## Sale Of Personal Home Is Subject To Income Taxes

The sale of a personal residence is subject to special federal income tax return rules, Arthur E. Fogle, Jr., Administrative Officer, Internal Revenue Service, Abilene, reminded taxpayers today.

The general rule, he explained, is that any profit from the sale of your home, or any other personally owned item of property such as an automobile, furniture, securities or real estate is subject to tax.

On the other hand, federal tax law does not permit a deduction for the loss from the sale of a home or other personal asset which was not held for the purpose of producing income.

The Internal Revenue Service representative added: "There is, however, a special rule which allows you to defer paying a tax if you sell your residence at a gain and, within either one year after or one year before the sale, you buy and occupy another residence costing as much or more than the sales proceeds of your old residence.

"The same rule applies, if instead of buying, you begin construction of a new home within one year before and one year after the sale of the old residence and occupy it within 18 months after the sale.

"If the sale proceeds of your old residence exceed the cost of your new residence, the gain on the sale is taxable to the extent of the excess. For example, if you paid \$10,000 for your old residence, sold it for \$15,000, and invested only \$13,000 in a new one, you would pay tax on a gain of \$2,000 (\$15,000 minus \$13,000).

"The sales proceeds are computed by deducting any sales commissions and expense of redecorating and fixing-up the property for sale. The work of redecorating and fixing-up must be performed within the 90-day period before the house is sold, and must be paid for within 30 days after the date of sale."

Taxpayers with questions on this subject may get Document No. 5107, Selling Your Home, by contacting the Internal Revenue Service Office.

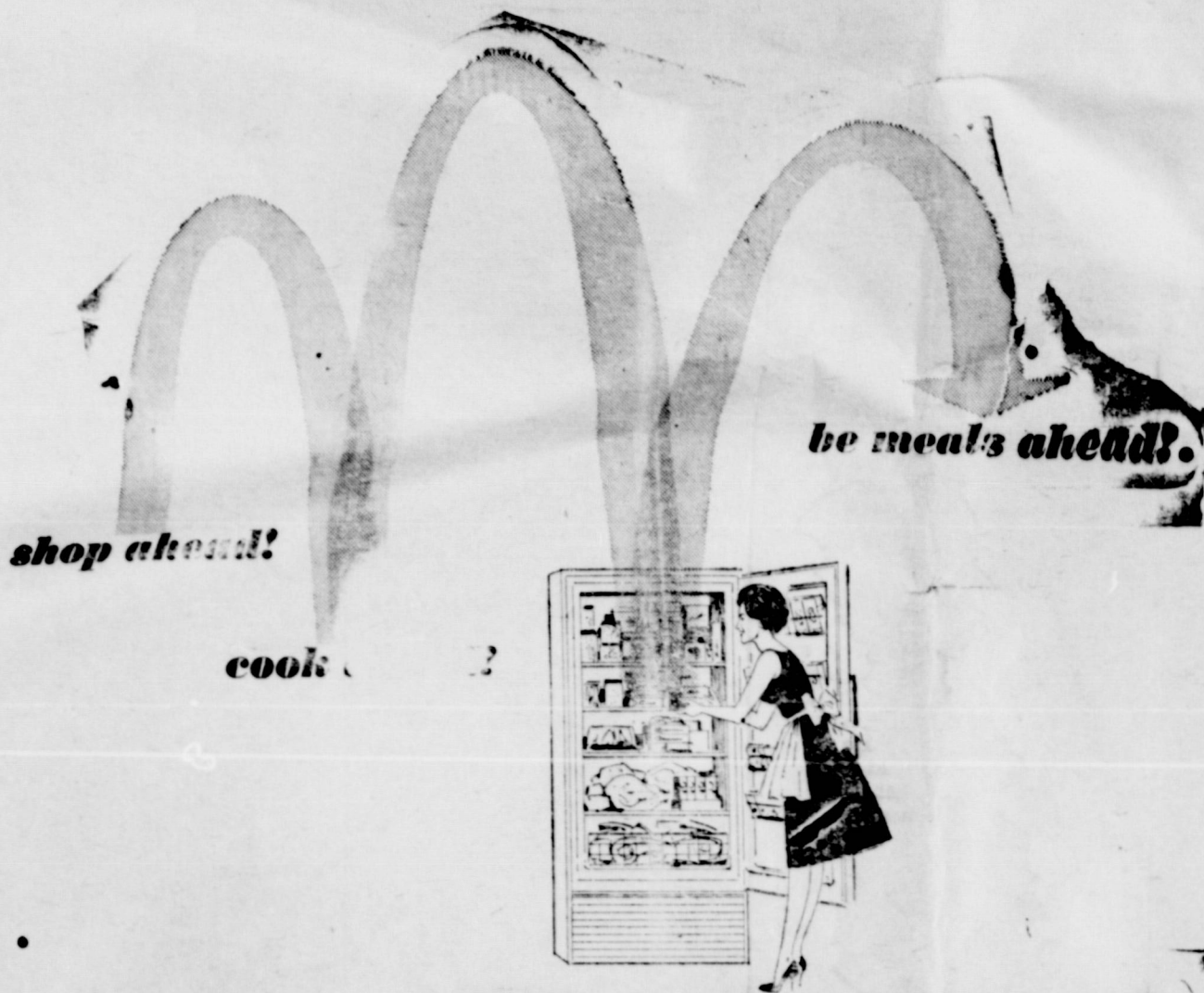

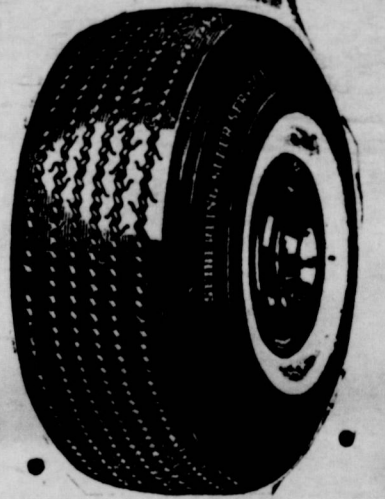

**VETS QUESTIONS & ANSWERS**

**Q** — I am a veteran but I have never applied for any benefits under the Veterans Administration. Am I required to keep the VA notified of my change of address?

**A** — No veteran is required to get in touch with VA at all. Certain benefits and privileges were established by Congress to help

civil life. You may not be eligible for some of these but there is no requirement that you have to apply for or accept them. You might, for your own protection and that of your family at least inquire into the nature of the rights you still have. But you are not required to do so.

**Q** — I'm a Korean veteran and, since my discharge, I have been operating a small business of my own. I am eligible, under the law, for a GI loan. Can I use my GI loan to help me expand my business?

**A** — Yes. Under the law, you may use a GI business loan either for the purpose of undertaking or expanding a legitimate business venture. You must, of course find a lender who will make you a loan under GI terms.

### Humans Warned Young Wildlife Better In Woods

Austin — Don't pick up young of the wild. This is the warning of Capt. E. M. Sprott, director of law enforcement of the Game and Fish Commission.

This is the time of the year when many babes of the woods stroll out in the open. They are tame and curious, and there is a tendency on the part of most people to take them home.

In the first place, according to Capt. Sprott, this is illegal. Just as important is the fact that the wild can take care of itself much better in the wild than might be done by individuals. There are a few cases, he points out, where lives of animals have been saved and landowners take care of them after something has happened to the mother. However, when an individual picks up a fawn or any other animal and takes it home, the animal actually has much less chance

of surviving. Very frequently these babes are lifted by humans while the mother is standing camouflaged behind a tree.

He also warns against raiding birds nests, although this practice has decreased in recent years.
