## 'Tumbling Winns' Winners In World Age Group Games

World Age Group Games, held in Lubbock, this past week, came to a close on a successful note for the three young Winns of Plains.
Saturday, May 21, Ladd won his second World Championship title in Power Tumbling against 27 other eleven and twelve-year-olds from all over the world. After preliminaries Friday, he stood second, only onetenth of a point behind fellow team mate, Matt Bohler of Tulia.

Determined to win, Ladd said 'If I'll just clean up my passes I know I can win." Once again he brought home the gold. Also, he and his partner, Russ Alexander of Levelland, placed fourth in synchronized trampoline.
Eight-year-old Shyloh placed sixth in the ten-year-olds and under division of power tumbling against 230 other competitors. Throwing a pass with the highest difficulty in the finals, she was the only eight-year-old to finish in the top six.
Ashlee, 13 years old, competed against 79 competitors and finished eighth after a controversial
preliminary pass which eliminated her from finals.
Because the United States hosted the World Meet, ATTA, the U.S.A governing body of power tumbling and trampoline will not hold a Na tional Meet. Therefore, competitors will be ranked nationally from the results of the World Meet. Ladd will automatically be ranked National Champ. Because of the different age rule, Shyloh will possibly be ranked eight and under division Champ. Ashlee is ranked fourth in Nationals for trampoline competition.
Besides the competition, a good time was had by all competitors with the exchanging of everything from pins to articles of clothing. Shyloh exchanged her USA team warm-ups with a little girl from Cleon, France.
A banquet and dance climaxed the big event. The next World Meet will be held in 1990 in Hanover or Hambur, Germany.
The Winns will take a short break and then resume training for an A.A.U. (Amateur Athletic Union) National Meet in Casper, Wyo scheduled for late July.
