



Cowgirls Win State Title

Melissa Green, Rena McElroy & Leslie Patton

Named 'All-State'

The Cowgirls put on their best performance of the season last Saturday and defeated Round Top-Carmine 15-8 15-11 in the Class A championship match of the 1990 UIL State Volleyball Tournament to capture their third consecutive state volleyball championship. They ended their season at Toney Burger Center in Austin with a 37-2 record.

The Round Top-Carmine Cubs jumped out to a 5-1 lead in the first game before the Cowgirls responded with a 9-1 spurt keyed by a Michelle Lowe dink, Jo Lena Powell kill, Melissa Green kill, and a block, overset kill and ace by Leslie Patton. The Cowgirls went on to score the last five points of the game, three coming on kills by Leslie, Michelle and Jo Lena.

A McElroy block and Green kill got the Cub's attention early in game two. The Cowgirls rolled up a six point lead with a pair of aces by Melissa and

Cowgirls at 7-1.

The Cubs cut the margin to 7-5 but missed their serve for side out. The Cowgirls then pulled away for a 11-5 advantage on a Sandra Ramos kill and two service aces by Jo Lena. They led 14-8 before Round Top rallied with three points. After a Cowgirl timeout, the Cowgirls regained serve on Green's kill shot and won the match when a Round Top hit sailed into the

Championship match statistics included Melissa Green, four kills, three digs; Michelle Lowe, three kills, three aces: Rena McElroy, nine kills, three blocks, five digs; Leslie Patton, five kills, one block, two aces, four digs; Jo Lena Powell, two kills, one block, two digs; and Sandra Ramos, one ace and five digs.

The Cowgirls held off Windthorst 15-10 18-16 in semi-final competition

one by Rena. Jo Lena's kill put the Friday morning. Following a 7-7 tie in the first game, the Cowgirls put together three consecutive points on two aces by Michelle and a block by Leslie before a Cowgirl hitting error forced side out. The Trojanettes capitalized on three Cowgirl hitting errors but the Cowgirls came back for game point on Rena's block and overset kill. Windthorst rallied for a 14-14 tie on their next rotation. Following a Cowgirl time out, Rena recorded a kill for side out but a bad dig gave the Trojanettes another chance. They dinked the Cowgirl defense to reach game point and the Cowgirls used their last time out. The game was tied at 15-15 and 16-16 but the Cowgirls held on to win the match 18-16 on kills by Melissa and Leslie, after four side outs.

There were 11 side outs in game two before the Cowgirls put together five consecutive points. They lead the entire second game and reached game point on Jo Lena's block at 14-6.

Windthorst held the Cowgirls at game point while scoring four points on their next three rotations. The Cowgirls claimed the match 15-10 when a Windthorst hit went out of bounds.

Cowgirl statistics included Melissa, three kills, one ace, two digs; Michelle, one kill, one dig; Rena, eight kills, five blocks, one ace, one dig; Leslie, three kills, one block, one ace, one dig; Jo Lena, three kills, two aces; Sandra Ramos, one kill.

Bill Farney, UIL Assistant Director announced the Class A All State Tournament team following the championship match. Melissa Green, Rena McElroy and Leslie Patton were selected to the team for the second year in a row. The Cowgirls were then presented with gold medals by Dr. Bailey Marshall, UIL Director.



Polyunsaturated fats are found in sunflower, corn, soybean, cotton seed and safflower oils.


Mono-unsaturated fats are found both in plant and animal origins and include olive, canola and peanut oils. These tend to decrease blood cholesterol levels and may lower LDL cholesterol levels. Polyunsaturated fats also lower triglycerides.

Ms. Williams explained saturated fats have been shown to raise blood cholesterol levels.






