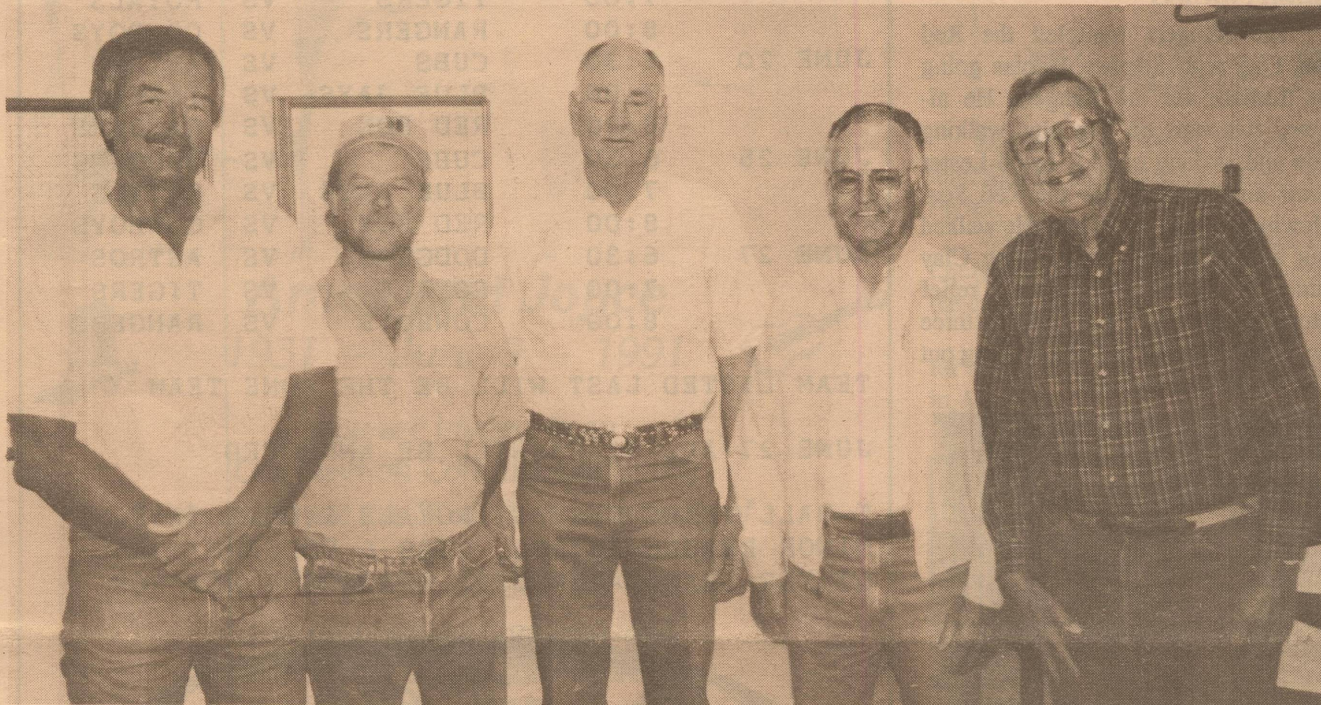

Little League action May 28 found the Dodgers defeating the Astros, 10-7. In T-ball play, the Tigers outlasted the Royals, 16-12.

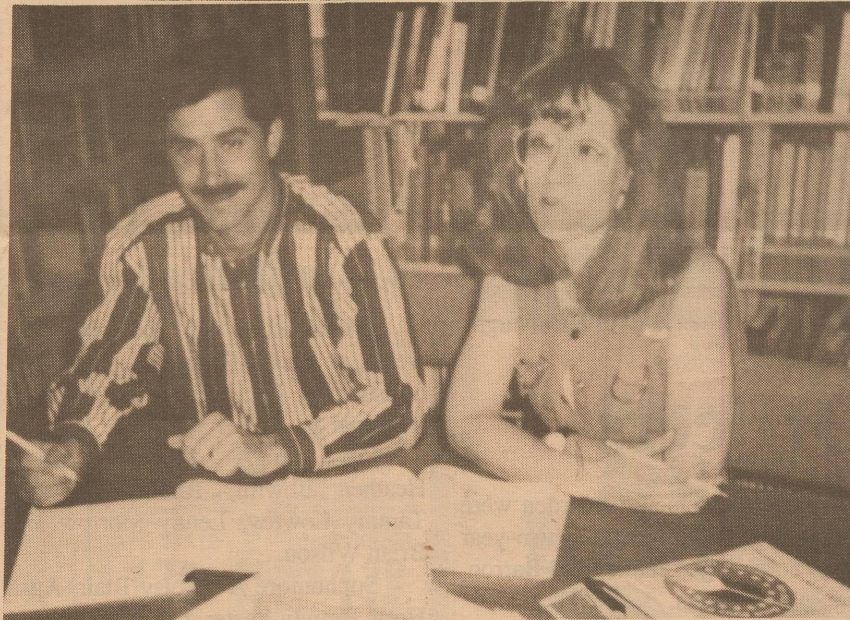

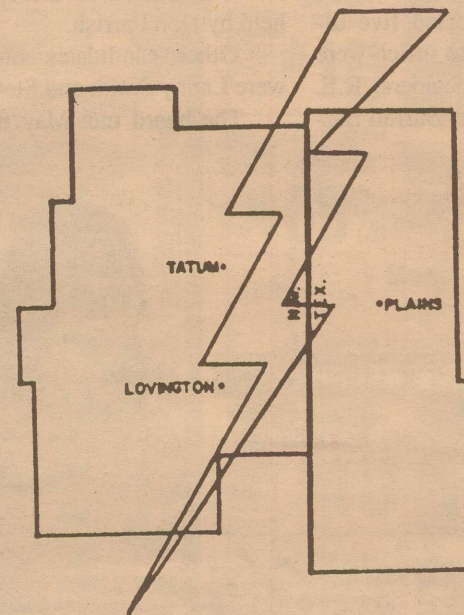

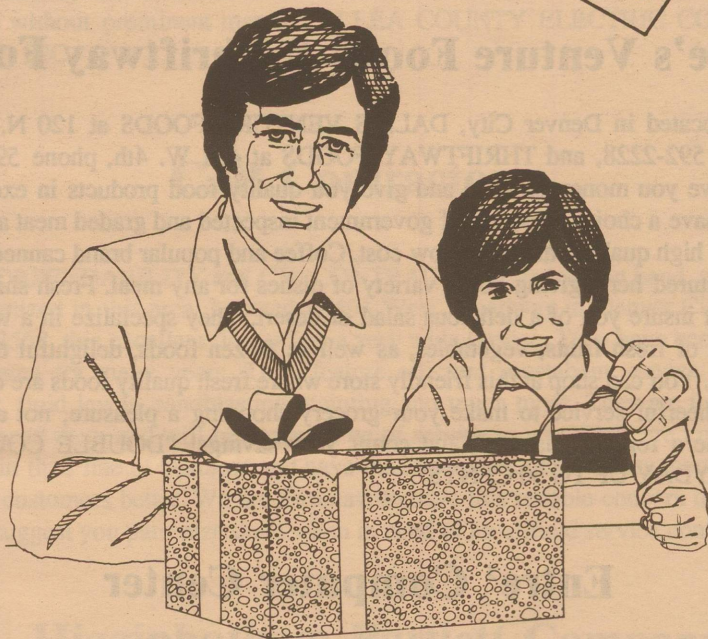
