Cowboys Finish Track Season, Sainz, Pierce To Go To State

Plains Cowboys are wrapping up a great track season with two members preparing for the "big one" - state competition in Austin. Monte Pierce and Michael Sainz earned the right to state competition with their performances at Regional Contests last week in Levelland.

The Cowboys scored 39 points in the event, nailing down third place, their best finish in a long time. Pierce won the pole vault competition with a school record of 14' and missed setting a regional record by one inch. Sainz broke his own school record with a 1:58.8 win in the 800 meter run.

Barely missing out on a state berth, the 1600 meter relay team ran a 3:28.1 in pre-lims but posted a 3:30.6 time for third place in the finals. Sainz tied the school record for a relay leg with 50.9 while Jason Smith broke the record with 50.7. Also running the relay were Sterling Lovelace and Pierce.

Armando Ramirez also came up short one place in qualifying for state. He placed third in the 3200 run and sixth in the 1600.

For the year, the Cowboys won three of four track meets, captured the

district title and finished third in regional competition. The team broke six school records and won seven relay championships.

Coaches Clay and McAdams express their pleasure with the team effort this year and say that next year could be even better.

Cowgirls Compete In Regional

Rhonda Cowart placed third in the 400 meter dash with a 63.40 performance in the regional meet last weekend. Amy Crutcher finished fourth in the 300 meter hurdles and posted a record school time of 49.40.

The 1600 meter relay team also set a new school record with a 4:22.75 finish for fourth place. Runners were Crutcher, Shandy Willett, Jennifer Cowart and Rhonda Cowart.

Also competing in regional events were Cowgirls Daphne Lowe in the 1600 meter relay and Ogla Ramirez in the 1600 meter run.

The Cowgirls tied for eleventh place with 18 points.

Registration Set May 6-8 For Headstart/Pre-K Students

Registration will be held May 6-8 for Headstart and Pre-Kindergarten students. Parents who have a child who will be four years old on or before Sept. 1, 1991 should register that child either of those dates.

Parents should bring their child's birth certificate, immunization record and social security number. Proof of family income should also be brought. Parents should report to the Headstart classroom, back of the band hall, for registration.

Representatives of Headstart and members of the Plains ISD staff will explain guidelines.

Plains ISD is also considering an Early Childhood program for next school year. For this program, a child must be three years old by Sept. 1, 1991 and must meet language and income eligibility requirements. These children may be registered Monday,

Tuesday or Wednesday in the elementary office or information may be obtained by calling 456-7438. In order to offer this program, there must be 15 qualifying students.

Anyone knowing of a child who will be three or four years old on or before Sept. 1, 1991 who might not know of registration is asked to pass on this information to them.
