## Plaque Is Dedicated To WWII And Korean War Dead

Eastland County residents who lost their lives in World War II and the Korean Conflict were honored in Memorial Day services at the courthouse in Eastland last Tuesday in the unveiling of a bronze tablet bearing their names.

The plaque, erected in the courthouse lobby beside one listing the names of World War I dead, lists 143 names. Some 2,000 persons attended the Memorial Day program, which was sponsored by the Eastland Civic League and the county commissioner's court.

The plaque was unveiled by K. B. Tanner of Eastland, who lost two sons in World War II — Kenneth Boyd Tanner, Jr., an RCAF pilot who was shot down over Germany, and Karl Tanner, a Marine lieutenant who died on Iwo Jima. Mr. Tanner served on the county draft board during the war.

Mrs. Earl Conner, Jr., vice president of the civic league, placed a memorial wreath near the plaque following the unveiling.

John S. Hart, county judge, spoke from the courthouse steps as the Memorial Day speaker. "I would not want a nation in which men are not willing to fight and, if need be, to die," he said. "I wish for a nation where it was not necessary to ask that sacrifice."

"These we are honoring today saw democracy challenged and they defended it. They gave all which a man can give. We shall give our most and best if we make certain they did not die in vain. We shall not forget — our mindfulness, our gratitude, our reverence shall be preserved and maintained in the liberties and the supreme justice for which they died."

A flight of jet airplanes from Webb Air Force Base, Big Spring, flew over in salute. Taps was sounded by men from Dyess Air Force Base, Abilene, which also provided a color and honor guard. The Eastland High School band played music.

Mrs. Tom Stamey, serving as master of ceremonies, was in charge of the dedication and presented the history of the civic league.

The organization was founded in 1917 has been active in the community over the years. The league sponsored the plaque project and directed the search for the list of names. The county paid for the bronze plaque.

Prayers were offered by Rev. John E. Dowd, pastor of the First Methodist Church at Gorman; Father Joseph L. Ben Winkel, Catholic pastor; and the Rev. H. K. Neely, pastor of the First Baptist Church at Rising Star.

## Governor Signs Bill Enabling County Schools To Consolidate

Dr. James Whittington of Eastland, chairman of a committee studying plans to consolidate the high schools at Eastland, Ranger and Olden, was advised by Gov.

ernor Price Daniel Wednesday that Senate Bill 80 had been approved and signed into law.

## Oil Projects Are Slated For Area

George S. Anderson and E. R. Stewart of Fort Worth have announced plans to drill their No. 1 Mattie Lee Donelson as a wildcat oil test one mile northwest of the Mangum community some eight miles southwest of Cisco. The hole will be sunk with rotary equipment to 3,700 feet.

The location was given as 2,000 feet from the south and 630 feet from the west lines of section 7, block 3, H&TC Survey.

Elsewhere, B. F. Thomas et al of Cisco have made application to drill two projects with cable tools to 700 feet in a shallow pool seven miles west of town. Their No. 3 Frances A. Chaney will be 1,950 feet from the north and 2,020 feet from the east lines of Section 1, Block 2, BBB&C Survey. They have spotted their No. 4 Chaney 3,000 feet from the north and 2,020 feet from the east lines of Section 1.

The bill allows the consolidation of high schools in counties by a vote of the school districts. Dr. Whittington's committee had determined that a special law would have to be passed to allow the consolidation elections. Senate Bill 80 was introduced by Senator Tom Creighton and passed by both houses.

Governor Daniel's telegram read: "Senate Bill 80 signed into law today. Best wishes in your campaign for Eastland County to be the first to move forward toward consolidation for better education through the voluntary incentive aid as provided by the new law."

The law will allow school districts that consolidate to continue drawing their state aid for ten years to pay off bonded debts.

Dr. Whittington proposed the school consolidation plan more than a year ago in a talk at the Rotary Club in Eastland. A committee was named by the Eastland, Ranger and Olden schools to study it a few months ago and a report is expected from the committee soon. It was understood.

**Hawks Control Pesky Rodents For The Farmer**

AUSTIN — Of all the predatory birds, the hawk family is the most persecuted and the least understood, according to Jerome Kasten in his article, "Hawk, Friend or Foe?" in the April issue of TEXAS GAME AND FISH magazine. This includes hawks, kites, harriers, and eagles.

The good these birds do far outweigh the bad. For instance, the major part of a kite's diet reads like the role of the scourge of the land (beetles, moths, locusts, dragonflies, crickets, wasps, caterpillars, and other insects). Farmers would have a greater appreciation for these birds if they knew of this diet, writes the author. "No excuse can be made for the extermination of kites. They are harmless, helpful, and easily recognizable. Yet, their numbers are ever diminishing in the state."

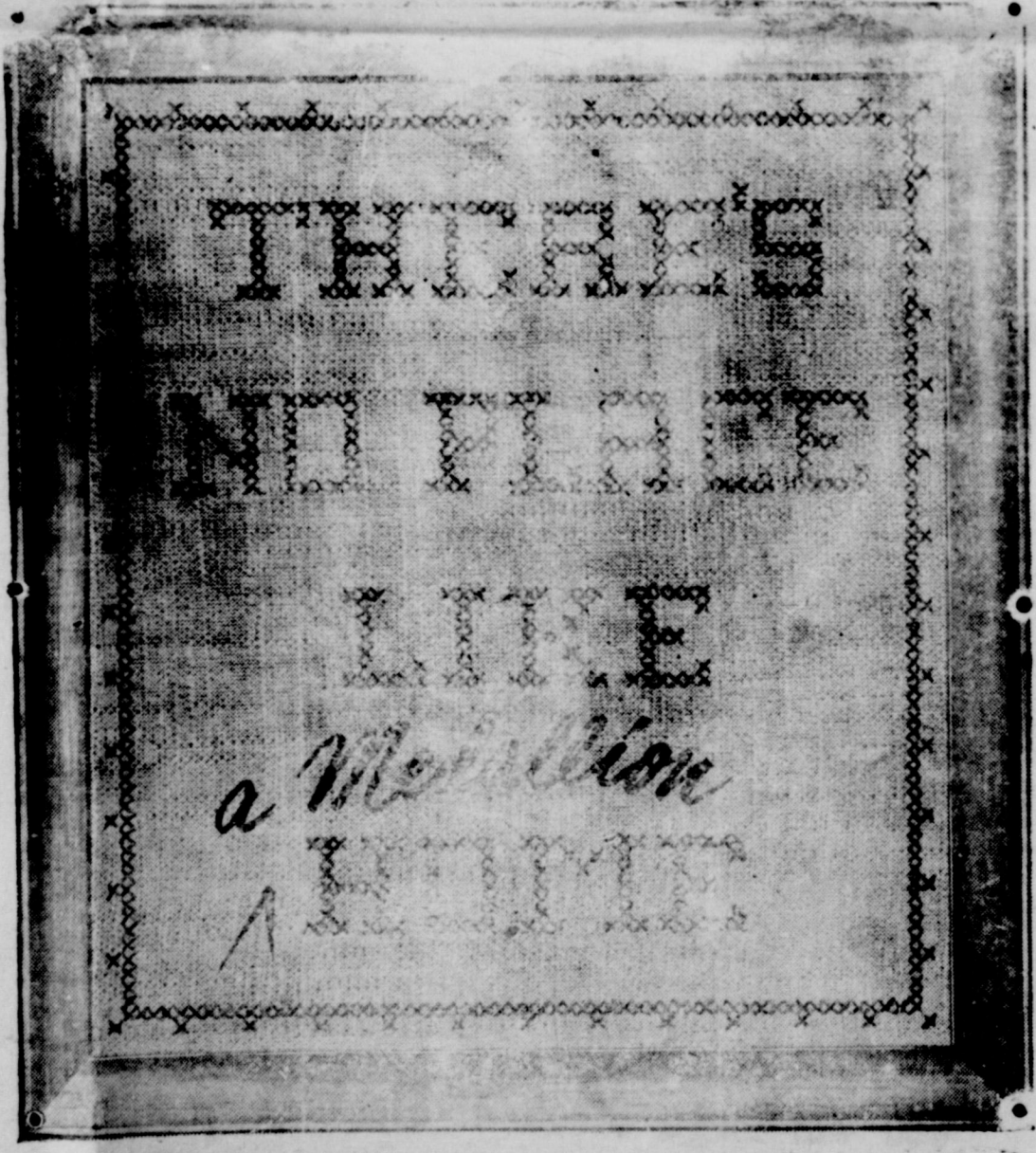
