PECAN GROWERS PLAN SPRING FIELD DAY MAY 26 IN COUNTY

The date for the annual Spring Field Day has been set for May 26 according to H. W. Sims, Eastland, President of the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association, sponsoring organization.

The morning session will be held in the courthouse at Eastland and will be devoted to lectures, demonstrations, and films on pecan management, culture, pollination requirements of various varieties, marketing practices, as well as insects and diseases and their control. Sims reported.

survey as well as spraying demonstration with a new type sprayer. Two orchards to be visited includes Sim's orchard in the Leon River bottoms in the Mangum community and the Hep Jackson orchard southwest of Carbon.

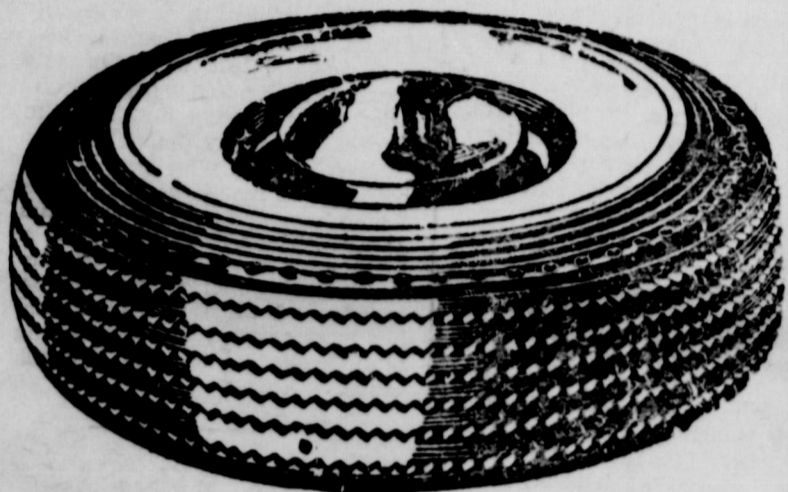
