## YOAKUM CDUNT Commissioners' Court

Yoakum County Commissioners Court met in special session Dec. 17 with all members present.

The court voted to release securities on their effective date of Dec. 26. Permission was also given Texas ALLTEL petitions for road crossings to lay, construct, operate and maintain communications cable under and across certain county roads.

Only one bid was received for the purchase of an auto for Juvenile Probation Officer. The \$13,456.96 bid with trade-in was accepted from Mustang Country Chevrolet-Buick-Olds.

A letter of resignation from Jennola Maple, secretary in the County Extension Office, was read and the resignation accepted.

Insurance Agent Ross Shamburger presented changes to occur in CAN-CERPLAY PLUS insurance effective Jan. 1. Premium amounts and coverage on those currently enrolled on not change but new employees may not be added at present policy rate and coverage. The premium will increase by an additional \$1.95 per single employee

and \$2.50 per family on updated coverage. Intensive care remains the same. A motion was approved to continue paying the present cancer premium on present employees and give them the option to move to the updated policy, if desired, by paying the additional amount and to require new employees to pay the additional amount.

Line item transfers were approved. The court voted to advertise for bids for gasoline and diesel purchase and hauling of gravel, crushed caliche and asphalts for all four precincts for the calendar year 1991.

A motion to re-appoint Linda Lowrey to the Regional Alternate Dispute Resolution Advisory Committee was approved.

The County Treasurer's bond was updated to \$35,000 and to set the Assistant County Treasurer's bond to \$35,000.

Extra hire and disbursements were approved for payment.
