## CARAMEL CAKE

1 cup commercial sour cream $1 / 4$ cup milk
1 cup butter, softened
2 cups sugar
4 eggs
$23 / 4$ cups all-purpose flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
$1 / 2$ teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 teaspoon rum extract
Caramel Frosting
Pecan halves (optional)
Powdered sugar (optional)
Combine sour cream and milk; set mixture aside.

Cream 1 cup butter; gradually add 2 cups sugar, beating well at medium speed of an electric mixer. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition.
Combine flour, baking powder, and salt; add to creamed mixture alternately with sour cream mixture, beginning and ending with flour mixture. Mix after each addition. Stir in flavorings. Pour batter into 2 greased and floured 9 -inch round cakepans; bake at $350^{\circ}$ for 30 to 35 minutes or until a wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool in pans 10 minutes; remove from pans, and cool on wire racks. Spread Caramel Frosting between layers and on top and sides of cake. If desired, garnish with pecan halves, and sprinkle with powdered sugar. Yield: one 2-layer cake.

## Caramel Frosting

3 cups sugar, divided
1 tablespoon all-purpose flour
1 cup milk
$3 / 4$ cup butter or margarine
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
heavy $31 / 2$-quart Dutch oven; place over medium heat. Cook, stirring constantly, until sugar melts (sugar will clump) and syrup is light golden brown. Remove from heat.

Combine remaining $21 / 2$ cups sugar and flour in a large saucepan, stirring well; add milk, and bring to a boil, stirring constantly.
Gradually pour one-fourth of hot mixture into caramelized sugar, stirring constantly; add remaining hot mixture (mixture will lump, but continue stirring until smooth).

Return to heat. Cover and cook over low heat 2 minutes. Uncover and cook, without stirring, over medium heat until a candy thermometer
registers $238^{\circ}$. Add butter, stirrin to blend. Remove from heat, and cool, without stirring, until temperature drops to $110^{\circ}$ (about 1 hour). Add vanilla, and beat mixture with a wooden spoon or at medium speed of an electric mixer, until frosting reaches spreading consistency. Yield: enough to frost a 2 -layer cake.

FREEZER COLESLAW
1 cup sugar
1 cup vinega
1 cup water
$1 / 2$ teaspoon celery seeds
1 medium cabbage, shredded
(about 8 cups)
1 large carrot, shredded $1 / 2$ cup chopped green pepper $1 / 2$ cup chopped sweet red pepper 1 medium onion, finely chopped 1 teaspoon salt

Combine first 4 ingredients in a saucepan; bring to a boil, stirring occasionally. Boil 1 minute. Cool to room temperature.
Combine shredded cabbage and re maining ingredients in a large bowl, and stir well. Pour dressing ove cabbage mixture; toss gently. Pack coleslaw into 4 (1-pint) freezer containers, leaving $1 / 2$ inch headspace. Cover and freeze. Store in freezer up to 1 month. Thaw coleslaw at room temperature 3 hours before serving. Yield: 4 pints.

## HARVEST CARROT SALAD

3 cups shredded carrot
(17-ounce) can apricot halves, drained and chopped
$1 / 2$ cup sliced celery
2/3 cup raisins
$1 / 1$ cup chopped walnuts, toasted $1 / 2$ cup salad dressing or mayonnaise

Combine all ingredients, tossing well. Cover and refrigerate. Yield: 6 to 8 servings.

FIX-AHEAD
MASHED POTATOES
3 pounds potatoes (about 4 large)
$1 / 2$ teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons butter or margarine

2 (3-ounce) packages cream
cheese, softened
$2 / 3$ cup commercial sour cream $1 / 4$ cup milk
$3 / 4$ teaspoon salt
1 tablespoon butter or margarine, melted
$1 / 2$ teaspoon paprika
Place potatoes in a saucepan; add water to cover and $1 / 2$ teaspoon salt. Bring to a boil; cover, reduce heat to medium, and simmer 25 minutes or until potatoes are tender. Drain. Peel potatoes; place in a large mixing bowl, and mash with a potato masher. Add 2 tablespoons butter and next 4 ingredients, mixing until all ingredients are blended.
Spoon mixture into a lightly greased $12-\times 8$ - x 2 -inch baking dish. Brush top of mixture with melted butter; sprinkle with paprika. Bake immediately, or cover and refrigerate. If refrigerated, let stand at room temperature 30 minutes before baking. Bake at $350^{\circ}$, uncovered, 30 minutes or until hot. Yield: 6 to 8 servings.
