In 1983, A Nation at Risk started the education reform movement of the 1980s. At all levels of government, political leaders jumped on the reform bandwagon.

The attention generated for public education has been, for the most part, useful. From this exposure, sweeping changes have been implemented. These include increased high school graduation requirements, increased course offerings, revised funding, restructuring of the profession, state mandated curriculum, instructional methodologies, and student achievement being tested and compared.

Many of the reforms and recommendations will never be implemented. Some are too costly, others too drastic, and a few too impractical to consider. They all, however, provide a most important service. They force us to look critically at ourselves as a community, state, and nation.

The reports, laws, and recommendation affect each of us in a different way. They make us argumentative, reflective, demonstrative, or defensive. This simple act of thought and reaction is more important than anything else. For when education is featured in the news, observed, described, researched, discussed, and debated, it gains in importance. When education is relegated to the back pages of the newspaper and becomes a community's forgotten stepchild, then we really have cause for concern.
