
Lance, a member of Yoakum County 4-H while a freshman, participated in industrial art his freshman and sophomore years.


Augustine Garcia To Attend WTSU


Her parents are Jerry and Kathy Cowart. She was born Nov. 7, 1971 in San Antonio. She has attended Plains schools since kindergarten.
