O. C. Warden of Ranger, a former football coach there, was employed as a new supervisor for county schools. He holds a bachelor's degree from McMurry College and a master's degree from Hardin-Simmons University. He will work with the Eastland and Ranger schools.

Mr. Warden will take the place of Jimmie Hughes, who resigned recently to accept a position as head football coach at Eastland. Mr. Warden will begin work Sept. 1.

STOCKER AND FEEDER SHOW IS PLANNED ON OCTOBER 14

The Cisco Livestock Show Association will sponsor a stocker and feeder livestock show on October 14 at the Cisco Livestock Show Barn one-half mile north of the city, it was reported today. The show will consist of feeder lambs, swine and steers, which are to be judged on stocker and feeder basis and will be placed according to grade, the announcement said.

Special emphasis will be placed on grooming the animal and the ability of the boy to show the animal properly. The show will

be open to Cisco FFA boys only.

In announcing the event, Charles McDaniel, a vocational agriculture teacher at Cisco High School, said: "A large number of good quality animals are expected, with lots of enthusiasm being shown by the FFA boys." He asked local citizens to encourage the boys "... so that we might have some more state champions the coming year." The Cisco FFA meat judging team won the state championship this year.

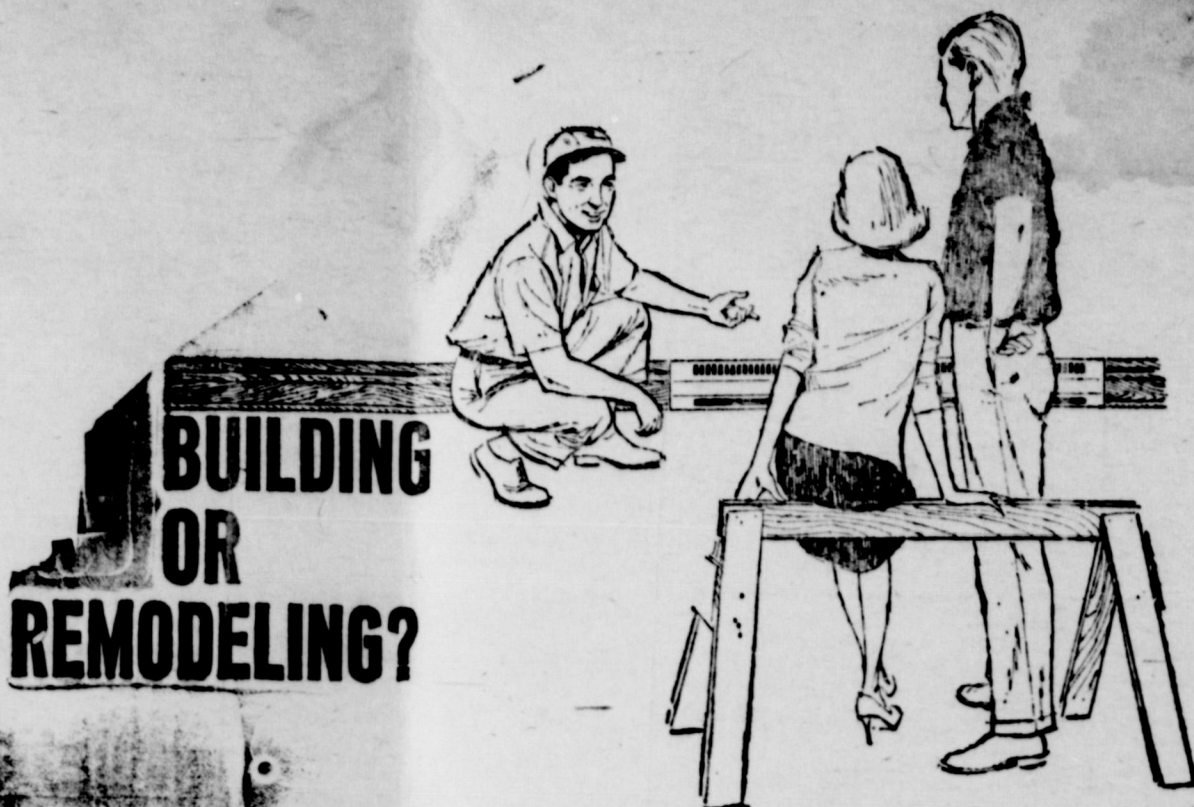

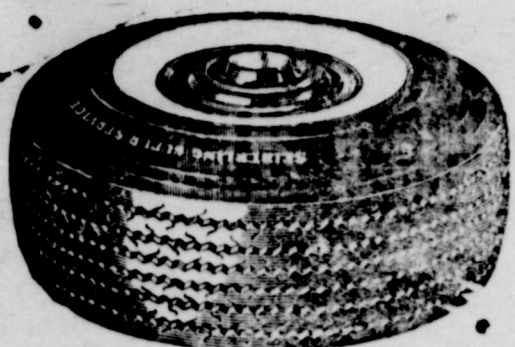
