Explosives Found In Chicken House On County Farm

E. L. Dennis, constable at Gor-man, was notified early Monday morning by the nephew of Alvis Rodger of Abilene, a man who owns some farmland about three miles north of Gorman, that he had found 14 cases of gellomite an explosive more powerful than dynamite — in a chicken house on the farm. The discovery was

made on Sunday. Mr. Dennis opined that some thieves had stolen the explosive and cached it away after discovering what it was. The gellomite was manufactured by the Hercules Manufacturing Company of

Wilmington, Delaware.
Constable Dennis said he thought it could have been in the chicken house for four or five months. He added that no investigation was being conducted as there are no suspects. "Anyone could have taken it," he said.
