School Board Meets Monday

School board members in their regular meeting Monday evening adopted a resolution to execute full and final releases to finalize settlement of the school district's claims against U.S. Gypsum and W.R. Grace in settlement of the asbestos law suit.

Administrators reported on various areas of the 1986-87 Annual Performance Report. Larry Devitt presented information concerning the Resource Center and curriculum; Robert Parks gave information concerning athletics and UIL; John Nance, elementary curriculum; Arlon Alexander, student achievement; Jimmy Conner, athletics, UIL literary and discipline management; and Dean Andrews, information concerning finance, personnel, food service, maintenance and transportation.

The report was accepted as presented.

In other action, the board opened and considered the bids for the purchase of a 1988 Chevrolet Caprice. Modern Chevrolet of Lubbock submitted the accepted bid of \$13,228. No bids were received on the parking lot paving, therefore no action was taken.

November bills were approved for payment. Superintendent Andrews gave financial reports for general operations, cafeteria, tax and transportation areas.

From The Superintendent's Desk



1986-87 Overview - Plains Independent School District

The Plains Independent School District encompasses 599 square miles in Yoakum County. The district is fully accredited by the Texas Education Agency. A quality education is provided for students in kindergarten through twelfth grade. Serving an approximate population of 1450 residents, the district strives to provide a variety of opportunities and involvement for the entire community. Adult, vocational, and special education programs are offered to those who have various needs.

Plains Independent School District is governed by a seven-member Board of Trustees who are elected at-large with either two or three members being elected annually. Regular board meetings are held on the second Monday of each month in the administration building board room. The public is invited and encouraged to attend.

FACILITY ADEQUACY

Plains has for the money invested, one of the best and most serviceable school plants in the area which has a value in excess of \$8,000,000.00.

Our high school building was originally constructed in 1949, at a cost of \$254,550.00. Additions to this building, including the auditorium and boys gymnasium were completed in 1959 at a cost of \$990,000.00. Remodeling and improvements continued throughout the following years culminating in 1976 with a \$1,150,000.00 building project which included our fine Resource Center, Olympic size swimming pool, and spacious girls gym-

Our junior high building was built in 1946. Renovations completed in 1985 at a cost of \$813,000.00 have made it one of the most functional junior high schools in the State. Renovations included computer and science laboratories.

Our elementary school was completed in 1963 at a cost of \$242,488.00. Additions, including the school cafeteria, were completed in 1957 and other remodeling and renovations took place in 1969, 1980, and 1987.

Our vocational and bus repair shops were constructed in 1970 at a cost of \$158,402.00, and our fine bus barn was completed in 1977 with further additions exceeding \$45,000.00 completed in 1981.

Our band hall, a large addition to the existing field house, and a V.E.H. classroom were completed in 1982 at a cost of \$642,000.00.

Our football stadium will seat 1800 and is one of the finest in our area. The bleachers and press box were completely renovated in 1980. The athletic football field and track has a value in excess of \$250,000.00. A new polyurethane track was installed in 1987 at a cost of \$159,000.00.

Our radio station KPLN FM broadcasts on 90.3 and has expanded to include KPLN TV on Channel 3. Regularly scheduled programming is part of the normal school day throughout the year with special programs being broadcast during the summer.

Our gymnasium, swimming pool, and weight room are opened during the summer for use by the entire community.

We have six lighted tennis courts with wind screens to insure recreational activities for all interested persons. These six courts are valued at \$250,000.00.

We have three gymnasiums with a seating capacity of 1,600 in the largest,
