Yoakum County Voters Pick Crutcher & Cobb In Run-Offs

Yoakum County voters cast the winning margin of votes for Jack Cobb and Melba Crutcher in the Democratic Primary run-off election Tuesday. Cobb drew 246 votes to Larry Murphree's 193 to become commissioner of precinct 4 while Mrs. Crutcher garnered 357 votes to Hershel Smith's 230 to win the justice of the peace seat in precinct 1.

School Board Hires Teacher

Rafe Foreman of McCreary, Veselka, Beck and Allen met with the school board Monday evening to discuss delinquent tax procedures and information.

The board unanimously voted to enter into contract with USDA commodity participation for the 1990-91 school year and with Education Service Center, Region XVII, for three days of inservice for teachers and Chapter I services for the 90-91 school year.

Larry McMinn was employed as summer driver education instructor with fees established at \$90 for classroom and driving and \$70 for driving only.

A special board meeting was set for May 7 to canvass election results and for newly elected board members to sign "Statement of Officer" forms. School board policy was updated and contract signed with Education Service Center for media services.

In other action, Sheila Norman was employed as a teacher for the 1990-91 school year.

In other voting, the county's 918 voters gave Jim Mattox 535 votes as compared with 307 for Ann Richards in the governor's race. Statewide, Mrs. Richards swept to an easy victory.

Yoakum residents chose Tom Bowden over Nikki Van Hightower for state treasurer with 439 to 337 votes. They chose Bob Gammage over Ross Sears for the justice, supreme court, place 2 spot with tallies of 440 to 309 and Morris Overstreet over Frank Maloney as judge, court of criminal appeals, place 1. That race was a bit closer with 381 to 325.

Wes Gilbreath collected 18 votes to Grady Yarbrough's 5 in the race for commissioner, general land office and Rick Perry took 22 votes to Richard McIver's 5 in the race for commissioner of agriculture in the Republican run-off.

BREAKING METER SEAL IS ILLEGAL

Seals on electrical meters are the same as locks on doors. Breaking a meter seal is the same as breaking a door lock and illegal entry. And, it is extremely dangerous to break a meter seal because wires located in the meter base are energized. Serious injury or electrocution could result if contact is made with the meter wires.

Stealing electricity is like stealing from your neighbors. Your electric cooperative is a nonprofit organization, owned and controlled by its members. One member taking electricity without paying for it contributes to the overall increase in the price of electricity for all members. Your electricity is purchased from a whole-sale power supplier and passed on to members through your cooperative's distribution system. The membership pays the real cost of providing service.


Tampering with a meter, unauthorized connections of service and diverting electrical energy for the purpose of reducing KiloWatt-hour registration or to avoid payment for energy is illegal.

All members/owners of Lea County Electric should report any case of meter tampering to the Cooperative. As an owner of the Cooperative, when someone steals electricity from the Cooperative, you are going to end up paying for it. This is one way you, as a member, can help control the cost of electricity.

The South Plains Public Health District has been advised that there is currently widespread use of a Chinese herbal medication called SAN KEE HERB. This drug is a black round pill without markings. It is usually packaged in Hong Kong and has been distributed under several different names among them CHUIFONG and MIRACLE HERB.

Asseys of this so called herb have revealed several potentially harmful contaminants. The drugs include a corticosteroid, a diuretic, an anti-inflammatory and a tranquilizer all in various combinations which when taken as directed could be both habit forming and dangerous. Lead and Cadium have also been found as contaminants. Either of these heavy metals can be toxic when taken even in small amounts.

The health department advises all who are taking SAN KEE HERB to be aware of its danger. Further advise should be sought from local physicians. Please contact your local office of the South Plains Health Department for any further information or assistance.


