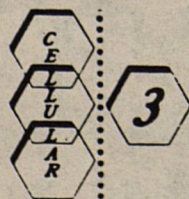

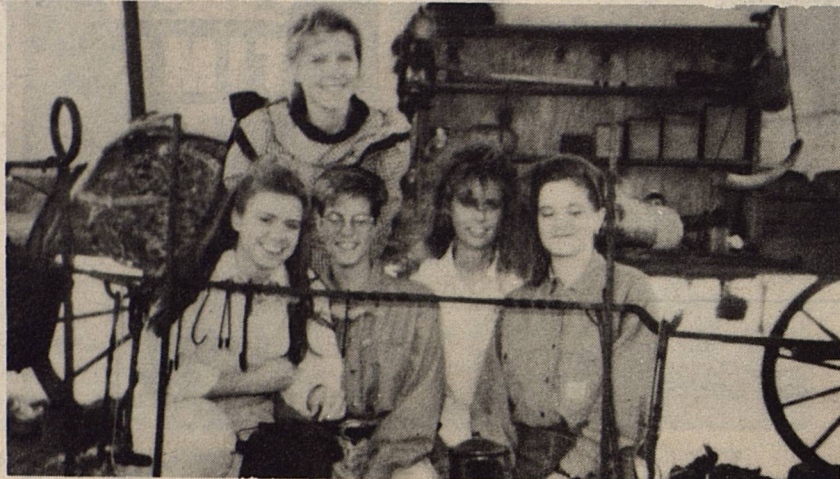
### An Open Letter To Parents of Middle School Students:

Stories of pioneer days were told while the audience sat before campfires at an authentic teepee and then tried their luck at throwing tomahawks and knives.

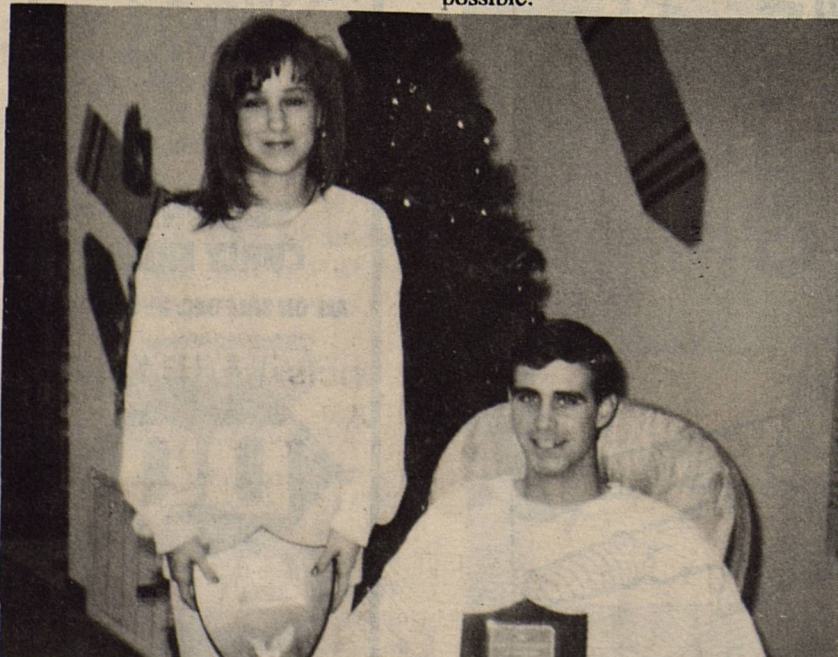

The star is six feet from point to

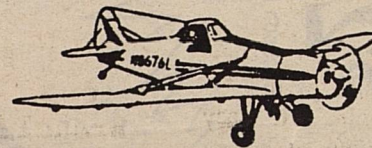

The youths were sponsored by 12 area electric cooperatives, Bailey County, Caprock, Deaf Smith, Dickens, Lamb County, Lea County, Lighthouse, Lone Wolf, Lyntegar, Midwest, South Plains and Swisher.

Yoakum County 4-H'ers Jo Lena Powell and Christi Bethany appeared on the program. Senator John Montford of Lubbock was guest speaker.

"As you get this recognition," he told the Gold Star winners, "first, I thank you for what you've already done. You've set an example. But don't stop now..."

Montford listed several qualities he urged youths to develop in order to help: commitment, character, frugality, focus, ability to get along with others without yielding to peer pressure, values, desire for excellence and ability to communicate.

He noted that 80 percent of inmates in the state prison system were drug or alcohol abusers and 75 percent were high school dropouts.

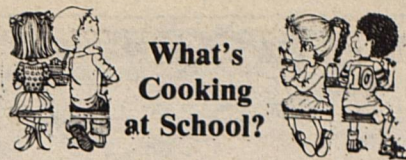

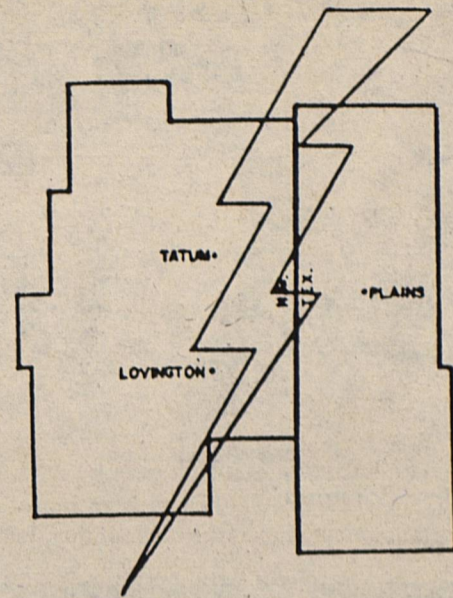
