Rising Star Man Begins Second 100 Years With Birthday On August 15th

Tuesday, August 15, William J. Kornegay achieved what comparatively few members of the human race have been able to do. He rounded out a full century of life and began his second century with very good prospects, mentally and physically, that he will add appreciably to his record of longevity.

The event was celebrated Sunday, Aug. 13, with a family birthday party at the home of his son, J. J. Kornegay, with whom the centegenarian makes his home about five miles northwest of Rising Star.

Seventy-five people, all but a few of them relatives of Mr. Kornegay, attended the party, enjoyed a big dinner and watched the honoree deal with the pleasant formalities of a large birth-






