The accident occurred when the driver of the truck apparently fell asleep. Department of Public Safety investigators said that the truck came over on the wrong side of the road and hit the car on the shoulder of the highway about 4 p.m. and that Neville had apparently tried to steer clear of the on-coming truck.

Mrs. Neville was assistant manager of a restaurant. She was a member of the Church of Christ and a lifelong resident of the Patillo area.

Other survivors include two daughters, Linda Schuttle of Quinlan and Lisa Wells of Ranger; a stepdaughter, Becky Neville of Dresdon; her father, Johnny Compton of Lipan; six grandchildren; and two brothers, Bob Compton of Morgan Mill and Kenneth Compton of Lipan.
