NEW FUNDS MADE AVAILABLE IN FARM HOME LOAN PROGRAM

An additional \$50 million has been made available to the Farmers Home Administration for farm housing loans, Mr. Homer P. Cole, the agency's Eastland county supervisor, announced today.

He said that new loan funds assure an adequate supply of this type of credit for eligible farm families during the balance of the fiscal year. Loans made so far this year plus those being processed had practically exhausted the funds previously available.

Farm housing loans are made throughout the rural areas of the United States. The loans provide farm families with an opportunity to acquire an adequate house and efficient service buildings.

Applications for farm housing loans may be made at the local office of the Farmers Home Administration, Mr. Cole said. The loans bear 4 percent interest and are repayable over periods up to 33 years.

The major demand in Eastland County is for loans to construct and modernize farm houses, and most of the funds are used for new construction.

Improvements financed with the loans include the installation of central heating, and pressure water supply systems, the addition of bathrooms and the modernization of kitchens.

Many local farmers also use the loans to adjust their service buildings to the changing requirements of agriculture.

To be eligible a farmer must own a farm that will annually produce for sale or home use at least \$400 worth of commodities based on 1944 prices and be of sufficient value to adequately secure the loan. In addition, he must lack the resources needed to obtain credit elsewhere and have the sufficient income to pay farm operating and family living expenses and meet payments when due on his debts.

Peanut Support Price Set At \$221; Meetings Are Announced

The 1961 support price for peanuts and plans for a series of meetings to urge farmers to plant the county's full allotment were announced this week of interest to peanut growers of Eastland County.

D. B. Warren, secretary of the Southwestern Peanut Growers Association, reported that the 1961 support level for peanuts will be 85% of parity. This, he added, will represent an increase of some \$29 per ton over

last year's price to a new level of \$221 per ton.

"The 1960 price of \$201 was a gross figure since the Commodity Credit Corporation deducted \$9 per ton for storage and carrying costs and the figure of \$221 for this year will be net to growers so that actually we will realize a \$29 per ton increase, this year," Mr. Warren said. This amounts to 44¢ per bushel and is the largest increase for any commodity. Mr. Warren added that association officials have made several trips to Washington the past six weeks to confer with Department of Agriculture officials relative to the 1961 support level.

"With continued favorable weather conditions together with the increased price the economy of producing counties is expected to improve substantially," Mr. Warren said.

The three meetings that will deal with plans to get all of the county's peanut allotment in 1961 will be held as follows:

Rising Star — 7:30 p. m. Monday, March 20, at the Legion Hall. Nimrod — 7:30 p. m. Tuesday, March 21, at the Community Center.

Carbon — 7:30 p. m. Thursday, March 23, at the high school auditorium.

Emmett Powell, ASC office manager, will explain the release and reapportionment provisions of the law pertaining to peanuts at the meetings. Glen Justice, county farm bureau president, will preside at the meetings. A spokesman from Southwestern Peanut Growers Association will be present to aid in the discussion of the peanut program.

Questions & Answers

Q — Is there any chance for a woman to get into a VA hospital as a patient? I'm a World War II veteran but was never stationed outside the States.

A — Yes. Women veterans are eligible for VA hospitalization on the same basis as are men. For further information, get in touch with the nearest VA regional office or apply directly to a VA hospital.

Q — Has Congress passed any of the proposed legislation which would furnish special benefits for peacetime veterans?

A — There are several benefits already established for peacetime veterans. Any VA office can give you the particulars. However, the proposed legislation you mean concerning education, home loans, etc., has not yet been passed by Congress.

Q — I am the unmarried widow of a World War II veteran who never used his home loan guaranty benefits. Is it true, as I've been told, that I may be eli-

gible to apply for VA guaranty on a home loan?

A — An unmarried widow of a World War II or Korean Conflict veteran is eligible for this benefit only if her husband died in service, or following separation from service, he died of a service-connected disability.

Two Farm Bureau Men Return From Austin Meeting

Mitchell Campbell, Route 2, Gorman, policy development chairman, and John Love, Route 1, Ranger, public information chairman have returned from Austin where they attended the farm bureau legislative tour. The tour is a program to familiarize farm bureau leaders with state governmental operations. The tour includes a series of tours of state capitol by farm bureau members, under the direction of Bob Lilly, Texas farm bureau legislative director.

March 6th and 7th were days scheduled for District 7 and 8, which included Eastland County. Groups assembled at the Stephen F. Austin Hotel for briefing. The afternoon was devoted to visiting the capitol, contacting senators and representatives and attending legislative hearings. A meeting was held with Scott Bailey, state representative, and Tom Creighton, senator, for the purpose of discussing farm bureau policies.

Fishing Contest Open For Texas Species Of Bass

AUSTIN — White bass (sandies) fishermen of Texas may have a good opportunity this year to rank in top place in the 51st annual FIELD AND STREAM fishing contest. Texas waters are among the best in the nation for white bass fishing, according to Howard D. Dodgen, executive secretary of the Game and Fish Commission.

In the contest, \$8300 in U. S. bonds will be awarded for big fish caught and checked under the contest rules. The first prize will be for largemouth and spotted bass. However, there will be special prizes for white bass.

Ed Bonn, fishery biologist at Lake Texoma, for years has been attempting to get the white bass placed in the top list of prizes, but as of now the largest white bass will bring but a \$25 bond.

When a large fish is caught it must be weighed and measured in the presence of witnesses. Information is then sought on the type of equipment used and the manner in which the fish was caught.
