

Pallbearers were Jim Barnett, Jim Barron, Gilbert Pierce, Claude Addison, William Worsham and John Camp.



Kitchen Korner

Potatoes may be prepared many ways and Opal Smith proves they can be more than a vegetable. She shares recipes that turn the ordinary potato into a delicious chocolate cake or the sweet potato into a yummy pie.

A resident of Plains 39 years, Mrs. Smith was born and grew up in Stamford. She married O.D. Smith in Brownfield in 1934. Opal and O.D. enjoyed many years of association with Plains ISD. O.D., who also worked for the county, died in 1973.

Opal's hobbies are crocheting and reading. She also loves music.

OLD FASHIONED SWEET POTATO PIE

2 c cooked, mashed sweet potatoes

1 c firmly packed brown sugar

½ c butter or margarine, softened

2 eggs, separated

½ t ground ginger

1/2 t ground cinnamon

½ t ground nutmeg

1/4 t salt

1/2 c evaporated milk

1/4 c sugar

1 unbaked 10" pastry shell Whipped topping (optional)

Combine sweet potatoes, brown sugar, butter, egg yolks, spices and salt in a large mixing bowl; beat until light and fluffy. Add evaporated milk; mix just until combined.

Beat egg whites until foamy; gradually add sugar, beating until Fold into potato mixture. Pour filling into pastry shell. Bake at 400° for 10 minutes; reduce heat to 350° and bake an additional 45 to 50 minutes or until set. Cool. Top with whipped topping, if desired.

Yield: one 10" pie.

MILLIONAIRE PIE 2 c sifted powdered sugar 1 stk margarine, softened 2 lg eggs 1/8 t salt 1/4 t vanilla 2 baked 9" pie crusts

1 c heavy cream

1/2 c sifted powdered sugar 1 c crushed pineapple, well drained

½ c chopped nuts (pecans)

Cream together powdered sugar and margarine with electric mixer. Add eggs, salt and vanilla. Beat until light and fluffy. Spread mixture into baked pie crusts; chill.

Whip cream until stiff. Blend in powdered sugar. Fold in pineapple and pecans. Spread this mixture on top of base mixture and chill thoroughly.

NOTE: Just like Furr's pie recipe.

POTATO CAKE

2 c sugar

²/₃ c shortening

1 c hot mashed potatoes

4 eggs

1 c sweet milk

3 heaping T cocoa

2 t baking powder

3 c sifted flour (or more)

1 t cinnamon

1 t nutmeg

1/2 t salt (omit if butter is used)

1 c walnuts or more (floured)

1 c raisins, chopped and floured

1 t vanilla

Gradually beat sugar into shortening until fluffy. Add hot potatoes. Add sifted dry ingredients and milk alternately. Add eggs one at a time, beating after each addi-

Stir in walnuts, raisins and vanilla. Bake layers 40 or 45 mins at 350°. Frost with favorite chocolate frosting. (You can bake this in a 10" tube pan at 325°)

ESTRA MOIST BANANA NUT BREAD 2 c sugar, less 2 T 3/4 c butter 3 eggs

6 T buttermilk 11/2 c mashed bananas 21/4 c flour 11/2 t soda

1/2 t salt 11/2 t vanilla

1 c chopped pecans

Cream butter and sugar. Add slightly beaten eggs. Add soda dissolved in buttermilk, then bananas, dry ingredients and nuts. Bake at 325° for 1 hr and 15 mins. in a greased loaf pan.



The Wranglers lost the third place game to Brownfield 35 to 28. Renee McElroy was high point with 12 points. Daphne Lowe followed with 10 points.







Educational programs conducted by the Extension Service are open to all persons, regardless of socioeconomic level, race, color, sex, religion, handicap or national origin.




Filmtime


Filmtime youngsters enjoyed a Christmas party Wednesday. Twenty-six boys and girls attended despite bad weather and cases of chicken pox in the community.




