

Gov. Ann Richards Announces **Project To Help Cotton Gins**

Texas Governor Ann Richards announced a new agricultural energy project to help Texas cotton ginners lower energy costs, as well as reduce air pollution. The project will be located at the Terry County Co-op Gin in Brownfield, on the Texas High Plains, the most highly concentrated cotton producing region in the world.

"Texas accounts for almost onethird of our country's annual cotton production, and we lead the nation in the number of operating cotton gins," said Governor Richards. "This new energy-saving technology can assist our cotton industry in keeping costs down, and it will help clean our air."

Texas Tech University will develop the project, under contract with the Governor's Energy Office. The new technology, which will eliminate the pneumatic handling of cotton within the gin, will not only yield annual savings of as much as \$90,000 in


