Conditions Are Favorable To Plant Permanent Type Grass

Grass planting time has arrived. The good sub-soil moisture has made conditions better for grass seeding than they have been in a good many years. Several district cooperators have already seed of grass this year. Seed supplies are generally ample and reasonable in price, according to Upper Leon Soil Conservation District workers.

Considerable seeding this year will be on land where mesquite were recently spot grubbed or root plowed. This land invariably needs reseeding after mesquite control as the better grass species are schom present on land badly invested with mesquite. Fortunately the soil disturbance from root plowing or turbance from root plewing or grubbing creates a condition fav-

portion of the area.

Advantage should be taken of this opportunity to add better grasses to the existing stands of the area.

Very few young grass seedlings can survive the competition of annual needle grass. Most successful results are obtained by establishing some type of sor-ghum dead cover a year previous to seeding. Species with high seedling vigor such as King Ranch Bluestem and Weeping Love Grass can usually be established by direct seeding after plowing the annual needle grass.

Coastal bermuda is being sprigged this spring by several cooperators, primarily in waterways. Outstanding results can be obtained with coastal bermuda on sandy land, especially on land receiving extra water. Applica-tion of nitrogen fertilizer is essential for high production with this grass.

An essential step to the seed. ing of permanent grass in this culent, usually the greenest, most nutritious plants. This is invariably the young grass seedlings which are frequently pulled up from their roots by grazing.

Cost sharing for grass seed is available through the local A.C.P. program. The Upper Leon Soil Conservation District has grass seeding equipment available for use of cooperators in this area.

Part Of Pension **And Annuity Pay** Subject To Tax

Pension and annuity payments received by individuals during 1960 come in three forms for federal income tax purposes: nontaxable, fully taxable, or partly taxable, according to Arthur E. Fogle, Jr., Administrative Officer, Internal Revenu Service, Abilene.

Tax-free pensions which should not be reported on Uncle Sam's tax return include Social Security payments, Railroad Retirement Act pensions, pensions to veterans, and family benefits and disability retirement pay of military personnel, if retired on disability resulting from active service, the IRS representative said.

On the other hand, he added, payments received by a retired employee from a pension plan provided by his employer, without cost to the employee, are fully taxable.

Taxpayers with questions on this subject may get Document No. 5018, "Retirement Income and Credit," from the IRS office.
