Vets Questions And Answers

Q — Have any of the various bills to re-open GI life insurance to lapsed veterans been passed by Congress?

A — No. Although several bills had been introduced, none have received Congressional approval.

Q — I am receiving railroad retirement payments and also veteran's pension. In filling out the income questionnaire received from VA, do I report my railroad retirement payments as "annual income" anticipated for 1961, or is this exempted?

A — If you are receiving pension under the old pension law, do not count your railroad retirement as income. If you came on the pension rolls after June 30, 1960, or changed from the old to the new law after that date, you must report as income all railroad retirement payments above the amount you contributed to the railroad retirement fund.

Explosives Found In Chicken House On County Farm

E. L. Dennis, constable at Gorman, was notified early Monday morning by the nephew of Alvis Rodger of Abilene, a man who owns some farmland about three miles north of Gorman, that he had found 14 cases of gellomite — an explosive more powerful than dynamite — in a chicken house on the farm. The discovery was made on Sunday.

Mr. Dennis opined that some thieves had stolen the explosive and cached it away after discovering what it was. The gellomite was manufactured by the Hercules Manufacturing Company of Wilmington, Delaware.

Constable Dennis said he thought it could have been in the chicken house for four or five months. He added that no investigation was being conducted as there are no suspects. "Anyone could have taken it," he said.

VETS QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Q — When does a veteran at school under the Korean GI Bill get his school allowance from VA? My first month of classroom work is almost over and I have not yet received my allowance.

A — Under law, school allowance may not be paid until after classroom work for the month covered by VA's check has been completed, and VA must receive a certificate of attendance signed by you and a representative of the school, before it can start payment. Usually it takes another three weeks for the check to reach you. That is why VA always urges veterans to be prepared for a two-month delay in receipt of the first check.
