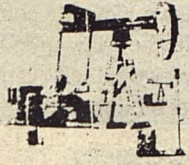

Cowgirls Capture Region 1-A To Advance To State Contest

Plains traveled to Hale Center Friday night to take on the Happy Cowboys in their bi-district round of Class 1A State Playoffs.

The Plains Cowboys opened the scoring on a 21 yard pass from Monte Pierce to Jeff Ashburn in their first possession of the game. Anthony Asebedo added the extra point.

Happy tied the game on a 65 yard run by Jesse Sosa. Their PAT was good.

Plains broke the tie with 4 minutes left in the second quarter. Alex Barrientes had recovered a fumble on Happy's 35 yard line. After two good carries of 14

yards each by Kyle Stephens, Pierce tossed a one yard pass to Ashburn for the TD. Asebedo's kick was again good and the score was 14-7.

Happy was able to score again with two seconds left in the half when Marty Middleton threw a 12 yard pass to Manuel Fernandez.

Happy's extra point kick was blocked by Bill Beavers. Asebedo picked up the ball and handed it off to Barrientes who ran it 90 yards for a two point gain.

Instead of a 14-14 tie, Plains went in at halftime ahead 16-13.

Happy didn't have any better luck with the second half kick off. It was fumbled by Happy's Guy Cole on the 10 yard line and recovered by Plains' Lebert Powell.

Three plays later, Barrientes carried the ball into the end zone on a five yard run. Asebedo's kick was good and the score was Plains 23, Happy 13.

The remainder of the game was a scoreless battle between the two Cowboy teams.

Stephens rushed 13 times for 54 yards; Pierce, 13 times for 23; and Barrientes 9 times for 34 yards.

Pierce threw 16 times with 9 complete for 136 yards.

Ashburn caught five passes for 36 yards, Shawn Booth caught 1 for 45 yards, Barrientes had 1 for 15 yards and John Harris, 1 for 15.

The Cowboys advanced to Area Playoffs against White Deer. The game is set Friday night in Plainview.

Cowboys To Play White Deer In Area Playoffs Friday

The Cowgirls earned a trip to Austin to compete in the 23rd Annual State Volleyball Tournament this weekend by capturing the Region I-A championship.

They were paired against Round Top-Carmine in a 10:15 a.m. match Friday, Nov. 18. Windthorst and Kennard squared off at 9 a.m. The winners advanced to the Class A Championship match scheduled for 10 a.m. Saturday, Nov. 19.

They advanced to the State Finals by eliminating Fort Hancock and Dell City in regional competition held at the Howard County College Coliseum in Big Spring last Saturday.

The Cowgirls downed the Dell City Cougars 15-6, 15-10 in the finals. After reaching a 5-5 tie in the first game, the Cowgirls put some quick points on the scoreboard for a 15-6 one game advantage.

They held a 13-3 lead in the final game of the match but the Cowgirls let up and the Cougars staged a late comeback with seven straight points.

Lydia Jimenez then killed the ball to force side out. The Cowgirls reached game point with Heather McGill's kill and notched the victory on their next rotation when Melissa Welch dinked the ball on the Cougar defense.

Cowgirl statistics include Marsha Farnham, 7 kills, 4 blocks, 9 service points; McGill, 6 kills, 4 service points; Lydia Jimenez, 4 kills, 2 blocks, 1 ace; Lynda Jimenez, 3 kills, 8 service points, 2 aces; Melissa Green, 2 kills, 6 service

points, 1 ace; Welch, 1 kill, 2 service points.

In semi-final action, the Cowgirls dropped a lengthy first game to the Fort Hancock Mustangs after jumping to a six point lead with their first server. The game turned around when Fort Hancock began capitalizing on Cowgirl mistakes. The Mustangs held their first lead at 8-7 and after lots of volleyball and a 14-14 tie, reached game point at 15-14. The Cowgirls held the Mustangs at game point three times and reached their own game point at 17-16. A missed serve forced a side out and the Mustangs were back in the game at 17-17. The Cowgirls held the Mustangs at game point three more rotations until Fort Hancock took game one with an out of bounds Cowgirl hit and a Fort Hancock kill.

The Cowgirls once again jumped to an early 5-0 lead in the second game and never gave it up with the Mustangs' closest margin at 10-7. They gave up one more point and tied the match at one game each with a 15-8 win.

Maintaining their momentum through the final game of the match, the Cowgirls allowed the Mustang offense only four points while scoring 15 points to claim the match.

County Commissioners Meet, Open Bids For Equipment

Commissioners Court met in regular session Nov. 14 at which time bids were opened on two half-ton trucks for Precinct 4. The bids were granted Brunken Chevrolet at a low bid of \$15,223.44 each.

Mustang Country Chevrolet was awarded the bid for two pickups for Precinct 2. The bid was \$19,181.89 after trade-ins for a 1989 Chevrolet 3/4 ton pickup and one 1988 Chevrolet half-ton pickup.

Bids on a pneumatic tired roller for Precinct 2 were opened and the bid went to Bee Equipment Co. at a cost of \$25,000 after trade-in.

The only bid on a wheel loader for

Precinct 2 was from West Texas Equipment Co., which was accepted at \$27,000.

Court agreed to release an easement to William Worsham, due to the fact that it was no longer needed.

Extra hire and disbursements were read and approved. The budget was amended to transfer \$70,000 from General unbudgeted receipts to the hospital fund.

Court agreed to advertise for bids for a new copy machine for the County Agent's office and to re-advertise to purchase two 6-yard dump beds for Precinct 4. Bids should be received by Dec. 5.

Returns of the General Election were canvassed and approved.

Audit Approved By School Board

Plains School Board met Monday, Nov. 14 for a regularly scheduled meeting.

Following the reading of the minutes of the last meeting, an audit report was given by Kerry Musick. The board approved the report as presented.

October bills were approved for payment and a business manager's report was given by Wanda Ashburn, concerning the general operating, cafeteria and tax areas.

Larry Devitt presented a transportation cost report, a review of various projects and a comparison of utility costs from January 1985 through October 1988.
