pool — the Schaefer Estate No. 1. The Schaefer well was drilled about a year ago and is still flowing, Mr. Franklin reported.

Mr. Franklin said his group has no immediate plans for the future drilling in their block at Nimrod.
