Plans Made For Deer And Dove Hunting By State Commission

AUSTIN — Texas hunters will be able to kill three deer, the third antlerless deer to be known as bonus deer, in at least 14 Texas counties, in the upcoming season starting November 16. These are counties under regulatory authority where there is an overpopulation of deer, and efforts will be made to bring sex ratio into balance by special permit for a third deer.

These counties include Bandera, Crockett, Edwards, Llano, Mason, Medina and Sutton counties in the Edwards Plateau regulatory district; Comal, Dimmitt and Zavala counties in the South Texas regulatory district; Freestone, Grimes and Robertson counties in the Trinity-Brazos regulatory district; and Bosque county in the Possum Kingdom district.

The bonus deer tag must be obtained from a landowner, where the area has been designated as having surplus deer. The harvest of the doe deer will be permitted in most of the other counties under regulatory authority, and these permits will be available from the landowner after census counts have been made. It is possible that bonus deer may be available in several other counties where the regulatory authority takes effect after August 28. The bonus deer allowance will be the first in a quarter of a century, by which it has been legal to kill three deer in Texas. It is interesting to note, according to H. D. Dodgen, executive secretary of the Game and Fish Commission, that bonus deer will be permitted in Freestone, Grimes and Robertson counties, which a few years ago had been completely shot out of deer. They were restocked under a management program which has resulted in the comeback.

The Commission also voted authority to the executive secretary of the Commission to set the upcoming waterfowl season within the bracket approved by the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, which will be announced in mid August.

The mourning dove season will open in the North Zone September 1 and continue for 60 days. In the South Zone, it will open October 7 and continue 60 days, except in those counties where white-winged dove hunting will be permitted September 8, 9 and 10. It will be legal to hunt mourning doves during this special whitewing season, but these three days will be charged off the length of the regular season in those counties.

The Commission also voted to permit the use of dogs in taking deer in Hardin, Jasper, Liberty, Orange, Polk and Tyler counties. Jefferson and Montgomery counties in the South Texas regulatory area were not included in the dog hunting permit.

The Commission agreed to withhold setting the quail season and bag limits pending further investigation of this year's crop of birds. This season will be set at the regular fall meeting, October 6.

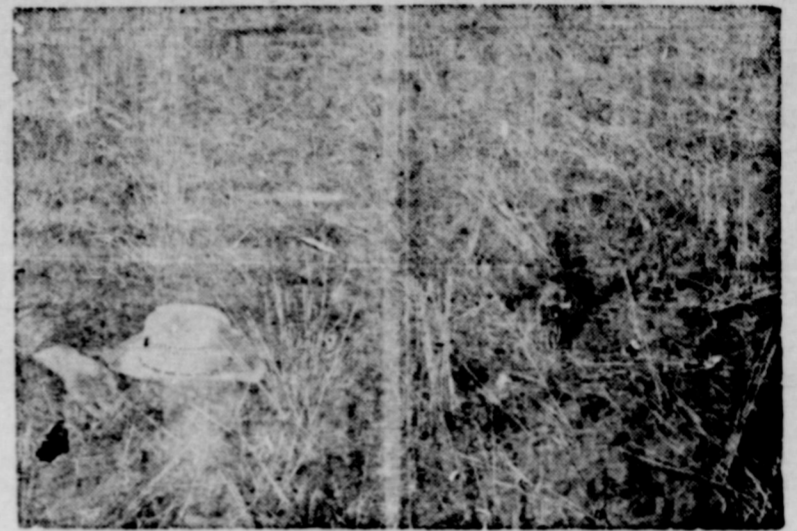

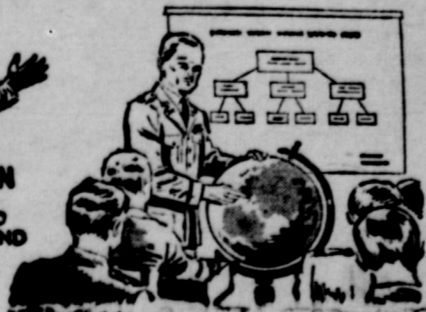
