Upper Leon Crop Plans For 1961 Outlined By SCD

The Upper Leon Soil Conservation District has outlined plans for crop-planting operations and ranchers to provide good grass cover over their land as a means of retaining most of the rainfall, according to information here.

Oversized grass and bare ground allows 80% to 90% of the rain to run off whereas a good cover absorbs an equal percentage of the rain that falls, it was stated.

Newly applied practices by district farmers and ranchers during 1961 were given as follows:

Conservation crop, rotations, 35,651 acres; contour farming, 6,569 acres; cover cropping, 18,113 acres; crop residue management, 19,281 acres; rotation hay and pasture, 5,612 acres; strip crops, 3,269 acres; brush control, 8,081 acres; deferred grazing (range), 29,234 acres; pasture improvement, 2,149 acres; pasture planting, 1,528 acres; grass land renovation, 263 acres; proper use of rangeland, 56,818 acres; range seeding, 1,186 acres; rotating grazing, 1,695 acres; fish pond improvement, 92 NO.; stubble mulching, 1,328 acres; diversion terraces, 25 miles; pond construction, 154; terracing, 84 miles; and water ways, 67.

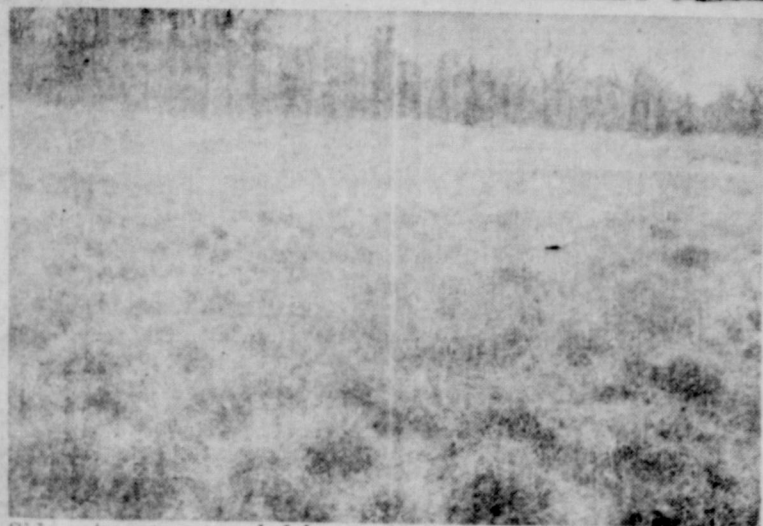
City Election To Be Held April 4th

Conditions Are Favorable To Plant Permanent Type Grass

Grass planting time has arrived. The good sub-soil moisture has made conditions better for grass seeding than they have been in a good many years. Several district cooperators have already seeded grass this year. Seed supplies are generally ample and reasonable in price, according to Upper Leon Soil Conservation District workers.

Considerable seeding this year will be on land where mesquite were recently spot grubbed or root plowed. This land invariably needs reseeding after mesquite control as the better grass species are seldom present on land badly infested with mesquite. Fortunately the soil disturbance from root plowing or grubbing creates a condition favorable for reseeding on at least a portion of the area.

Advantage should be taken of this opportunity to add better grasses to the existing stands of grass. Reseeding of this type is especially good results in this type of reseeding operation.

Reseeding of old cropland is a great need in this area. The poor grasses usually found on most old fields is a poor investment since much of this land could be producing palatable grass. In reseeding old fields which have be-

come established in annual needle grass or other vegetation seed bed preparation to destroy existing vegetation is essential.

Very few young grass seedlings can survive the competition of annual needle grass. Most successful results are obtained by establishing some type of sorghum dead cover a year previous to seeding. Species with high seedling vigor such as King Ranch Bluestem and Weeping Love Grass can usually be established by direct seeding after plowing the annual needle grass.

Coastal bermuda is being sprigged this spring by several cooperators, primarily in waterways. Outstanding results can be obtained with coastal bermuda on sandy land, especially on land receiving extra water. Application of nitrogen fertilizer is essential for high production with this grass.

An essential step to the seeding of permanent grass in this area is complete deferment from will always select the most succulent, usually the greenest, most nutritious plants. This is invariably the young grass seedlings which are frequently pulled up from their roots by grazing.

Cost sharing for grass seed is available through the local A.C.P. program. The Upper Leon Soil Conservation District has grass seeding equipment available for use of cooperators in this area.

VETS QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Q — In a medical emergency, how should one go about getting a veteran admitted to a nearby VA hospital at Government expense?

A — The veteran's private physician should telephone the hospital and discuss the veteran's condition with the admitting physician of the hospital.

Q — A non-veteran friend and I want to go into business. As a Korean veteran, am I entitled to a GI loan on this partnership business?

A — Yes, if otherwise eligible. But, the amount of the loan on which VA's guaranty is based will be in proportion to your own interest in the loan, and will not cover any of the loan constituting the non-veteran's contribution to the business.

Q — As a "peacetime veteran," am I eligible for VA hospitalization?

A — Only under these two conditions: (1) If you were discharged under other than dishonorable conditions for a

disability incurred in line of duty, or (2) If you are receiving compensation for a service-connected or service-aggravated disability or disease.

Q — I am a widow of a recently deceased World War II veteran. He never used his entitlement for a GI loan. Am I eligible for this benefit?

A — Only those unremarried widows of World War II and Korean veterans who died in service or, following service, died as a result of a service-connected disability are eligible for GI home benefits.

Part Of Pension And Annuity Pay Subject To Tax

Pension and annuity payments received by individuals during 1960 come in three forms for federal income tax purposes: non-taxable, fully taxable, or partly taxable, according to Arthur E. Fogle, Jr., Administrative Officer, Internal Revenue Service, Abilene.

Tax-free pensions which should not be reported on Uncle Sam's tax return include Social Security payments, Railroad Retirement Act pensions, pensions to veterans, and family benefits and disability retirement pay of military personnel, if retired on disability resulting from active service, the IRS representative said.

On the other hand, he added, payments received by a retired employee from a pension plan provided by his employer, without cost to the employee, are fully taxable.

Taxpayers with questions on this subject may get Document No. 5018, "Retirement Income and Credit," from the IRS office.
