5:30 p. m. at the section of the road at Lake Cisco Park. Holding the ribbons will be Paddy Wright, "Miss Cisco," and her runners-up, Linda Latham and Loretta White-

Tickets for the barbecue to fol-low the ribbon cutting ceremonies are \$1.50 each and may be ob-tained at the Chamber of Commerce office or from committee members at the CofC. The barbecue will begin at 6 p. m. at the Cisco Country Club.

E. L. Jackson will be master of ceremonies for the ribbon cutting and a special program to begin at 6 p. m. at the Cisco Country Club. Callan Graham, executive vice-president of the Texas Good Roads Association will introduce Mr. Woodward.

Following a short talk, Mr. Woodward will introduce the main speaker, Marshall Fomby of Plainview. Formby was chairman of the highway commission when the road improvement project from Cisco to Albany was planned.

Vets Questions And Answers

Q — This fall, I expect to be taking a night course in law under the Korean GI Bill. I will be starting a full four-year course, and at an accredited school, but will only be attending at night. For purposes of my VA training allowance will this be considered full-time or part-time training?

A — Your night school training will be measured as not more than three-quarters time training. It may not be considered as training full time.

Q — In the event a veteran's widow remarries, she forfeits the pension payments she has been receiving. Does that mean that the veteran's children under 18 also lose any financial benefits they were previously entitled to?

they were previously entitled to?

A — The children are still eligible for payments under certain restrictions of age, etc. Consult the nearest VA office for rates and other information.

Q — I am a peacetime veteran. Am I eligible to enter a VA domiciliary?

A — Yes but you must be permanently disabled, have been discharged for a disability incured or service-aggravated disability, have no adequate means of support, be incapacitated from earning a living and meet certain other requirements.




