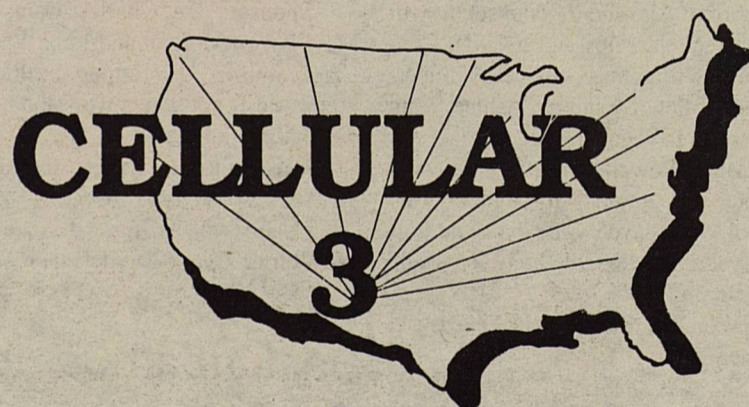
Bible School Slated June 1-3

Crowned Rodeo Queen as a sophomore, she was also chosen as a Homecoming Queen candidate that year.

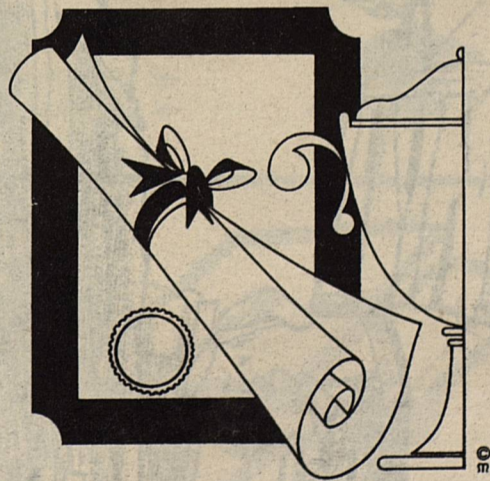

Janice Zubiate To Be Homemaker

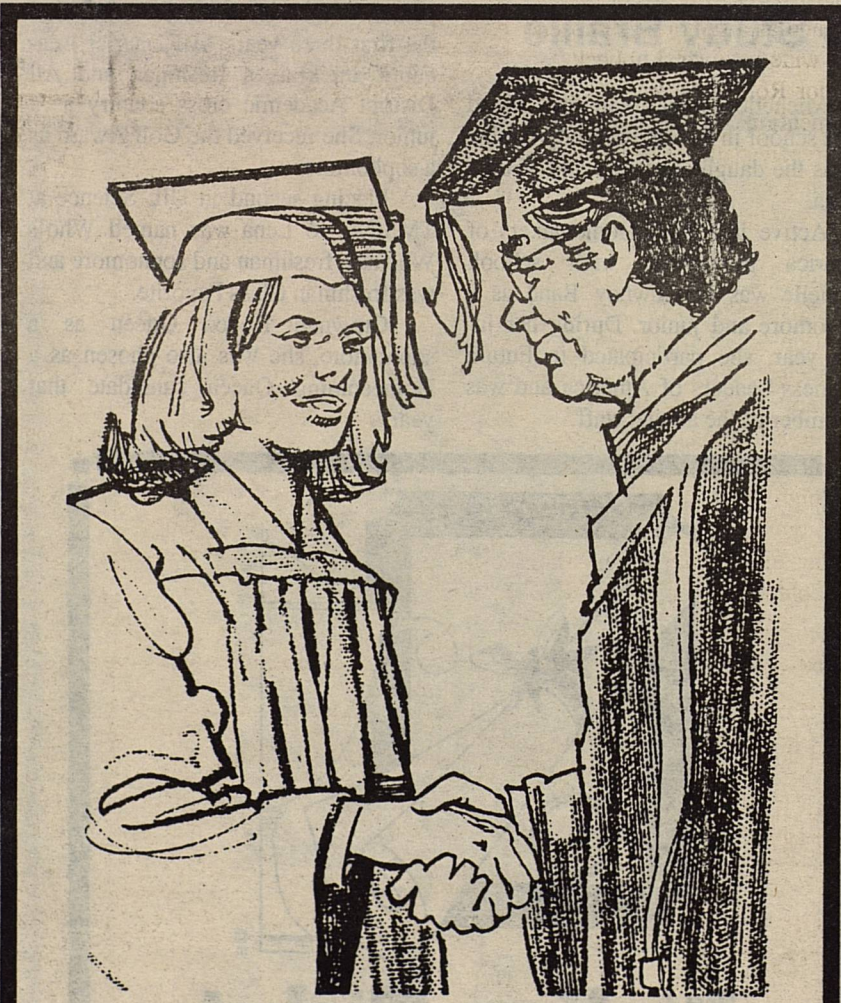

What is Chapter 1?

Chapter 1 is funded by the Federal Government. Money is given to school districts to help children who are behind in school. The amount of funds given to each community depends on the number of low-income families it has. The idea behind Chapter 1 is to make sure all children understand, remember, and use what they are taught in each school grade.

Chapter 1 programs are designed to help the children who need it most - those who are furthest behind in school. Each school community decides how it will spend its Chapter 1 money and decides which students are most in need of services.

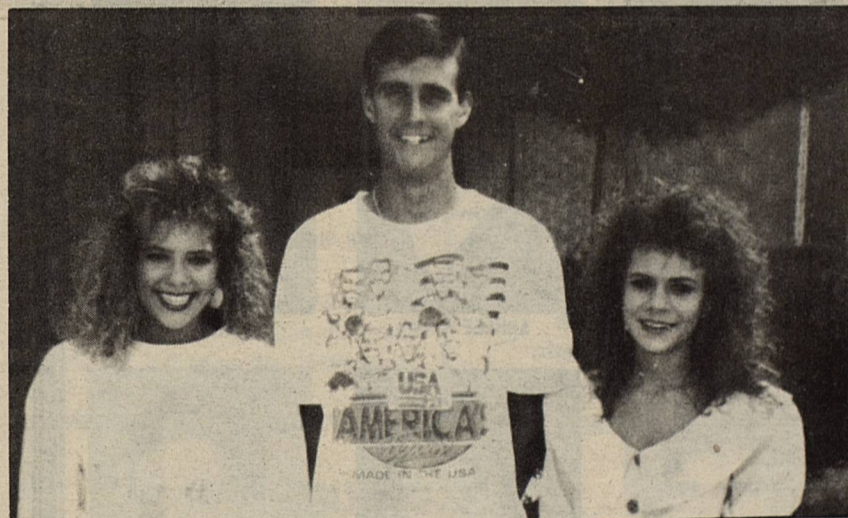
Students usually receive Chapter 1 instruction in reading, language arts, or math. Sometimes they are taught in more than one of those subjects. Each school community - administrators, teachers, and parents - decides how the federal money should be spent. Usually the funds are used to hire special teachers, aides, and tutors. The money can also be used to train and support parents and staff, buy equipment and books, do a study to discover which children need Chapter 1 services the most, and support parent involvement.

Chapter 1 money must be used to expand the education children already get in the regular classroom.

Chapter 1 programs are required to review whether their instruction is effective. They need to show that students overall are doing better than they were before. They also need to show that each child in the program is improving because of Chapter 1 services.

Parents can help their children be more successful by teaching their children in ways that add to what the teacher is doing, by learning more about their school, by supporting their children and the school, and by making decisions about their children's education.

We at Plains I.S.D. endeavor to do the best we can for our Chapter 1 students.
