

Funeral services for Judge M.C. Ledbetter, 75, of Morton were held Friday, Dec. 15 at 2 p.m. in the Activities Building Auditorium with the Rev. Al Jennings, pastor of First United Methodist Church of Morton, officiating.

Burial was in Morton Memorial Cemetery by Ellis Funeral Home.

Judge Ledbetter died at 7:35 Dec. 11 in Methodist Hospital in Lubbock, following a brief illness.

He was born Sept. 14, 1914 in Wellington to Lytle and Zora Moore Ledbetter. He graduated from Olton High School in 1933 and from Baylor University Law School in 1938. He moved from Waco to Morton in 1939. He married Mary Lois Gowdy in Olton Nov. 24, 1938. He was a member of the Lions Club and Morton Athletic Boosters. He served as Cochran County attorney from 1944 to 1959 and was 121st District Court Judge from 1959 until 1981. He was a U.S. Army veteran of World War II and a member of First United Methodist Church.

Survivors include a son, Steve of Midland; three daughters, Stacy Miller of Whiteface and Shari Chambliss and



Computer Course Offered In Cash Record Keeping

The 1980s have been a turbulent period for agriculture. As producers look for ways to stabilize their farm business profitability in the 1990s, they should consider improving their record keeping system, according to Kirk Lewis, County Extension Agent, with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

A new category of record keeping software is making it much less expensive to use a computerized record keeping system, by Dr. Jackie Smith, the Extension Service economist.

"Programs are available for less than \$50 that will keep cash records, print checks, and generate income and expense reports for the whole farm or by enterprise. Quicken 3. by Intuit, is one of these checkbook - based, userfriendly programs that is rapidly gaining popularity in the South Plains.

The Extension Service, in cooperation with South Plains College, is sponsoring a short course on Quicken at the college campus in Levelland Jan. 10-12. The three-day course will use a case study to introduce the program and its many features. It will be held from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m. the first two days and from 9 a.m. until 2 p.m. the final day.

Topics will include benefits of record keeping to make profitable production and marketing decisions; setting up enterprise classes, and income and expense categories; making entries; printing checks, and producing reports. Speeding the entry of repetitive transactions and other shortcuts, and interfacing with Lotus 1-2-3 also will be covered.

Enrollment will be limited to 20 to ensure hands-on participation. The fee of 125 will include a copy of the Quicken 3 disks and manual, a course notebook and three meals. For those who already own Quicken and bring it to use in the course, the fee will be only \$100.

Additional information is available from the Yoakum County Extension Office or by telephoning Dr. Jackie Smith at the Texas A & M University Agricultural Research and Extension Center in Lubbock, (806) 746-6101.
