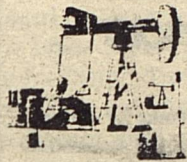

Burial was under direction of Singleton Funeral Home of Denver City.

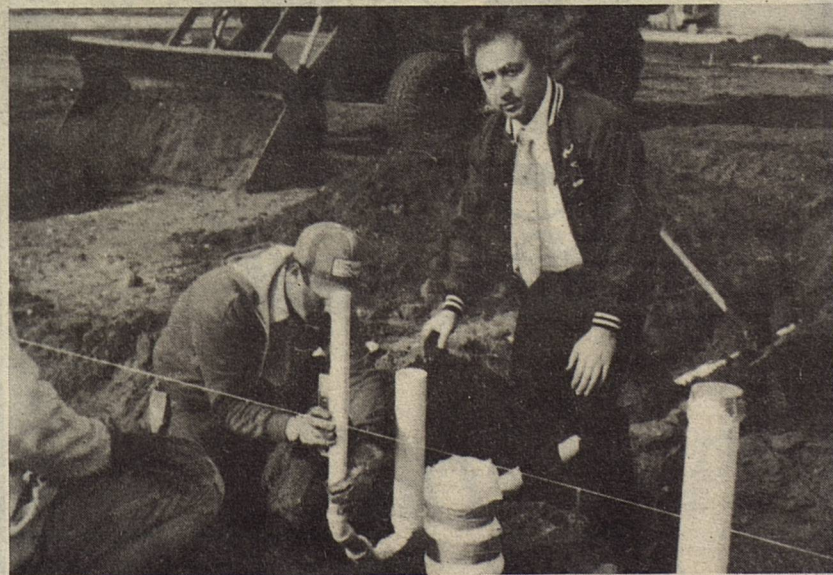
Mr. Webber died Thursday at 9 a.m. at his home after a lengthy illness. He had been under a doctor's care.

Mr. Smith died at 10:35 p.m. Thursday in Lubbock's Methodist Hospital after a year-long bout with cancer.

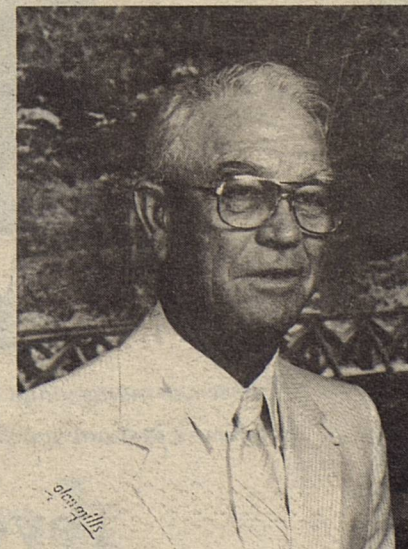

½ teaspoon salt
Juice and grated rind of 1 lemon
½ cup brandy
8 eggs, well beaten
Milk, only as needed
Brandy, for flaming
Hard Sauce

Dredge suet with a little flour. Combine with bread crumbs, remaining flour, raisins, currants, sugar, candied fruit peels, nutmeg, cinnamon, mace, almonds and salt. Toss together well until thoroughly mixed.

Mix lemon juice and rind with brandy and eggs. Stir into dry ingredients and set aside in a cool place for 4 or 5 hours. Stir in just enough milk (about ¼ cup) to make a stiff paste. Do not make pudding too wet or it will be heavy.

Turn into a well-buttered gallon-size pudding mold, or several smaller ones, dividing it any way you wish. Cover and place on rack in kettle. Add boiling water to come two thirds of the way up the side of the mold. Cover kettle and steam pudding for about 8 hours, or until firm. (Smaller puddings will take about 3 to 4 hours to steam, depending on size.) Add boiling water if necessary to maintain the level. Uncover to let steam escape before unmolding. If you want to store the pudding, uncover to let steam escape, re-cover and store in refrigerator. (It will keep for months. Steam for about 2 hours before serving.) Set aflame with warmed brandy and serve with sauce.

Makes about 24 servings.

HARD SAUCE

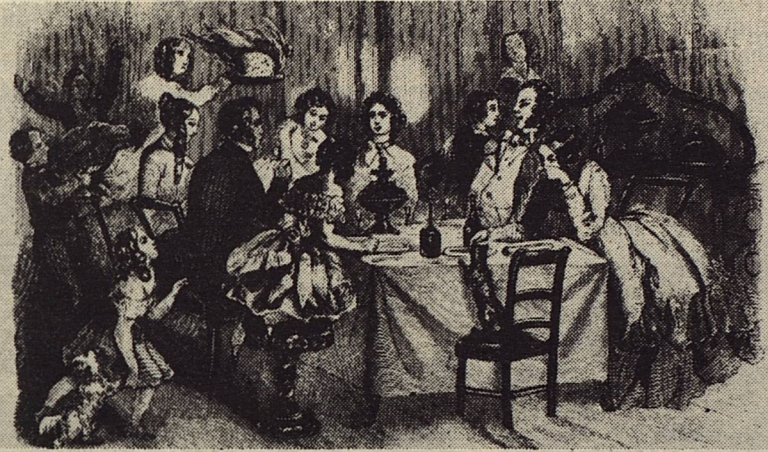
1 cup (½ pound) unsalted butter
1¼ cups confectioners' sugar
Rum or brandy, as needed
Confectioners' sugar and nutmeg, for sprinkling (optional)

Cream butter with sugar, adding a little extra sugar if needed to make a stiff paste. Gradually beat in as much rum or brandy as the mixture can absorb while still remaining stiff. Place in glass or china serving dish or jar. Cover and store in the refrigerator. Sprinkle with sugar and nutmeg before serving.

Makes about 2 cups.

VICTORIAN CHRISTMAS PUDDING

1 pound beef suet, shredded
2 cups sifted flour
4½ cups bread crumbs
1 pound seedless black raisins
1 pound currants
1 pound sugar
2 cups mixed diced candied citron, orange and lemon peel
1 teaspoon grated nutmeg
2 teaspoons cinnamon
1 teaspoon mace
¼ cup blanched and slivered almonds

From The Superintendent's Desk

Dean Andrews



I received the following article from the Texas Education Agency recently and thought it might be of interest. We feel that Drivers Ed. is an important part of our curriculum.

"Mom, Dad can I borrow the car?" is a familiar refrain heard across the state every day.

To ensure that the state's drivers are properly trained before hitting the streets, the Texas Education Agency, in cooperation with the Department of Public Safety, oversees driver education and traffic safety courses in the state's public schools.

A student in Texas may enroll in driver education and traffic safety courses at age 14 if he or she will turn 15 before the classroom phase ends. Upon successful completion of the course, a student is eligible to apply to the DPS for an instructional permit.

The driver education course consists of two phases, classroom and in-car instruction. In the classroom phase, students receive 56 hours of instruction in courses for state credit and 32 hours of instruction in non-credit courses. The in-car phase consists of seven hours of actual behind-the-wheel instruction and seven hours of observation.

Students who successfully complete an approved driver education program may apply for a regular driver's license at age 16.

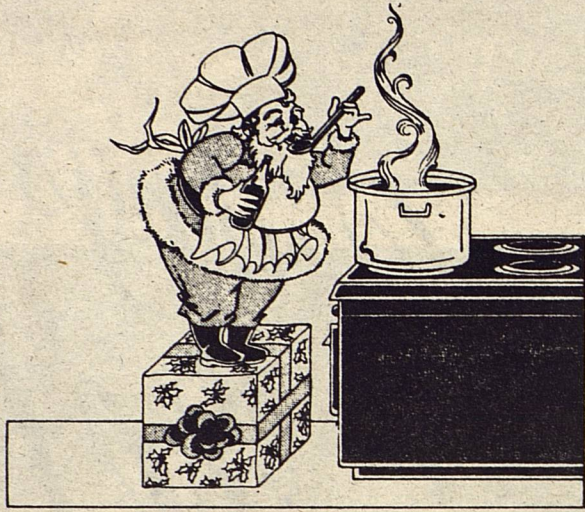

Christmas Delights



FROZEN PUMPKIN PIE

1 cup canned pumpkin
 2/3 cup light corn syrup
 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
 1/4 tsp. nutmeg
 1/4 tsp. ginger
 1/2 cup walnuts, coarsely chopped
 3 1/2 cups thawed Cool Whip
 1-9" prepared graham cracker crumb crust

Combine pumpkin, syrup, spices and nuts. Fold in whipped topping. Spoon into crust. Freeze until firm, about 4 hours. Before serving, let stand 15 minutes at room temperature.

(I like to top it with extra whipped topping before serving.)

SPICE BARS

1/4 cup oil
 1 cup sugar
 1/4 cup honey
 2 cups flour, sifted
 1 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
 1 tsp. soda
 1/2 tsp. salt
 1 egg, well beaten
 1 cup chopped nuts

Mix oil, honey and sugar. Add flour, cinnamon, soda, and salt. Mix well. Add egg and nuts. Mix. Press into a 10 x 15 jelly roll pan. Bake in 350 degree

oven 20 minutes. Cover with glaze and cut into squares while warm.

GLAZE:

1 cup powdered sugar
 1 tsp. vanilla
 1 tbs. water
 2 tbs. oleo, melted

Mix all ingredients until smooth.

CHOCOLATE COVERED CHERRIES

16 oz. jar plus 10 oz. jar marashino cherries with stems, undrained
 3 tbs. butter or margarine, softened
 3 tbs. light corn syrup
 1/4 tsp. salt
 2 cups sifted powdered sugar
 12 oz. pkg. semi-sweet chocolate morsels
 1 tbs. shortening

Drain 50 cherries; pat dry on paper towels, and set aside. Reserve remaining cherries for other uses.

Combine butter, syrup and salt in mixing bowl, stirring well; stir in powdered sugar, knead in bowl until smooth. Shape 1/2 tsp. sugar mixture around each cherry. Place on waxed paper-lined baking sheet; chill about 2 hours or till firm.

Combine chocolate and shortening in top of double boiler; bring water to boil. Reduce heat to low; cook until choco-

late melts. Dip each cherry by stem into chocolate. Place on waxed paper-lined baking sheet; chill until firm. Store in airtight container in refrigerator.

And we found three other "goodies"

mixing well. Store in air-tight container. For each serving; place 1 tablespoon plus 1 teaspoon of mix in each cup. Add 1 cup boiling water, stir well and serve hot.

LEMON BARS

Crust:

1 cup butter
 1 cup sifted powdered sugar
 2 cups sifted flour
 1/4 tsp. salt

Filling:

4 eggs
 2 cups sugar
 3 tbs. flour
 6 tbs. lemon juice

Mix first four ingredients for crust. Pat into 9x13x2 pan bringing edges up as for pizza. Bake in 350 degree oven 20 to 25 minutes. While crust is baking, mix eggs, sugar, flour and juice. Pour into hot baked crust. Bake 20-25 minutes. While bars are still warm, sprinkle with powdered sugar. Cool and cut into bars.

HOT APPLE CIDER NOG

2 eggs, beaten
 1/2 cup sugar
 1 cup apple cider or apple juice
 1/4 tsp. salt
 1/4 tsp. ground cinnamon
 1/8 tsp. ground nutmeg
 3 cups scalded milk
 1/2 cup whipping cream, whipped

Combine first six ingredients in medium saucepan, mixing well. Gradually add scalded milk, stirring constantly with wire whisk. Cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until thoroughly heated (do not boil). Ladle into mugs. Top each serving with whipped cream; sprinkle with nutmeg. Serve hot. Yield: about 4 1/2 cups.

SNACK ATTACK PARTY MIX

1 1/2 oz. can potato sticks
 1 1/4 cup bite size cheddar cheese crackers
 1 1/4 cups goldfish shaped crackers
 1 1/4 cups thin pretzel sticks
 1 1/4 cups mixed nuts
 3 tbs. butter or margarine, melted
 2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
 1/2 tsp. seasoning salt

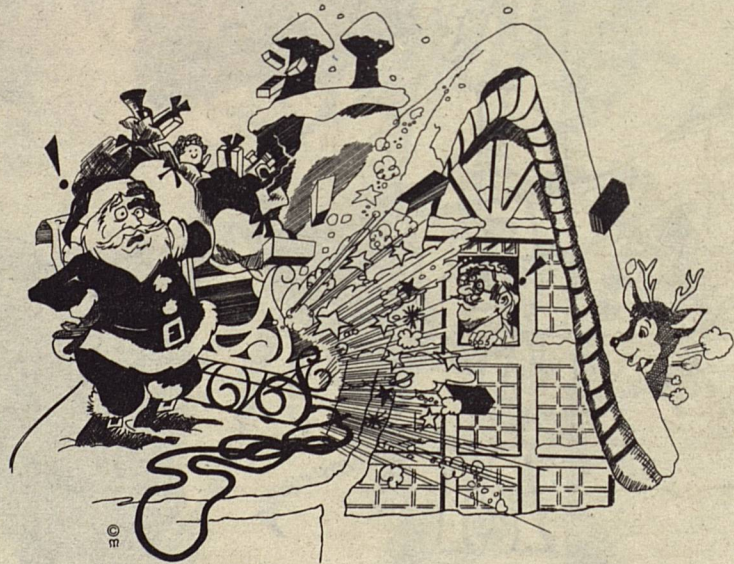
Combine first 5 ingredients in 15x10x1 jelly roll pan; set aside. Combine butter, Worcestershire sauce, and salt; drizzle over snack mixture, tossing gently. Bake at 250 degrees 45 minutes, stirring every 15 minutes.

HOT SPICED CIDER MIX

1 cup orange flavored drink mix
 1 cup sugar sweetened apple flavored drink mix
 1 cup sugar
 1/2 cup instant tea
 6 oz. pkg. sugar sweetened lemonade flavored mix
 1/4 tsp. ground cloves

 1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon

Last Rites Conducted Here For Tom David Warren, 69

Funeral services were held Saturday, Dec. 17 at 10 a.m. in First Baptist Church of Plains for Tom David Warren. Officiating ministers were the Rev. Ken Horne and the Rev. J.L. Bass. Burial was in Plains Cemetery.

Warren was born Nov. 28, 1919 in Spur. He married Velma Holleman in Brownfield Aug. 21, 1940. She preceded him in death Jan. 29, 1976.

He farmed in Terry County until he was drafted into the Army in 1944. Crossing the ocean together, he and a local resident, Johnnie Fitzgerald served together in the 112th Cavalry Division, the last division to ride horses in the Phillipine Islands.

Moving to Yoakum County in 1949 to farm, he was one of the first farmers in the county to fertilize his land and the first farmer in Yoakum County to produce a bale of cotton to the acre.

Mr. Warren served as Post Commander of the American Legion in Plains and was a 32nd Degree Mason. After moving to Plains, he served as a city councilman. He was a Methodist.

His wife, Velma, preceded him in death, Jan. 29, 1976. He and Joan married June 3, 1981 in Hobbs and lived on the Texas-New Mexico state line at the time of his death.

Survivors include a daughter, Velma Carolyn and her husband, Patrick Doyal of Conroe; a son, Tom David Warren III and his wife, Jane of Odessa; four grandchildren, Jennifer Warren Kinney, Lesli Jo Warren, Paul Warren Doyal and Shana Kay Doyal; five brothers, Marvin and Dalton of Brownfield, Ollie of Longview,

James of Plains and Grady of Lubbock; two sisters, Minnie Johnston of Las Cruces and Ruth Thurman of Brownfield.

Pallbearers were Ace Hamm, Rex Swann, Jerome Head, Sid Byrum, Donny Maines and Ron Craft. Special music at the memorial service was by the Maines family.

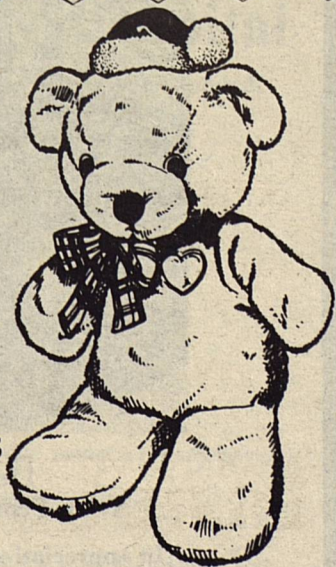

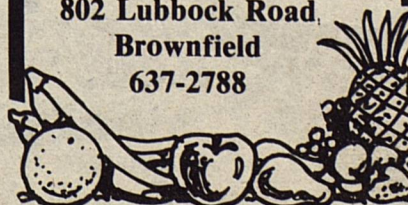
